2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – March 17, 2021

4. NEW BUSINESS

- **Official Oath of Laurie Stutzman**
- Laurie Stutzman signed her Official Oath to continue her term through April 30, 2025.
- **Midlothian Road Guardrail**
- Sergeant Gaffney spoke about a concern from a resident of Pearlman Drive regarding a recent vehicle crash in which a vehicle slid on an icy roadway and crashed through a fence.
- Sergeant Gaffney noted that prior to that crash, he was not aware of a similar one since 2009.
- Director Brown said that while the Village has a maintenance agreement with the State of Illinois for plowing and salting, the roadway itself and any regulations surrounding it are within IDOT's jurisdiction. As a result, the Village does not have the ability to add a guardrail or any other modifications to the roadway or right-of-way.
- Director Brown indicated there are utility and grading concerns along that stretch of Midlothian Road that would likely make a guardrail unfeasible, especially given that crash data doesn't justify it. Director Brown also noted that the guardrail would likely have to run the entire length of Midlothian Road, not just along the houses off of Pearlman.
- Sean Gallagher noted that the roadway was straight and flat at that point, and did not have any curves or unique conditions that may justify a guardrail.


MOTION to close this matter was made by Laurie Stutzman, seconded by Sean Gallagher.
