D. Illinois Department of Transportation Resolution for Maintenance under the Illinois Highway Code in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$469,907.55 (Assign Reso. 2022-01-062)

Summary: The Village of Lake Zurich contracts maintenance services and material purchases using the Motor Fuel Tax allocation from the State of Illinois. The proposed Resolution appropriates the funds needed in 2022 for items such as traffic signal maintenance, road signage, right-of-way landscaping, and pavement marking. The requested dollar amount includes \$447,531 in operations costs and a 5% contingency amount of \$22,376.55.

E. Three-Year Agreement with J & M Displays for Independence Day Fireworks for 2022, 2023, and 2024 in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$33,000 Per Year

Summary: The Village of Lake Zurich's previous contract with J & M Displays expired in 2021. Staff conducted a request for proposals in November 2021 and only one proposal was received, again from J & M Displays. Many vendors are not equipped to launch fireworks from a barge in the lake. The local Hotel Tax fully supports the fireworks expenses in the amount for \$33,000 each year.

F. Agreement to Purchase Bulk Water Conditioning Salt from Midwest Salt in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$106,000

Summary: The Village of Lake Zurich's contract with Compass Minerals for bulk water conditioning salt expires December 31, 2021. Bids were solicited from suppliers in the area with the lowest responsible bidder being Midwest Salt at \$116.75 per ton. The 2022 budget include \$106,000 in the Water and Sewer Fund for this commodity purchase.

A. Ordinance Amending Title 3 of Chapter 3 of the Village of Lake Zurich Municipal Code to reflect changes in the Illinois Liquor Delivery Laws and adding two new License Classes (Assign Ord. #2022-01-451) (Trustee Gannon)

Summary: The State of Illinois Liquor Control Act was recently amended to permit the delivery of alcohol for businesses holding the state-issued retail license. The proposed ordinance incorporates the changes into the Village Liquor Code. Two new license classifications are being proposed to keep pace with evolving business models. The Class-I license is for indoor sports/interactive gaming establishments for the on-premises consumption of alcohol. The Class-S license is for limited on-premises consumption of beer, wine and sparkling beverages for a State registered health and beauty spa business.

B. Ordinance Amending Title 3 of Chapter 3 of the Village of Lake Zurich Municipal Code to Increase Authorized Class-I Indoor Interactive Sports/Entertainment Facilities Liquor Licenses for B&B Associates, LLC doing business as MVP Field House at 143 East Main Street and decrease Class A1 Liquor and Class V Video Gaming for Fritz's Country Inn (Assign Ord. #2022-01-452) (Trustee Gannon)

Summary: B&B Associates, LLC dba/MVP Field House located at 143 E Main Street has completed the requisite documentation and passed the background check for issuance of a Class-I Liquor License for on-premises sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages. Such sale is ancillary and incidental to the operations of an indoor interactive sports/entertainment business. A decrease of Class A1 Liquor and Class V Video Gaming licenses corresponds with the closure of Fritzl's Country Inn formerly located at 377 North Rand Road.

Recommended Action: Consideration and motion to approve Ordinance #2022-01-452 issuing a Class I Liquor and revoking a Class A1 Liquor and a Class V Video Gaming License.

5. **PUBLIC HEARING ON CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSED VILLAGE OF LAKE ZURICH ANNUAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022**

Summary: As noticed in the Daily Herald on November 24, 2021 and on the Village website and in *Benchmarks*, this is a public hearing for the proposed annual budget for the Village of Lake Zurich's 2022 fiscal year, which will run January 1 through December 31, 2022. The proposed budget totals \$59.9 million to fund a full-service municipality with 157 full-time employees at Police and Fire, Public Works, Community Development, Parks and Recreation, Finance, and Administration.

The Village enjoys a stable financial position and as such, this budget is presented as a balanced operational plan for the next year with a projected operating surplus of \$11,000 for the General Fund. Due to inflationary market costs for commodities and services, personnel adjustments, and funding for capital projects that were delayed throughout 2021 due to the pandemic, planned expenditures for 2022 are increasing 16.7% compared to 2021.

The 2022 budget includes \$2.3 million in funding for road and related infrastructure improvements, along with another \$2.59 million in land and building capital improvements and \$5.45 million in water and sewer improvements. The Vehicle Replacement Program is updated annually and provides an overview of the age and condition of municipal equipment, with a recommended annual funding level of approximately \$850,000. The 2022 budget includes approximately \$1 million in

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vehicle and major equipment purchases, including two police vehicles, an ambulance, and a dump truck.

Total revenues for next year are expected to be \$56.6 million, an increase of 13.8% over 2021. No new revenue sources have been included in the 2022 budget.

A copy of the proposed budget has been available for public review at Village Hall, Ela Area Public Library, and on the Village website since November 10, 2021. All interested persons are invited to attend this public hearing and provide feedback to the Village Board on the proposed budget.

Recommended Action #1: A motion was made by Trustee Sprawka, seconded by Trustee Weider, to open the Public Hearing on the Fiscal Year 2022 Village Budget and accept public comments into the record.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Eric Dubiel, 25 N. Pleasant Road, addressed the hearing on his opposition to the increase in property tax, hiring of six employees, sale of Block A, leases of Village owned property, parking by Breezewald Park, use of Covid-19 funds, reiterated his statement re: the conflict-of-interest accusation with Trustee Euker and the budget. (The 5 minute time expired)

Sam Semrow's letter, 1074 Holly Circle, read by the Village Clerk, expressed his support for the increase in the EAB tree replacement.

Atty. Scott Uhler addressed the accusation by Eric Dubiel and stated that the comment was intentionally misleading and a deceptive statement. Mr. Dubiel is aware that it has been thoroughly investigated by Lake County, and the Village, and there is no basis for conflict.

Recommended Action #2: A motion was made by Trustee Sprawka, seconded by Trustee Weider, to close the Public Hearing on the Fiscal Year 2022 Village Budget.

Summary: The FY22 Village budget includes \$75,000 in the Equipment Replacement Fund towards the purchase of a replacement Bobcat loader. The proposed new unit total cost is \$71,776, with the remaining funds used for warning lights, communications, and safety equipment. The current state of the heavy equipment / vehicle industry has created extremely long lead times

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to deliver equipment with anticipated deliver times expected in eight to twelve months. Staff requests Board approval on this replacement using 2022 budget funds, pending final budget approval by the Board.

D. *Agreement to Purchase One 2022 Ford Police Interceptor from Currie Motors via the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative Contract in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$44,000 from the Tentative Fiscal Year 2022 Budget*

Summary: The FY22 Village budget includes \$44,000 in the Equipment Replacement Fund towards the purchase of a replacement police patrol vehicle. The proposed new unit total cost is \$34,499 with the remaining funds used for outfitting the vehicle with specific gear and safety features intended for emergency response vehicles. The current state of the heavy equipment / vehicle industry has created extremely long lead times to deliver equipment with anticipated deliver times expected in eight to twelve months. Staff requests Board approval on this replacement using 2022 budget funds, pending final budget approval by the Board.

E. *Agreement to Purchase One 2022 Ford F-150 Police Responder Truck from Sutton Ford via the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative Contract in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$56,000 from the Tentative Fiscal Year 2022 Budget*

Summary: The FY22 Village budget includes \$56,000 in the Equipment Replacement Fund towards the purchase of a replacement police vehicle. Based on last year's Suburban Purchasing Contract, the proposed new unit is estimated to cost approximately \$40,000 plus funds used for outfitting the vehicle with specific gear and safety features intended for emergency response vehicles. However, the 2022 Suburban Purchasing Contract with Sutton Ford is not finalized at this time. Anticipated deliver times expected for this vehicle is eight to twelve months. Staff requests Board approval on this replacement using 2022 budget funds, pending final budget approval by the Board.

F. **Ordinance Amending Title 3 of Chapter 3 of the Village of Lake Zurich Municipal Code to Increase Authorized Class-H Liquor Licenses for C & S Bridal, LLC doing business as Volle's Bridal & Boutique at 53 South Rand Road. ORD #2021-12-447*

Summary: Volle's Bridal has requested Class-H liquor licenses for the complimentary dispensing of beer, wine, and sparkling alcoholic beverages that are ancillary to the operations of the business. The business has completed the requisite documentation and successfully passed the background check for issuance of a Class-H liquor license.

G. *Ordinance Amending Chapter 8 Entitled "Parking" of Title 6 Entitled "Traffic Code" of the Lake Zurich Municipal Code Regarding Snow Removal During Snowstorms and Natural Disasters ORD. #2021-12-448*

Summary: The Village's new police towing agreement with Alpine Automotive, approved by the Village Board on September 20, 2021 results in a minor change in the Municipal Code language regarding vehicle relocation procedures following snow events. The existing language in the Code that says the Village shall pay the towing service fee up-front and then seek reimbursement from the vehicle owner should be removed.

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H. Ordinance Amending Chapter 1 Entitled “Streets, Sidewalks, and Public Ways” of Title 7 Entitled “Public Ways and Property” of the Lake Zurich Municipal Code Regarding Deposits on Public Ways ORD. #2021-12-449

Summary: Village Staff has identified an ongoing annual problem with some residents shoveling or blowing snow in the street after the snow plows have already cleared the roadway. The snow gets driven over and the resulting packed snow and ice creates unsafe driving conditions.

The proposed Ordinance will update the Municipal Code to make it a violation to place any snow or ice into the street or in a way that covers fire hydrants. Staff also recommends including leaves and landscape debris into the violation language. Future violators would be issued local ordinance violation tickets in the amount of \$25 which double to \$50 if not paid within a timely manner.

7. NEW BUSINESS

Ordinance Adopting the Annual Budget of the Village of Lake Zurich for All Corporate Purposes for the Fiscal Year Commencing January 1, 2022 and Ending December 31, 2022 ORD. #2021-12-450

Summary: At the November 13, 2021 Committee of the Whole budget workshop meeting, Mayor Poynton and Trustees reviewed with Village Staff the proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2022, which begins on January 1.

The proposed budget for next year is presented as a balanced operational plan that advances several local infrastructure projects. The FY22 budget shows a small operating surplus for the General Fund.

The financial impact of the COVID-19 pandemic had many ramifications for Village finances since Quarter 1 of 2020, which led to the Village deferring infrastructure projects, capital purchases, and leaving some authorized positions unfilled for parts of 2021. Local revenues bounced back significantly in 2021 as the pandemic economy recovered, allowing the Village to increase funding for the current state of operations while also planning to invest significantly in local infrastructure in 2022.

With an eye on sustaining progress towards strategic goals and objectives, nearly \$11 million in Village infrastructure, municipal buildings, land improvements, and capital equipment is budgeted for 2022. The proposed budget plans on advancing several large capital projects identified in the Community Investment Plan. Some highlights in the FY 2022 budget include:

- \$2.2 million in road resurfacing and sidewalk improvements for the Braemar neighborhood and Concord Village.
- \$100,000 to accelerate the parkway tree replacement program to over 400 trees a year.
- \$756,000 for amenity and open space improvements at Paulus, Staples, and Sonoma parks.

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\$600,000 for parking lot and walking path resurfacing at Village Hall, Buffalo Creek, and Breezewald Park.

\$1.69 million for infrastructure improvements along South Old Rand Road, including water and sewer mains, road resurfacing, and streetscaping. An additional \$150,000 for parking improvements on North Old Rand Road is also budgeted.

\$35,000 for Buffalo Creek streambank stabilization.

\$1.25 million in water main replacements along Route 12 and in Flint Creek Estates.

\$2.5 million for a Buffalo Creek sewer lining project.

\$136,000 for the replacement of two lift station pumps.

Revenues are forecast to remain fairly conservative in 2022, with modest increases for Utility Tax and more significant increases for Income Tax, Sales Tax, and Personal Property Tax as the post-COVID economy finds a new equilibrium. The projected budget is representative of careful consideration of the current economic environment, requests, balancing of department needs, limited resources, and a commitment for quality services.

Finance Dir. Sparkowski thanked all the staff involved in the process and she presented the proposed 2022 budget.

The Board then commented on the proposed Budget and their comments included a Trustee stating it was an irresponsible budget with a increase in taxes; other Trustees thanked the Finance Director and staff for the Budget which included a number of critical projects which had been deferred in previous years. Trustee Sprawka clarified the misinformation that the Village has a large debt due to TIF districts. Mr. Sprawka stated that the TIF#1 debt is being covered by the revenue income.

Recommended Action: A motion was made by Trustee Weider, seconded by Trustee Sprawka, to approve Ordinance #2021-12-450 Adopting the Annual Budget of the Village of Lake Zurich for All Corporate Purposes for the Fiscal Year Commencing January 1, 2022 and Ending December 31, 2022.

Subject: 2022, 2023 and 2024 Fireworks - 4th of July Celebration

Issue: The Village of Lake Zurich's three-year firework contract expired in 2021. The fireworks show has been launched from the lake since 2013. There are additional expenses and equipment associated with a firework show launched from open water as well as limited vendors open to doing so. Staff has evaluated our fireworks display and recommends continuing with the show to be launched from the lake in following years.

The decision to launch from a barge is two-fold:

- State Fire Marshall proposing to increase the safety zone required for larger sized shells. This enables the Village to permit larger, more spectacular five-inch (5") and six-inch (6") shells. Previous year launchings from land allowed four inch (4") maximum sized shells which did not fully provide vision of the show over the mature Oak trees around the lake.
- Shooting fireworks from the barge increases viewing space for the public at Paulus Park, Breezewald Park, the Promenade, private properties around the lake, and boaters on the lake.

Analysis: Vendors were sent the Request for Proposal on November 1, 2021 (closing for submissions on December 1, 2021). Only one proposal was received by the Village with many vendors not interested or equipped with displaying fireworks from the lake. Additionally, the pyrotechnical field is currently experiencing a 25-30% increase in shipping costs causing limited access to product. The RFP requested a three-year agreement for the fireworks display on July 4th in 2022, 2023 and 2024.

The decision to continue with a multiple year contract was to save on administrative time and to provide both the community and staff with the consistency on expectations of the company and display. An additional benefit with the multiyear contract would be possible cost savings due to the commitment and early pay with vendors.

The RFP and proposal results are attached for your review. The RFP includes the company to be responsible for all costs associated with shooting the display from the lake. Per the proposals, the cost will not exceed \$33,000 and all values will remain firm for 2022-2024. As a reminder, the Hotel Motel Tax Fund fully supports the July 4th event expenses.

Per the RFP, the 2022, 2023 and 2024 Independence Day Celebration displays are to be delivered on July 4 with Friday, July 8, 2022, Friday, July 7, 2023 and Friday, July 5, 2024 as the "rain-dates", and Saturday, July 16, 2022, Saturday, July 15, 2023 and Saturday, July 13, 2024, as the secondary "rain-date." Per the proposal, there would be no additional fee associated with the rain-dates if set up has not occurred.

Recommendation: The Park and Recreation Advisory Board recommends awarding a contract to J & M Displays for the fireworks display from the lake to be held on July 4th in 2022, 2023 and 2024 for \$33,000 per year.

The Village of Lake Zurich is soliciting Requests for Proposal from vendors interested in providing the fireworks display for the Village's annual Independence Day Celebration in order to award a three (3) year contract for its annual fireworks show on July 4, 2022, July 4, 2023 and July 4, 2024. At this time, the Village is seeking one (1) proposal for:

- 1.) A three-year contract for fireworks displays, aerial show on the lake, for the years 2022, 2023 and 2024

Proposal shall include a maximum total cost per fireworks display of Thirty-Three Thousand Dollars (\$33,000).

Proposal must include statements of agreement on the following:

1. **Insurance:** All Prospective Contractor/Providers shall carry, during the life of the contract, the following insurance and shall provide to the Village of Lake Zurich evidence of such insurance at least 45 days prior to the scheduled event.
 - a. **Comprehensive General Liability Insurance Providing Bodily Injury and Property Damage Coverage:** Minimum of \$5,000,000.00 each occurrence, \$5,000,000.00 aggregate or the maximum allowable by insurance industry capacity, naming the Village of Lake Zurich as Additional Insured. Thirty-day written notice of cancellation is required and sent to the Village Clerk of Lake Zurich.
 - b. **Worker's Compensation and Occupation Disease** with limits as provided by the State of Illinois, and Employer's Liability Insurance within limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per accident, naming the Village of Lake Zurich as an Additional Insured.
 - c. **Written Confirmation that liability arising out of injuries to the Contractor/Provider's employees, agents, independent contractors or representatives** is covered under the general liability policy of the Contractor/Provider.
2. **Indemnity:** The Bidder hereby agrees to protect, defend, indemnify, and save harmless the Village or any of its past, present or future Officers, agents, volunteers, employees or assigns against loss, damage, or expense from any suit, claim, demand, judgment, cause of action, or shortage initiated by any person whatsoever, arising or alleged to have arisen out of work described herein, except that in no instance shall the Contractor/Provider be held responsible for any liability, claim, demand, or cause of action attributable solely to the negligence of the Village.

3. The **Contractor/Provider** shall provide all certificates for the **Independence Day Celebration** display. Certificates and all evidence of insurance shall be valid.
4. **Dates of Displays:** The 2022, 2023 and 2024 **Independence Day Celebration** displays are to be delivered on July 4 with Friday, July 8, 2022, Friday, July 7, 2023 and Friday, July 5, 2024 as the "rain-dates", and Saturday, July 16, 2022, Saturday, July 15, 2023 and Saturday, July 13, 2024, as the secondary "rain-date." The **Contractor/Provider** shall be responsible for providing, delivering, set-up and removal of the barge(s) and providing, delivering, set-up, firing and removal of the fireworks. The Contractor/Provider shall also be responsible for the cost associated with placing the barge(s) into, and removal of barge(s) from the lake, delivering the barge(s) to the mutually agreed upon location in the lake on the July 4th dates prior to the display and retrieving the barge(s) to be cleaned and removed from the lake at the end of the display. Contractor/Provider's representatives must arrive at the designated location to meet Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) personnel to store/launch the barge(s), no later than 10:00 a.m. on the date of display for set-up or such time as needed to properly prepare for the evening display to commence at darkness (generally about 9:15 pm). **Fee, if any, for the rain date must be included in the price.**
5. The **Contractor/Provider** shall provide test shells to be fired during the day of the event.
6. The **Contractor/Provider** shall provide, with the proposal, a minimum of three (3) written references, with telephone numbers and contact names. The references must be from the Chicagoland area (preferably surrounding communities near Lake Zurich). **References from barge-launched shows should be included.**
7. The **Contractor/Provider** shall be responsible for clean up of the firing area immediately following the completion of the fireworks display. Failure to do so shall cause the Village of Lake Zurich to clean up the site and to deduct a reasonable sum from the fee for the interruption of Village service and all other costs resulting from the clean-up effort.
8. The **Contractor/Provider** must provide the Village of Lake Zurich with emergency contacts at least two weeks prior to July 4 dates listed.
9. Representative of the **Contractor/Provider** shall meet with representatives of the Village of Lake Zurich's Fire Department and Park & Recreation Department before June 1 annually to review the firing site and to be apprised of any special regulation(s) imposed by the Village or the Fire Department.
10. **Planning Note for Display:**
 - a. The "firing site" shall be off **Contractor/Provider** provided barge(s) in a mutually agreed upon location on the lake. Loading and set up will be from a mutually agreed upon site. This will be determined at a future meeting.
 - b. All fireworks must be suitable for shooting into a lake, meeting Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) regulations, and be biodegradable. Proof of compliance will be required.
 - c. All fireworks and procedures must comply with all federal, state and local regulations.
 - d. The maximum shell size to be used is six-inches (6"). No more than 3,500 "multi-shell barrages" under 2" are permitted shall be permitted. The Village prefers to have a greater number of 4", 5" and 6" shells during the Main Show and Grand Finale
 - e. The show must be a minimum of thirty (30) minutes in length.

11. The **Village of Lake Zurich Fire Department** has the authority and responsibility to insure the safe conduct of this event. In decisions of safe conduct, their decision is final.
12. **Only certified pyrotechnicians shall be authorized to fire shells. Written documentation of the credentials of all pyro technicians must be provided to the Village 45 days prior to the display. All pyro technicians and assistants must be registered with the Illinois Office of the State Fire Marshall (OSFM), and present on the OSFM website a minimum of two (2) weeks before the scheduled shoot. If these individuals' names are not on the list, they will not be allowed on the site. Proof of all pyro technicians and assistants' registration with the American Pyrotechnics Association (APA) must be on file with the Village of Lake Zurich prior to the display.**
13. **ALL pyrotechnics shall be electronically activated.**
14. The Contractor/Provider must abide by the following rules/regulations/codes: International Fire Prevention Code 2006, Chapter 33; National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1123 (2014 edition)-Code or Fireworks Display; NFPA 1126 2011 edition); Standards for the Use of Pyrotechnics Before a Proximate Audience; Fireworks Use Act (425 ILCS 35); Pyrotechnic Distributor and Operator Licensing Act (225 ILCS 227) as well as all applicable local code amendments.
15. In addition to addressing the above issues, the **PROPOSAL** should include but not be limited to: references to length of show, size, quantity and quality of shells to be fired for the opening, main body and finale *provided from one distribution source*. The Village will also consider descriptions of experience and certifications of all pyro technicians and assistants, and any "satisfaction guarantees" that Contractor/Provider provide in written format, to accompany the proposal.
16. Finally, the Village of Lake Zurich is seeking a fireworks display of the finest quality.
Service and presentation of the show will be a major factor in the selection process.

All Proposals must be submitted in duplicate and sealed in one envelope. The envelope shall be clearly marked with the **Prospective Contractor/Provider's name and the words "Proposal: 2022, 2023 and 2024 Fireworks Display**. Proposals must be delivered to the Village of Lake Zurich – Village Clerk, 70 East Main Street, Lake Zurich, Illinois 60047, no later than 10:30 a.m., on Wednesday, December 1, 2021. Shortly after review of the proposals, a vendor will be chosen and contacted for the 2022, 2023 and 2024 contract.

The Board of Trustees may accept the proposal it deems most favorable to the interests of the Village of Lake Zurich. The acceptance of such proposal is not intended as a contract, express or implied, between the Contractor/Provider and the Village of Lake Zurich. Upon selection of a Contractor/Provider for any of the services described in this proposal, or any further services, the Village will require the formal confirmation of Contractor/Provider's services to the Village in a written contract, to be negotiated between the Contractor/Provider and the authorized Village of Lake Zurich representative. The Board of Trustees and the Village of Lake Zurich reserve the right to reject any or all proposals and may waive any informality during the proposal and selection process.

J & M Displays adheres to NFPA 1123 Code for Fireworks Displays. NFPA approved fire extinguishers are standard equipment at all displays.

During the show, crewmembers will assist in guarding the perimeter to make sure that no one is allowed in the fallout zone during the display. Security is maintained around the perimeter until it is determined safe.

One crewmember will be designated as the "spotter". The spotter observes the fireworks display as it is launched watching for any shells that may come back to the ground unexploded, possible ground fires, etc.

Following the display, the fallout zone is thoroughly checked for the possibility of any live fireworks and/or hot debris.

The Village of Lake Zurich is soliciting Requests for Proposal from vendors interested in providing the fireworks display for the Village's annual Independence Day Celebration in order to award a three (3) year contract for its annual fireworks show on July 4, 2022, July 4, 2023 and July 4, 2024. At this time, the Village is seeking one (1) proposal for:

- 1.) A three-year contract for fireworks displays, aerial show on the lake, for the years 2022, 2023 and 2024

Proposal shall include a maximum total cost per fireworks display of Thirty-Three Thousand Dollars (\$33,000).

Proposal must include statements of agreement on the following:

1. **Insurance:** All Prospective Contractor/Providers shall carry, during the life of the contract, the following insurance and shall provide to the Village of Lake Zurich evidence of such insurance at least 45 days prior to the scheduled event.
 - a. **Comprehensive General Liability Insurance Providing Bodily Injury and Property Damage Coverage:** Minimum of \$5,000,000.00 each occurrence, \$5,000,000.00 aggregate or the maximum allowable by insurance industry capacity, naming the Village of Lake Zurich as Additional Insured. Thirty-day written notice of cancellation is required and sent to the Village Clerk of Lake Zurich.
 - b. **Worker's Compensation and Occupation Disease** with limits as provided by the State of Illinois, and Employer's Liability Insurance within limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per accident, naming the Village of Lake Zurich as an Additional Insured.
 - c. **Written Confirmation that liability arising out of injuries to the Contractor/Provider's employees, agents, independent contractors or representatives** is covered under the general liability policy of the Contractor/Provider.
2. **Indemnity:** The Bidder hereby agrees to protect, defend, indemnify, and save harmless the Village or any of its past, present or future Officers, agents, volunteers, employees or assigns against loss, damage, or expense from any suit, claim, demand, judgment, cause of action, or shortage initiated by any person whatsoever, arising or alleged to have arisen out of work described herein, except that in no instance shall the Contractor/Provider be held responsible for any liability, claim, demand, or cause of action attributable solely to the negligence of the Village.

3. The **Contractor/Provider** shall provide all certificates for the **Independence Day Celebration** display. Certificates and all evidence of insurance shall be valid.
4. **Dates of Displays:** The 2022, 2023 and 2024 **Independence Day Celebration** displays are to be delivered on July 4 with Friday, July 8, 2022, Friday, July 7, 2023 and Friday, July 5, 2024 as the "rain-dates", and Saturday, July 16, 2022, Saturday, July 15, 2023 and Saturday, July 13, 2024, as the secondary "rain-date." The **Contractor/Provider shall be responsible for providing, delivering, set-up and removal of the barge(s)** and providing, delivering, set-up, firing and removal of the fireworks. The Contractor/Provider shall also be responsible for the cost associated with placing the barge(s) into, and removal of barge(s) from the lake, delivering the barge(s) to the mutually agreed upon location in the lake on the July 4th dates prior to the display and retrieving the barge(s) to be cleaned and removed from the lake at the end of the display. Contractor/Provider's representatives must arrive at the designated location to meet Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) personnel to store/launch the barge(s), no later than 10:00 a.m. on the date of display for set-up or such time as needed to properly prepare for the evening display to commence at darkness (generally about 9:15 pm). **Fee, if any, for the rain date must be included in the price.**
5. The **Contractor/Provider** shall provide test shells to be fired during the day of the event.
6. The **Contractor/Provider** shall provide, with the proposal, a minimum of three (3) written references, with telephone numbers and contact names. The references must be from the Chicagoland area (preferably surrounding communities near Lake Zurich). **References from barge-launched shows should be included.**
7. The **Contractor/Provider** shall be responsible for clean up of the firing area immediately following the completion of the fireworks display. Failure to do so shall cause the Village of Lake Zurich to clean up the site and to deduct a reasonable sum from the fee for the interruption of Village service and all other costs resulting from the clean-up effort.
8. The **Contractor/Provider** must provide the Village of Lake Zurich with emergency contacts at least two weeks prior to July 4 dates listed.
9. Representative of the **Contractor/Provider** shall meet with representatives of the Village of Lake Zurich's Fire Department and Park & Recreation Department before June 1 annually to review the firing site and to be apprised of any special regulation(s) imposed by the Village or the Fire Department.
10. **Planning Note for Display:**
 - a. The "firing site" shall be off **Contractor/Provider** provided barge(s) in a mutually agreed upon location on the lake. Loading and set up will be from a mutually agreed upon site. This will be determined at a future meeting.
 - b. All fireworks must be suitable for shooting into a lake, meeting Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) regulations, and be biodegradable. Proof of compliance will be required.
 - c. All fireworks and procedures must comply with all federal, state and local regulations.
 - d. The maximum shell size to be used is six-inches (6"). No more than 3,500 "multi-shell barrages" under 2" are permitted shall be permitted. The Village prefers to have a greater number of 4", 5" and 6" shells during the Main Show and Grand Finale
 - e. The show must be a minimum of thirty (30) minutes in length.

11. The **Village of Lake Zurich Fire Department** has the authority and responsibility to insure the safe conduct of this event. In decisions of safe conduct, their decision is final.
12. **Only certified pyrotechnicians shall be authorized to fire shells. Written documentation of the credentials of all pyro technicians must be provided to the Village 45 days prior to the display. All pyro technicians and assistants must be registered with the Illinois Office of the State Fire Marshall (OSFM), and present on the OSFM website a minimum of two (2) weeks before the scheduled shoot. If these individuals' names are not on the list, they will not be allowed on the site. Proof of all pyro technicians and assistants' registration with the American Pyrotechnics Association (APA) must be on file with the Village of Lake Zurich prior to the display.**
13. **ALL pyrotechnics shall be electronically activated.**
14. The Contractor/Provider must abide by the following rules/regulations/codes: International Fire Prevention Code 2006, Chapter 33; National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1123 (2014 edition)-Code or Fireworks Display; NFPA 1126 2011 edition); Standards for the Use of Pyrotechnics Before a Proximate Audience; Fireworks Use Act (425 ILCS 35); Pyrotechnic Distributor and Operator Licensing Act (225 ILCS 227) as well as all applicable local code amendments.
15. In addition to addressing the above issues, the **PROPOSAL** should include but not be limited to: references to length of show, size, quantity and quality of shells to be fired for the opening, main body and finale *provided from one distribution source*. The Village will also consider descriptions of experience and certifications of all pyro technicians and assistants, and any "satisfaction guarantees" that Contractor/Provider provide in written format, to accompany the proposal.
16. Finally, the Village of Lake Zurich is seeking a fireworks display of the finest quality.
Service and presentation of the show will be a major factor in the selection process.

All Proposals must be submitted in duplicate and sealed in one envelope. The envelope shall be clearly marked with the **Prospective Contractor/Provider's name and the words "Proposal: 2022, 2023 and 2024 Fireworks Display.** Proposals must be delivered to the Village of Lake Zurich – Village Clerk, 70 East Main Street, Lake Zurich, Illinois 60047, no later than 10:30 a.m., on Wednesday, December 1, 2021. Shortly after review of the proposals, a vendor will be chosen and contacted for the 2022, 2023 and 2024 contract.

The Board of Trustees may accept the proposal it deems most favorable to the interests of the Village of Lake Zurich. The acceptance of such proposal is not intended as a contract, express or implied, between the Contractor/Provider and the Village of Lake Zurich. Subject: Purchase of Bulk Water Conditioning Salt

Issue: The Village's contract with Compass Minerals for bulk water conditioning salt expires on December 31, 2021. The 2021 contract price is \$96.00 per ton, for controlled dump or pneumatic delivered. Water conditioning salt, purchased in bulk, is used during the regeneration process of the Ion Exchange filter resin at the Village's five water treatment plants. Four of our water treatment plants require a controlled dump delivery method and one requires the pneumatic delivery method.

Strategic Plan Impacts: This policy item advances the following strategic objective.

- *Goal #3: Infrastructure Investment: Ensure a sustainable, healthy and economical water source for current and future Lake Zurich residents.*

Analysis: As in years past, staff solicited the bulk water conditioning salt suppliers in the area. Listed below are bid unit prices per ton effective January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.

1. **Midwest Salt** - \$116.75 per ton, controlled dump or pneumatic delivered.
2. **Compass Minerals** - \$124.00 per ton, controlled dump or pneumatic delivered.
3. **Cargill Salt** – Declined to bid.
4. **Morton Salt** – Declined to bid (unable to meet minimum 1500-ton purchase quantity).
5. **U.S. Salt** – Declined to bid.
6. **State of Illinois CMS** - \$126.00 per ton, controlled dump or pneumatic delivered.

Based on past water production trends, the total estimated amount of salt needed for the Village's five Ion Exchange Water Treatment Plants between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022 is 900 to 1100 tons.

The FY 2022 budget includes \$106,000 for this commodity purchase.

Recommendation: Approve the unit price quote from Midwest Salt of \$116.75 per ton, controlled dump or pneumatic delivered, for the period effective January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.



Subject: Liquor Code Amendments and New License Classes

Issue: The Village Liquor Code requires updates to stay in compliance with changes made to the State of Illinois Liquor Control Act. Additionally, new business venues are not addressed by classifications in the existing Villages Liquor Code.

Analysis: Recent legislation amended the State Liquor Control Act to expand in-state delivery of retail liquor license holders. Curbside delivery and delivery via a third party has been authorized by the State. Village Liquor Code already permits delivery for Class-B (Retail Sales) and Class-K (Gift Boutique).

Proposed amendments to the classes A, C, N, P, W and Y include the ability to offer curbside and 3rd party delivery as outlined in Exhibit B, the proposed Classification of Liquor Licenses.

Two new license classifications are detailed in Exhibit A that address:

- A. A new license classification (Class-I) addresses the need of an already established an indoor interactive sports/entertainment business. The business would offer alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption that is incidental to the primary source of income derived from business operations along with several restrictions. Video gaming is specifically excluded from interactive sports/entertainment and requires separate approval.

- B. A health and beauty spa business is presently in the buildout phase and is requesting to offer limited alcoholic beverage sale and service to patrons. A new classification (Class-S) would limit the sale and service of beer, wine and sparkling alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption subject to additional restrictions.

Exhibit A details both newly proposed classifications.

A fee adjustment for the Class R (Outdoor concession) from \$200 to \$350 provides comparability with other license classes.

Recommendation: Consideration and approval of the proposed amendments.

Exhibit A

Proposed New Liquor License Classifications

Class I: License permits the on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages for indoor interactive sports/entertainment establishments and is subject the following limitations:

Annual license fee: \$1,500

Class S: This license authorizes the on-premises sale and service of alcoholic beverages by the glass at a State of Illinois registered spa/salon or where the primary business is health and beauty personal services such as nail or hair salon subject to the following limitations:

- The sale of alcoholic beverages is limited to on-premises consumption of beer, wine and sparkling alcoholic beverages.
- The sale of alcoholic beverages is secondary and incidental and limited to two servings.
- Sampling of alcoholic beverages is not permitted.
- This license shall not be available to business where the primary source of revenue is videogaming.
- Food must be served in a manner that complies with applicable Village Code and regulations.

Annual license fee: \$950

Exhibit B

Classification of Liquor Licenses

General Provisions

1. The classes of liquor licenses in the village are those classes set forth in this section. There are no other classes of liquor licenses in the village.
2. No liquor license of any class may be issued by the village unless a license is authorized by section 3-3B-10 of the Village Code and has not already been issued.
3. No liquor license may be issued by the village until after the applicable fee for the license has been paid in full.
4. Licensed locations that serve alcoholic beverages for on premises consumption, other than event licensees, shall provide service with employees no less than 21 years of age that have completed the beverage alcohol sellers and servers' education and training (BASSET) program or training for intervention for procedures (TIPS) program or their recognized equivalent. That training must take place before the person engages in the activity for which training is required. In addition to every other penalty provided by this code, any failure to comply with this subsection will be cause for the denial, suspension, or revocation of a liquor license.
5. Alcoholic beverages shall only be sold by individuals no less than 21 years of age. The serving and curbside delivery of alcoholic beverages of establishment employees at least 18 years of age is permitted.
6. The sale and service of alcoholic beverages, unless otherwise stated within a license class is limited to the hours between 6 AM and 2 AM (the following day).
7. Delivery means the movement of alcoholic beverages purchased from a licensed establishment via curbside or third-party contractor, independent contractor or agent in compliance with the Illinois Liquor Control Act.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-01-451

ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3 ENTITLED "BUSINESS LICENSING, REGULATION, TAXATION, AND FEES" OF CHAPTER 3 ENTITLED "LIQUOR CONTROL" OF THE VILLAGE OF LAKE ZURICH MUNICIPAL CODE TO REFLECT NEW STATE OF ILLINOIS LIQUOR DELIVERY LAWS AND ADDING NEW LIQUOR LICENSE CATEGORIES FOR "CLASS-I INDOOR INTERACTIVE SPORTS/ENTERTAINMENT FACILITIES" AND "CLASS-S SPA/SALONS" AND AMENDING TITLE 13 ENTITLED "COMPREHENSIVE FEE SCHEDULE"

WHEREAS, Title 3, Chapter 3, Article B of the Lake Zurich Municipal Code defines liquor licenses in the Village of Lake Zurich and the Village Board finds that the current license classifications are no longer meeting community expectations; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board finds that flexible and updated license classifications would provide for new business opportunities for existing license holders and attract new businesses to the Village; and

WHEREAS, a Comprehensive Fee Schedule was created in December 2018 via Ordinance #2018-12-279 to create a unified fee schedule to increase transparency of municipal fees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: ADOPTION AND INCORPORATION OF RECITALS. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance as the findings of the Mayor and Board of Trustees.

SECTION 2: APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS TO TITLE 3 OF THE VILLAGE MUNICIPAL CODE. The Board of Trustees, pursuant to the authority vested in it under the laws of the State of Illinois and the Lake Zurich Municipal Code, hereby approves the following amendments *to liquor license Class A, Class C, a new Class I license, Class N, Class P, a new Class S license, Class S, Class W and Class Y, as set forth in Section 3-3B-10 of Article B entitled "LIQUOR LICENSES" of Chapter 3*

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entitled "LIQUOR CONTROL" of Title 3 entitled "BUSINESS LICENSING, REGULATION, TAXATION, AND FEES" of the Lake Zurich Municipal Code, by adding those provisions shown in bold and underscored below, specifically as follows:

5. Alcoholic beverages shall only be sold by individuals no less than twenty one (21) years of age. The serving of alcoholic beverages of establishment employees at least eighteen (18) years of age is permitted.
6. The sale and service of alcoholic beverages, unless otherwise stated within a license class is limited to the hours between six o'clock (6:00) A.M. and two o'clock (2:00) A.M. (the following day).

This license authorizes the retail sale of alcoholic beverages by restaurants for on premises and off premises consumption and delivery when such sales are in original package form, or a cocktail, mixed drink, or single serving of wine, if either are incidental to and complementary to the sale and service of food. 1. The license is valid for a twenty four (24) hour period and is limited to fifteen (15) events annually.
2. For events using public land, a copy of a certificate of liquor liability insurance, naming the village as additional insured in the amount of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for the period during which liquor will be served.

Class H: License to permit complimentary dispensing of beer, wine, sparkling alcoholic beverage at a retail establishment without another liquor license, where the service is incidental and complementary to the operations of the business. This license is subject to the following limitations:

1. The dispensation of alcoholic beverages must be supervised by a full time employee of the licensee and may occur only within the licensed area.
2. No signage is allowed indicating the dispensation of alcohol is available.

Class I: License permits the on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages for indoor interactive sports/entertainment establishments and is subject the following limitations:

1. The sale of alcoholic beverages is limited to on-premises consumption.
2. Patrons are subject to an admissions fee; interactive equipment use fee and/or coaching fee is required to enter the facility.
3. Alcoholic beverage sales may not exceed 30% of overall gross sales as calculated monthly.
4. Interactive sports/entertainment equipment at the facility preclude the ability to wager money or to receive a return on investment.
5. The Class I liquor licensee at an interactive sports/entertainment facility shall provide adequate security to ensure that minors are not served or permitted to consume alcoholic beverages anywhere on the premises and that all liquor code regulations are complied with.
6. This license does not include nor authorize videogaming under the Illinois Video Gaming Act (230 ILCS 40/Art. 5). Liquor licensure related to video gaming in the Village is the subject of separate liquor licensing authority and regulation.

Class K: Gift boutiques license. This license authorizes the retail sale and delivery of alcoholic beverages as a component of a gift basket, in original package form, for consumption off the premises where sold.

Class M: BYOB - corkage license (beer and wine only). A class M liquor license shall authorize restaurants to permit consumption of beer or wine brought onto the premises of a restaurant by an adult patron for personal consumption, including consumption by their adult dining guest(s), while the patron and dining guest(s) are being served a complete meal in the restaurant, subject to all of the following conditions:

1. Consumption of beer and wine is permitted by patrons who order and are served a meal by the licensee, but is restricted to the licensed premises, and only those portions of the premises designated (i.e., if outdoor dining or banquet area(s) are not included, it cannot be used for BYOB under license). "Wine" shall mean any alcoholic beverage obtained by the fermentation of the natural contents of fruits or vegetables, containing sugar, including such beverages when fortified by the addition of alcohol or spirits, as defined in 235 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/1-3.01 and 5/1-3.02.
2. Where the licensee and/or its agents uncork, pour, place on ice or store alcoholic beverages, the licensee shall take and successfully complete a beverage alcohol sellers and servers education and training (BASSET) or training for intervention for procedures (TIPS) program or their recognized equivalent.
3. Patrons are prohibited from taking any opened alcoholic beverage outside of the premises, except for a recorked wine bottle that has been sealed in a carryout bag in accordance with state law 1.
4. Beer and wine may be consumed on the licensed premises, between six o'clock (6:00) A.M. and two o'clock (2:00) A.M. (the following day).
5. The restaurant may charge a corkage fee to the patron.

Class N: Craft distillery alcoholic liquor license. "Distiller" means a person who distills, ferments, brews, makes, mixes, concocts, processes, blends, bottles or fills an original

package with any alcoholic liquor. A class N license shall authorize the on-site production and storage of alcohol in quantities not to exceed one hundred thousand (100,000) gallons per year, the sale of such alcohol to persons of at least twenty one (21) years of age for consumption off premises, and on site sampling of such alcohol. Sales of alcohol manufactured outside the facility, other than as provided below, are prohibited. This license is subject to the following conditions:

1. Offer samples of the alcohol permitted to be produced and sold pursuant to this classification. Licensees shall not provide more than four (4) free samples, each of which shall not exceed one-fourth (0.25) fluid ounce, to any person in a day.
2. Sale of on premises produced alcohol for off premises consumption.
3. Sale of alcoholic beverages from spirits (products) manufactured on premises for consumption on premises when packaged or prepared foods are available.
4. Ancillary sale of beer and wine in conjunction with products manufactured on premises for consumption on premises when packaged or prepared foods are available.
5. Must have a valid craft distiller license from the State of Illinois.

6. May offer delivery of products manufactured on premises in original packing or sealed containers not including single servings for off-premises consumption.

Class O: Off site catering license. An "off site catering" license shall be required for any person or business who serves alcoholic beverages for consumption at an event and at a location within the Village along with a planned food service. Catered events are those serving prepared meals and alcoholic beverages at a prearranged rate or fixed price to an invitation only group of persons. Such service of alcohol can include premeal, meal and postmeal service. "Off site" catering means the preparation of food at one location for service at another. The following conditions shall apply to this license:

1. Class O licenses authorize the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises where served and approved in the license, solely to guests invited to the private, catered function.
2. Under this license, alcoholic beverages are allowed only along with a planned food service.
3. The service of alcoholic beverages shall be by employees of the licensed catering business.
4. Class O licensees shall serve alcohol only to invited guests at catered functions.

Class P: Craft brewery license. "Craft brewer" means a licensed brewer or licensed nonresident dealer who manufactures up to nine hundred thirty thousand (930,000) gallons of beer per year and who may make sales and deliveries to importing distributors and distributors and to retail licensees in accordance with the conditions set forth in paragraph (18) of subsection (a) of section 3-12 of the Illinois Liquor Control Act. A craft brewery Class P liquor license shall authorize a licensee to produce at the licensed premises and store craft beer in quantities not to exceed thirty thousand (30,000) barrels of beer annually (or 930,000 gallons), the sale of such craft beer for consumption on and off premises, on site sampling and consumption of such craft beer by persons of at least twenty one (21) years of age. Sale of craft beer manufactured outside the licensed premises is prohibited. The following conditions shall apply to this license:

1. Class P license holders may, during authorized hours of business, offer samples of the beer permitted to be produced and sold pursuant to this classification. Licensees shall not provide more than four (4) free samples, each of which shall not exceed three (3) fluid ounces, to any person in a day.
2. May offer retail sales of products manufactured on premises for consumption on premises when packaged or prepared foods are available.
3. Every Class P licensee must have a valid craft brewer's license from the State of Illinois. (Ord. 2016-12-168, 12-5-2016)
4. May offer delivery of products manufactured on premises in original packing or sealed containers not including single servings for off-premises consumption (Ord. 2022-01-451)

Class R: Establishments licensed for outdoor concession/beer garden license. Authorizes the retail sale and consumption of alcoholic beverage for on- premises consumption at an outdoor cafe under the following conditions:

1. The license holder shall make available packaged or prepared foods.
2. The license holder shall maintain hours of operation approved by the Lake Zurich Liquor Control Commissioner. (Ord. 2018-5-260, 5-21-2018)

Class S: This license authorizes the on-premises sale and service of alcoholic beverages by the glass at a State of Illinois registered spa/salon or the primary business is health and beauty personal services such as nail or hair salon subject to the following limitations:

1. The sale of alcoholic beverages is limited to on-premises consumption of beer, wine and sparkling alcoholic beverages.
2. The sale of alcoholic beverages is secondary and incidental to health and beauty personal services and limited to two servings.
3. Sampling of alcoholic beverages is not permitted.
4. This license shall not be available to a business where the primary source of revenue is videogaming.
5. Food must be served in a manner that complies with applicable Village Code and health regulations.

Class V: Establishments licensed for video gaming license. For a licensed truck stop establishment, a licensed fraternal establishment and establishments holding a current liquor license when such establishment, business or applicant also holds an active license authorizing video gaming/video gaming terminals at or within the establishment. The following conditions shall apply to this license:

1. Establishments shall be equipped with a commercial grade, multitap draft beer system for the sale of beer on tap. Existing 2016 and prior Class V license holders are exempt from this requirement.
2. This license shall be required in conjunction with and in addition to annual liquor license already required to be held by the establishment for the service, sale, production or consumption of alcohol hereunder.

Class W: Boutique restaurant wine and sparkling alcoholic beverage license. Permits the on-premises consumption and retail sale for off-premises consumption and delivery of wine and sparkling alcoholic beverage and is subject to the following limitations.

1. Non-alcoholic gross sales shall make up no less than fifty one percent (51%) of gross sales for the business.
2. Alcoholic beverages offered for sale shall be in bottles no less than 0.375 liters.
3. The sale of up to 3,000 milliliters (3 liters) of alcoholic beverages in a single transaction. Product purchased by consumers must be removed from the premises for the transaction to be considered complete. (Ord. 2020-03-363, 5-4-2020)
4. **Delivery shall be in original, packaged form, not including a single serving prepared on-premises for off-premises consumption.**

Class Y: Brewpub license. A brewpub license shall authorize the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on premises and retail sales for off premises consumption. A Class Y license shall be issued subject to the applicant's compliance with the following conditions:

1. Beer service is via a draft beer system.
2. The manufacture of no more than one hundred fifty five thousand (155,000) gallons (5,000 barrels) per year only at a designated licensed premises to make sales to distributors, and to nonlicensees for use and consumption only, who stores beer at a designated premises and who is allowed to sell at retail from the licensed premises provided that a brewpub licensee shall not sell for off premises consumption more than one hundred fifty five thousand (155,000) gallons (5,000 barrels) per year 2.
3. The retail sale of beer intended for off premises consumption shall only occur if the container is sealed for transport. Containers intended for off premises consumption shall not be opened or consumed on premises.
4. Retail sales for off premises consumption are limited to fifty five thousand (55,000) gallons per year.
5. The brewpub shall make available packaged or prepared foods.
6. Complimentary tastings shall not exceed four (4) servings of three (3) ounces each to any person in a day. (Ord. 2016-12-168, 12-5-2016)
7. May offer delivery in original packing or sealed containers not including single servings for off-premise consumption.

SECTION 3: APPROVAL OF ADDITIONS AMENDMENT TO TITLE 13 OF THE VILLAGE MUNICIPAL CODE. The Board of Trustees, pursuant to the authority vested in it under the laws of the State of Illinois and the Lake Zurich Municipal Code, hereby approve and adopt the following amendment to the Class R liquor license entitled "R - Outdoor concession/beer garden" in Code Section 3-3B-11A2 in that fee table entitled "BUSINESS REGULATIONS" of Section 13-1-1 entitled "FEES" of Chapter 1 entitled "FEE SCHEDULE" of Title 13 entitled "COMPREHENSIVE FEE SCHEDULE" of the Village of Lake Zurich Municipal Code, said amendment made by deleting the current fee of 200.00 shown as stricken through (200.00) and by adding the new fee of 350.00 shown as underscored and in bold **(350.00)**, as follows:

Issue: B&B Associates, LLC dba/MVP Field House located at 143 E Main Street has requested a Class-I Liquor License for on-premises sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages. Fritzl's Country Inn located at 377 North Rand Road has ceased operations requiring a revocation of their Class A1 Liquor and Class V Video Gaming licenses.

Analysis: B&B Associates, LLC completed the requisite documentation and successfully passed the background check for issuance of a Class-I Liquor License for on-premises sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages that is ancillary to the operations of an indoor interactive sports/entertainment business.

Patrons are subject to an admission's fee; interactive equipment use fee and/or coaching fee is required to enter the facility. This license does not include nor authorize video gaming under the Illinois Video Gaming Act.

Fritzl's Country Inn recently announced that they would be closing their restaurant after 36 years of operation. A letter posted on their website thanks the community for 36 years of continued patronage. Revoking their Class-A1 and Class-V licenses is appropriate.

Recommendation: Consideration and approval of the proposed ordinance.

ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 3 OF CHAPTER 3 OF THE VILLAGE OF LAKE ZURICH MUNICIPAL CODE TO INCREASE AUTHORIZED CLASS - I INDOOR INTERACTIVE SPORTS/ENTERTAINMENT FACILITIES LIQUOR LICENSES FOR B&B ASSOCIATES, LLC DOING BUSINESS AS MVP FIELD HOUSE AT 143 EAST MAIN STREET AND DECREASE CLASS-A1 LIQUOR AND CLASS-V VIDEO GAMING FOR FRITZL'S COUNTRY INN

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: The number of **Class I – Indoor Interactive Sports/Entertainment Facilities** liquor licenses authorized by section 3-3b-14 of Chapter 3 of Title 3 of the Village Code of the Village of Lake Zurich is hereby **increased** by one for **B & B Associates dba MVP Field House** located at **143 East Main Street** in accordance with the Village Code of the Village of Lake Zurich. Issuance of the license is subject to the approval and action of the Local Liquor Commissioner of the Village of Lake Zurich.

SECTION 2: The number of **Class A1 – Restaurant Liquor and Class V Video Gaming** licenses authorized by section 3-3b-14 of Chapter 3 of Title 3 of the Village Code of the Village of Lake Zurich is hereby **decreased** by one each for **Fritzl's Country Inn**, formerly located at **377 North Rand Road** in accordance with the Village Code of the Village of Lake Zurich. Issuance of the license is subject to the approval and action of the Local Liquor Commissioner of the Village of Lake Zurich.

SECTION 3: That Section 3-3B-14 of Chapter 3 of Title 3 of the Lake Zurich Municipal Code entitled "NUMBER OF LICENSES" be and is hereby further amended with the corresponding number of licenses in each class, shown with bold letters with underscoring below:
