Summary: The Lake Zurich Police Department has been a member of the NIRCL for over 25 years as a way to efficiently provide forensic services to member law enforcement agencies.

E. Intergovernmental Agreements between the Village of Lake Zurich and the Village of Island Lake for Dispatch Services and Detainee Housing

Summary: Lake Zurich has provided public safety radio dispatch services to Island Lake since 2013. The current agreement expires April 30, 2024 and both parties seek to extend the agreement for two more years or until all parties agree to transition dispatch operations to a regional 911 system.

State law requires that facilities housing detainees be staffed and monitored. Since the Island Lake Police station is not staffed 24 hours a day, they are unable to house detainees when staff is not in the building. The Lake Zurich police station is currently staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and thus have developed an agreement that would enable Island Lake to house their detainees at the Lake Zurich Police Department.

G. Agreement with Pavement Systems Inc. for 2024 Seal Coating Program in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$48,784.41

Summary: The 2024 budget includes \$50,000 in the Capital Projects Fund for pavement maintenance of parking facilities and pathways. This year the Village will be investing in 21 locations around Lake Zurich. A competitive bid opening on March 14, 2024, resulted in five bids received, with the most competitive bid received from Pavement Systems of Blue Island, Illinois.

H. Agreement with Metropolitan Pump Company for Replacement Control Panel at Mionske Sanitary Sewer Lift Station in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$71,751

Summary: The 2024 budget includes \$90,000 in the Water and Sewer Fund for this planned improvement to the Mionske lift station, which was installed in 1996. Metropolitan Pump Company is the Village's designated lift station manufacturer at 13 of the 14 lift stations in Lake Zurich and also the sole source vendor for the specific controls the Village has been utilizing in recent lift station upgrades that facilitates equipment standardization.

I. Authorization to Waive the Competitive Bid Process and Approve Change Order #1 with Layne Christensen Company for Well Number 12 Repairs in the Total Amount Not-to-Exceed \$344,725

Summary: On September 6, 2022, the Village Board approved a five-year professional services agreement with Layne Christensen Company, a sole-source provider of Byron Jackson parts and service in Illinois. All five Village wells utilize Byron Jackson pumping equipment.

On December 4, 2023, the Village Board authorized \$131,481 to Layne Christensen to remove equipment from well 12 after an electrical fault left the well inoperable. Evaluation of this equipment was completed in mid-February 2024 and necessitates a change order and increased expenditure amount. The requested not-to-exceed amount includes the original 2023 authorization of \$131,481, the change order increase of \$193,244 and a \$10,000 project contingency.

7. NEW BUSINESS

This agenda item includes matters coming to the Board of Trustees for discussion and possible action.

A. Authorization to Waive the Competitive Bid Process and Proceed with Agreements with AquaPro Plumbing, Paint Platoon USA Company, and All Partitions to Complete Emergency Repairs at the Paulus Park Chalet in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$55,291 (Trustee Weider)

Summary: The Paulus Park Chalet has been closed since mid-February for program use due to extensive repairs to the sanitary service. The repair requires partial demolition and replacement of interior plumbing, flooring, walls, and the replacement of the sanitary lift station servicing the facility. The facility will continue to be unavailable until the completion of this work, creating the potential for interruption of scheduled summer programs, activities, and camp.

Proposals were solicited from vendors capable of performing the necessary repairs and replacements. On-site visits were conducted with vendors and Village Staff received proposals for both the plumbing and restoration. Due to the high use of this facility, especially heading into summer camp activities, Staff is recommending the competitive bid process be waived in an effort to expedite the repairs and return it to service as quickly as possible.

Recommended Action: A motion to approve agreements with AquaPro Plumbing, Paint Platoon USA Company, and All Partitions for emergency repairs at the Paulus Park Chalet in the amount not-to-exceed \$55,291.

B. Agreement with Vicarious Multimedia - St. Steven Public Relations for Referendum Communications in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$30,000 (Mayor Poynton)

Summary: On March 18, 2024, the Village Board approved the wording for a referendum question to appear before Lake Zurich voters on the November 2024 General Election ballot. If approved by Lake Zurich voters, this referendum would increase the local

non-home rule sales tax by 0.5%, or half-a-penny on the dollar.

This new revenue would mitigate the 5-Year water rate increases that are necessary to fund the transition to Lake Michigan water. Residents will get the choice to decide if the approximately 40% of non-residents that contribute to Lake Zurich's sales tax should assist in paying for the Lake Michigan water transition or if the cost of this should transition should be funded by increased water rates over the next five years.

After reviewing proposals for referendum educational communications, Village staff is recommending Vicarious Multimedia to enhance internal efforts in a multi-channel, multi-media public information and community engagement campaign starting on April 15 and running through November 5, 2024.

Recommended Action: A motion to an agreement with Vicarious Multimedia - St. Steven Public Relations for referendum communications in the amount not-to-exceed \$30,000.

Summary: Illinois statutes require all municipalities annually publish an updated zoning map by March 31 of each year. The 2024 zoning map has been updated to include rezoned parcels for the new School District Transition Program Center at 315 Surryse Road, a re-subdivision at 154 Oak Street to create two single-family lots, and a re-subdivision of the lot at 629 Rose Road to create two industrial lots.
 - E. Agreement with Suburban Concrete for 2024 Concrete Flatwork Program in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$175,000

Summary: The 2024 budget includes \$175,000 in the Non-Home Rule Sales Tax Fund for concrete curb and sidewalk repairs. This years' investments will focus on the Wicklow subdivision and move into the industrial park. A competitive bid opening on February 28, 2024 resulted in six bids received, with the most competitive bid received from Suburban Concrete of Mundelein.
 - F. Ratification of Change Order #1 from the WT Group to Add the Paulus Park Chalet Facility to ADA Access Audits in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$1,500

Summary: In January 2024, the Village Board approved an agreement with the WT Group to conduct access audits and an American with Disabilities Act transition plan in compliance with Title 2 of the ADA in the amount not-to-exceed \$52,042.58. A change order is requested in order to add one more public facility to the scope of work, the Paulus Park Chalet, for an additional \$1,500, bringing the total not-to-exceed amount to \$53,542.58.

G. **Resolution Requesting State Permission for Detours Related to Memorial Day Parade on May 27, 2024 (Assign Reso. #2024-03-084)**

Summary: The proposed resolution authorizes a request to the Illinois Department of Transportation to close State Route 22 to facilitate the American Legion Memorial Day parade between the hours of 9:00 am to 12:00 pm on May 27, 2024.

6. **NEW BUSINESS**

A. **Ordinance of the Village of Lake Zurich, Lake County, Illinois, Approving a Development Agreement between the Village of Lake Zurich and the Greenhill Company and Smalley Steel Ring Company (Assign Ord. #2024-03-563) (Trustee Bobrowski)**

Summary: The Greenhill Company, doing business as Smalley Steel Ring at 555 Oakwood Road, is requesting tax increment financing assistance from the Village to support a multi-phased, multi-year expansion effort that will not be complete until 2040. Smalley Steel Ring has been operating in Lake Zurich for over 20 years and is a global supplier of wave springs, retaining rings, and section rings that are used in precision manufacturing for multiple industry segments. The company currently employs about 600 full-time positions in the industrial park and plans to continue hiring 30-40 employees each year as new square footage comes online. The company intends to expand its operations in Lake Zurich with an added 200,000 square feet of new building space, including 86,000 square feet of office, 100,000 square feet of warehouse, and 13,420 square feet of manufacturing/production space. This development will cost at least \$51 million over the next ten years.

The proposed TIF redevelopment agreement is intended to help offset this significant investment in Lake Zurich with a rebate of up to \$15.3 million of TIF revenue over the next 22 years. This equates to approximately 30% of the overall costs of this massive industrial expansion. The performance-based rebates are tied to the completion of five project phases set forth in the agreement. Seventy-five percent of the TIF increment generated annually by the project will be directed toward the rebates, up to the cap limits assigned to each completed project phase.

The remaining 25% of the increment generated annually by the project, and all TIF increment after the Developer has reached the maximum reimbursement amount, will go to the fund balance for the Industrial TIF District. This balance will then be available for future funding of industrial park infrastructure, such as stormwater management, water and sanitary sewer main replacements, and road resurfacing.

Management Services Director Kordell discussed the long-range plans of Smalley Steel Ring Company and the long-term TIF package agreement between the village and the company. He explained the company is set to grow through a five-phase plan increasing the size of the facility, operations, and hiring more staff in the future while staying in Illinois.

Joe Lukas, Senior Vice President with Smalley Steep Ring, gave a presentation on Smalley's future plans, explaining its five-phase approach for expansion. Trustees and the Mayor thanked Smalley for investing in Lake Zurich and for the plans for future growth.

B. Ordinance Determining to Become a Member of the Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency, Approving the Admissions Agreement to the Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency, and Authorizing All Necessary Acts (Assign Ord. #2024-03-564) (Trustee Spacone)

Summary: The decision to transition to Lake Michigan water has been analyzed and discussed in Lake Zurich since at least 2011 when the Village was granted a conditional Lake Michigan water supply allocation from the State of Illinois. In May 2023, the Village Board adopted a resolution expressing the intent of Lake Zurich to work towards full membership into the Central Lake County Joint Action Water Agency (CLCJAWA) to bring Lake Michigan water to Lake Zurich.

The next step in the Lake Michigan water initiative is for the Village to adopt the CLCJAWA admissions agreement, which will legally bind the Village to the CLCJAWA amended agency agreement from 2013, its amended by-laws from 2020 and its water purchase and sale contract from 2013. Upon approval of the proposed Ordinance and admissions agreement, the Village becomes a full member of the CLCJAWA Board of Directors with full voting rights into future CLCJAWA decisions.

The agreement commits the Village to paying 100% of CLCJAWA's costs of extending water infrastructure to bring Lake Michigan water to Lake Zurich. The agreement also establishes the capital contribution of \$21,857,496 based

on CLCJAWA's established formula and the 7,352 housing units currently on the Village's water system. The agreement also specifies that CLCJAWA is offering the Village a thirty-year, no-interest payment plan to fulfill the capital connection obligation.

After lengthy, careful and exhaustive consideration of the long-term potable water supply options available to the Village, including the costs and complications of remaining reliant on the deep water aquifer, Staff recommend approval of this agreement committing Lake Zurich to join CLCJAWA and to take the next steps toward bringing Lake Michigan water to the community.

Public Works Director Brown discussed how the Village has researched extensively on the transition to Lake Michigan water and that multiple meetings have been presented to the public over years on the transition plan.

Trustee Riley asked for a brief summary and explanation of why the Village needs to change water sources. Director Brown explained that environmental, regulatory, and sustainability challenges are the main factors to transition to Lake Michigan water, as the main regulatory cost comes from radium removal and disposal.

Village Manager Keller discussed that regulatory compliance and cost effectiveness were studied and moving to Lake Michigan water is a more viable, sustainable long-term potable water source versus relying on deep aquifer wells. Mayor Poynton and Trustees agreed that no other viable options were available other than transitioning to Lake Michigan water. The Board and Staff discussed how other towns were waiting next in line to obtain State IDNR water allocation permits to connect to Lake Michigan water and Lake Zurich is currently in the use-it-or-lose-it phase for its State permit.

C. Agreement with CDM Smith for Lake Michigan Water Source Route Study in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$300,000 (Trustee Spacone)

Summary: As the Village continues its transition to Lake Michigan Water, a detailed route study is necessary to provide project engineering and design details. A preferred route will be identified and up to two additional corridors for inclusion as potential routes. Alternatives will be developed to address known issues, provide an initial attempt at optimizing the route, and adjust

the terminus point to Oakwood Park. The study will be funded through the Village's water and sewer enterprise fund.

Amrou Atassi, Senior VP of CDM Smith, discussed the feasibility study for routes to connect at the Vernon Hills connection point at Route 83 to bring Lake Michigan water to Lake Zurich. Trustees and CDM Smith discussed potential hurdles to the route study. CDM Smith identified routes that would be studied for the most efficient route and addressed concerns from the Trustees about obtaining permits and easements with outside stakeholders. CDM Smith discussed the study would likely take four months to complete and meetings will be scheduled with outside stakeholders immediately in order to discuss potential permits and easement allocations.

D. Resolution Providing for the Submission of the Proposition at Referendum of Whether the Village of Lake Zurich shall Increase its Current Local Sales Tax of One-Half Percent to a Rate of One-Percent (Assign Reso. #2024-03-565) (Mayor Poynton)

Summary: The proposed Resolution formalizes the exact language to appear on the November 5, 2024 General Election ballot asking Lake Zurich voters to increase the local Non-Home Rule Sales Tax from 0.5% to 1%, with the increased revenue to be used to fund the costs of transitioning to Lake Michigan as the community's potable water supply.

The Village estimates that the transition to Lake Michigan water may cost up to \$150 million, corresponding to a financing cost of approximately \$7.4 million annually over 30 years. If voters decide to approve a referendum increasing the local Non-Home Rule Sales Tax to 1%, the Village would be substantially less reliant on increasing water usage rates for Lake Zurich households, as the annual sales tax revenue generated would cover \$2.5 - \$2.7 million each year of the annual financing costs. Approximately 40% of current sales taxes are generated by nonresidents, contributing toward infrastructure investments that benefit the entire community.

As previously recommended, the increase in sales taxes would allow the Village to significantly reduce future water rates, while still having adequate resources to complete and finance the Lake Michigan water project.

Manager Keller explained how Lake Zurich's phased-in rate increase for the next five years are based on usage amounts and said that about one-third of funding cost for the Lake Michigan water project could be funded by non-

residents, as research has shown that 40% of Lake Zurich sales tax revenue is produced by non-residents. If residents were to vote yes on a referendum in November to raise the sales tax by 0.5%, this would go to fund the Lake Michigan water project. If residents voted yes to raise the sales tax amount, then the Village would prepare an amended ordinance to change the 5-year rate structure for user rates of the water-rate schedule.

Actions: A motion was made by Trustee Weider, seconded by Trustee Riley, to approve Resolution #2024-03-565 Providing for the Submission of the Proposition at Referendum of Whether the Village of Lake Zurich shall Increase its Current Local Sales Tax of One-Half Percent to a Rate of One-Percent.

Issue: The Lake Zurich Police Department has been a member of the Northeastern Illinois Regional Crime Laboratory (NIRCL) for over 25 years. NIRCL is asking all members to sign an updated intergovernmental agreement so that all of the agreements are consistent.

Analysis: Founded in 1968, the Northeastern Illinois Regional Crime Laboratory provides forensic services to member law enforcement agencies which govern and fund its operations. Located in Mundelein, Illinois NIRCL provides forensic services for suburbs and collar communities of Chicago, having an estimated population of over 1.6 million citizens.

The mission of the laboratory is to provide accurate, objective and timely forensic services. NIRCL employs more than a dozen forensic scientists to meet the mission's objectives. NIRCL is accredited in DNA, latent prints, firearms/tool marks, controlled substances and toxicology analysis. Other services provided include drug and firearm destruction, community outreach in the form of educational presentations, and training for member agency staff.

First accredited in 1997, NIRCL is now accredited to the ISO/IEC 17025:2017 international standards by the ANSI-ASQ National Accreditation Board (ANAB) for Forensic Testing. Accreditation requires the documentation and implementation of international standards regarding technical procedures, quality assurance standards and managerial operations.

The Northeastern Illinois Regional Crime Laboratory provides high quality forensic services and timely responses to major case evidence when it is needed the most. I served on the NIRCL Executive Board for many years including as Board President from 2019-2022.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT AMONG THE MEMBER
AGENCIES OF THE NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS REGIONAL CRIME
LABORATORY**

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and among the member agencies or units of local government (hereinafter called Members) of the Northeastern Illinois Regional Crime Laboratory (hereinafter called the Crime Lab):

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Members recognize that the enforcement of laws, statutes, and ordinances and the investigation of criminal and quasi-criminal activity requires the use of certain forensic services for the analysis and identification of physical evidence; and

WHEREAS, the Members desire to utilize such forensic services and resources during the enforcement of laws, statutes, and ordinances and the investigation of criminal and quasi-criminal activity; and

WHEREAS, the Members are entering into this Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement (the "Agreement") pursuant to Article VII, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.); Article 5, Sections 1-4-6 and 11-1-2.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-4-6 and 5/11-1-2.1); and other applicable authority;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Members agree as follows:

SECTION 1 – PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT ; RECITALS

This agreement is made in recognition of the fact that criminal investigations and other law enforcement efforts are greatly enhanced when agencies have access to the resources and the support of a specialized forensic organization. It is the purpose of this Agreement to provide the means whereby assistance is provided to the Member by the Crime Lab pursuant to the conditions of this agreement. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Agreement as findings of the Members and the Crime Lab.

SECTION 2 – DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this Agreement, the following terms shall be defined as set forth in this Section.

1. **Forensic Services:** Those services provided by the Crime Lab to a Member pursuant to this Agreement that pertain to the identification, and analysis of physical evidence pursuant to the investigation or prosecution of a crime.
2. **Annual Assessment:** The fee provided for by this agreement to serve as compensation to the Crime Lab to offset the cost of operation. Costs of

operation include any costs incurred by the Crime Lab in the furtherance of its operation including costs for personnel, training, facilities, fixtures, equipment, supplies, and utilities.

An annual assessment shall be levied against all Members in accordance with the duly adopted Constitution and Bylaws of the Crime Lab.

A basic requirement of continued membership under this Agreement is the timely payment of the Annual Assessment and other established fees by the Member.

SECTION 3 – TERM

The initial term of this Agreement shall be for a period commencing on the date of execution of the Agreement by the Chief Executive Officer of the Member and concluding on the Member agency's fiscal year end immediately following such date of execution.

SECTION 4 – ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATIONS

The administration and operation of the Crime Lab shall be in conformance with the precepts set forth in the Constitution and Bylaws of the Crime Lab and any Standard Operating Guidelines established under the authority of those bylaws.

SECTION 5 – SCOPE OF RESPONSE

The Crime Lab shall provide for forensic services as outlined in the current scope of accreditation for any official investigation conducted by the law enforcement department of a Member initiated within its corporate boundaries.

In addition to the Scope of Services, the Crime Lab will also aid agencies with the destruction of drugs and firearms. Such destruction will be completed with compliance the policies set by the Crime Lab.

SECTION 6 – DIRECTION OF PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT

The Crime Lab Executive Director shall be responsible for supervising and directing the actions of all Crime Lab personnel and for determining the use of all equipment and resources of the Crime Lab.

SECTION 7 – AUTHORITY OF CRIME LAB PERSONNEL

Each employee of the Crime Lab shall be fully authorized by the Member to perform their official duties pursuant to any official investigation conducted under the terms of this Agreement.

SECTION 8 – REIMBURSEMENT TO CRIME LAB

Members shall be responsible for paying such annual fees, facility occupation and maintenance fees, capital improvement fees, and service fees as may be established from time to time pursuant to the Constitution and Bylaws of the Northeast Illinois Regional Crime Lab.

SECTION 9 – INDEMNIFICATION

To the greatest extent permissible by law, the Crime Lab shall assume full and complete responsibility for the actions of its employees acting pursuant to this Agreement, including without limitation, insurance, indemnification and protection of such personnel.

SECTION 10 – EFFECTIVENESS; TERM

This agreement shall be in full force and effect and legally binding on the Crime Lab and the Member as of the date written below. This Agreement shall automatically renew for a period of twelve (12) months on the first day of the subsequent fiscal year of the member agency immediately following such effective date, and each first day of the subsequent fiscal year of the member agency thereafter for a like period of twelve (12) months.

SECTION 11 – AMENDMENTS

This Agreement may be amended from time to time in writing approved by resolution of the corporate authorities of each Member. Any proposed amendment shall not be effective until adopted and approved by the corporate authorities of each Member.

SECTION 12 – TERMINATION

The Member may terminate this Agreement by resolution of its corporate authorities. Certified copies of any such terminating resolution shall be filed with the Executive Director of the Crime Lab and the President of its Executive Board within thirty (30) days after its passage. In the event of termination as to one Member, this Agreement shall remain binding as to the remaining Members.

Termination shall not be effective, however, until ninety (90) days after filing of certified copies to the Executive Director and President of the Executive Board. Moreover, notwithstanding such termination, a terminating Member shall remain liable and responsible for paying all fees for services provided by the Crime Lab prior to the effective date of such termination.

Further, a terminating Member shall not be entitled to any refund or return, in whole or in part, of fees or assessments paid by such Member prior to the effective date of such termination nor shall the terminating Member be entitled to receive or hold any interest in any equipment or other assets or interests of the Crime Lab.

Subject: **Agreement to Provide Public Safety Dispatch and Detainee Housing Services to the Village of Island Lake**

Issue: The Village of Lake Zurich has provided public safety radio dispatch services to the Village of Island Lake since 2013. The current agreement expires April 30, 2024 and both parties would like to extend the agreement.

Due to staffing shortages in the Lake County Jail, the Lake County Sheriff's Office has notified smaller law enforcement agencies that do not have detainee housing facilities that they may not be able to house detainees in some cases. Island Lake has asked if Lake Zurich can assist them in the event a housing request is denied.

Strategic Plan: This agenda item is consistent with the following goals and objectives of the Strategic Plan.

- Financial Sustainability
 - Identify opportunities to provide services to other agencies
 - Maximize existing and identify potential new revenue sources
 - Identify areas where Lake Zurich services may overlap with other organizations, both public and private, within a defined region
- Service Sustainability
 - Identify methods of alternative service

Analysis: The parties to the current dispatch services agreement desire to continue the provision of services as revised by the attached intergovernmental agreement. The proposed agreement is for a two-year period, or until all parties agree to transition dispatch operations to a regional 9-1-1 system in which all parties become a member.

State law requires that facilities housing detainees be staffed and monitored. Since the Island Lake Police station is not staffed 24 hours a day, they are unable to house detainees when staff is not in the building. The Lake Zurich police station is currently staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We have developed an agreement that would enable Island Lake to house their detainees at the

Lake Zurich Police Department as needed at the cost of \$250.00 per day. We do not believe that the frequency of Island Lake detainees being housed at Lake Zurich will place any undue burden on our staff. We have a similar agreement with the Wauconda Police Department.

If/when dispatch consolidation takes place, it is likely that the Lake Zurich police station will not be staffed 24 hours a day. At that point, it is expected the agreement would be null and void.

The Village of Island Lake approved the dispatch services and detainee housing agreements on March 14, 2024.

Recommendation: Enter into agreements with the Village of Island Lake to provide public safety dispatch and detainee housing services.

***Dispatch Services Agreement Between the Village of Lake Zurich
and the Village of Island Lake***

This Agreement is made and entered into as of this 14th day of March, 2024, by and between the Village of Lake Zurich, Lake County, Illinois an Illinois municipal corporation (“Lake Zurich”), and the Village of Island Lake, Lake County, Illinois, McHenry County, Illinois, an Illinois municipal corporation (“Island Lake”) (Lake Zurich and Island Lake shall be referred to collectively as the “Parties”),

WITNESSTH

WHEREAS, Lake Zurich and Island Lake desire to enter into an agreement on or about May 1, 2024, under which Lake Zurich agrees to provide Island Lake with certain public safety radio dispatch services utilizing personnel and equipment maintained and operated by Lake Zurich; and

WHEREAS, Island Lake (the “Recipient”) desires to enter into this Agreement with Lake Zurich to continue the mutually beneficial arrangement regarding public safety radio dispatch services provided by Lake Zurich; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have the power and authority to enter into this Agreement pursuant to the provisions of Article VII, section 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, as amended, 5 ILCS 220/1 et. Seq., and other applicable authority;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants herein made and pursuant to all applicable statutes and local ordinances, and for other good and valuable consideration the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby mutually acknowledged, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:

Section 1. Recitals.

The foregoing recitals are by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

Section 2. Dispatch Services Provided by Lake Zurich.

Lake Zurich hereby agrees that its radio dispatchers/telecommunicators shall accept and monitor the emergency telephone numbers of Island Lake in order to obtain information to assign calls-for-service and monitor traffic on police and fire radio frequencies, maintain a log of all such communications (electronic or written), relay information received by such means to Island Lake's on-duty police personnel by means of voice radio and mobile data communications, monitor communications from and between Island Lake's police personnel and relay messages as necessary, and accurately input and update call-for-service information into the computer aided dispatch (CAD) system.

Lake Zurich shall provide dispatch services continuously, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, including all State of Illinois and Federal holidays; provided, however, that dispatch services shall be provided to Island Lake only to the extent possible utilizing Lake Zurich's dispatch personnel and equipment. In the event of immediate, overlapping needs for dispatch services, the calls, when possible, shall have priority in accordance with the seriousness of the service requested. The term "priority" shall have the meaning determined therefore by the Joint Operations Committee and the Lake County ETSB, as the Joint Operations Committee is defined in Section 8 of this Agreement, and approved by the Lake Zurich Board of Trustees.

Section 3. Dispatch Services Disruption or Failure; Waiver.

If dispatch services are disrupted or fail for any reason, due to an event, condition or circumstance beyond the reasonable control of Lake Zurich, Lake Zurich shall notify Island Lake of such disruption as soon as practicable and shall inform Island Lake of the nature of the disruption or failure, if known, as well as the expected length of time before dispatch services are restored. Lake Zurich also shall notify Island Lake as soon as dispatch services are restored. Island Lake hereby waives and releases any and all claims or causes of action against Lake Zurich for costs, fees, claims, or expenses incurred by Island Lake that arise out of or relate in any way to any such disruption or failure of dispatch services.

Section 4. Determination and Payment of Costs.

Pursuant to this Agreement, Island Lake agrees to pay Lake Zurich an annual fee for dispatch services as follows:

May 1, 2024 to April 30, 2025 - \$167,548.88

May 1, 2025 to April 30, 2026 - \$174,250.83

The annual fees reflect a 4% increase.

- A. Time for Payment: Island Lake shall pay to Lake Zurich the dispatch service fee for each year during the term of this Agreement. Payment options include monthly, quarterly, or annual payments if mutually acceptable by both Island Lake and Lake Zurich. For purposes of this Agreement, a year will begin May 1st and end April 30th. There shall be no discount for any lump-sum pre-payment of annual dispatch service fees.
- B. Conditional Right to Deny Services: Lake Zurich shall have the right, in the exercise of its sole and absolute discretion based on factors such as system capacity, personnel, costs, payments, location, and similar factors, to deny dispatch services for any extraterritorial area (any area proposed to be added to this agreement that is not currently within the municipal boundaries of the Village of Island Lake) unless such area is reviewed and recommended by Lake Zurich in advance of the commencement of police services or dispatch services to such area.

Section 5. Effective Date, Term and Termination:

This Agreement shall commence on May 1, 2024 and shall remain in full force and effect until April 30, 2026, unless dispatch consolidation occurs before this date. It is understood that the Lake Zurich is not incurring any additional dispatch expenses by executing this agreement and, for that reason, either party hereto may, without penalty, and for any reason or no reason at all, cancel this Agreement prior to its natural termination on April 30, 2026, unless dispatch consolidation occurs before this date. In the event of such occurrence, the Village of Lake Zurich reserves the right to terminate

this Agreement. At any time during the term of the Agreement, if there are any additional costs being proposed which are based in whole or part on Island Lake's membership, use or continued use of the system, prior to incurring such costs, Island Lake will be notified and provide its written consent/agreement to the expenditure and assume responsibility for its pro rata share of such costs. The parties may mutually agree to cancel this agreement upon all parties entering into an agreement to transition dispatch operations to a regional 9-1-1 system in which all parties become a member. During any transition periods, the parties shall remain contractually obligated to perform the required services under this Agreement.

Section 6. Maintenance of the Radio System.

The Village of Lake Zurich agrees to maintain the current radio systems as the systems exist at the initiation of this Agreement. Island Lake shall be responsible for procuring, programming, and maintaining their Lake Zurich compatible mobile and portable radio equipment for use by their personnel on this system. However, any upgrade to the Lake Zurich radio system due to Island Lake's expansion of public safety services or Island Lake's provision of public safety services to another unit of local government will be the sole responsibility of Island Lake. All equipment necessitated by any expansion of the public safety services must be compatible with the radio system used by the Lake Zurich 9-1-1 Dispatch Center. Any modification of the radio system used by the Lake Zurich 9-1-1 Dispatch Center required by this expansion will be performed by a radio service provider chosen by Lake Zurich. All costs associated with the expansion of public safety services will be paid by the agency responsible for the expansion.

The base radio stations, dispatch radio stations, antennas, satellite receivers, and other related radio equipment remain the property of Lake Zurich. With obsolescence and changing regulatory requirements Lake Zurich may from time-to-time upgrade the radio infrastructure. Changes will be communicated to all partner agencies well in advance in implementation.

Section 7. Upgrade of Telephone System.

Island Lake agrees that any changes in their service area that requires installation of additional, or an upgrade to, existing telephone equipment to the Village of Lake Zurich Public Safety Answering Point, 9-1-1 Dispatch Center shall be the sole expense of Island Lake.

Section 8. Joint Operations Committee.

The Joint Operations Committee comprised of a single representative from each Lake Zurich dispatch partner, may convene from time-to-time to discuss issues that mutually affect all partners. A representative from the Village of Lake Zurich shall serve as chairperson of the Joint Operations Committee. Unless prohibited by law from doing so, all dispatch partners agree to operate under a standardized operational procedure as prescribed by Lake Zurich and the Lake County Emergency Systems Telephone Board (ETSB). Procedural issues and day-to-day operations will be addressed by the Lake Zurich Police Department. It is expressly understood that Lake Zurich is responsible for the management of dispatch personnel.

Section 9. Enforcement.

The Parties hereto may, in law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus, or any other proceeding including without limitation specific performance, enforce or compel the performance of this Agreement; provided, however, that each Recipient agrees that it shall not seek, and does not under any circumstances have the right to seek, to recover any judgment for monetary damages against Lake Zurich or any Lake Zurich elected or appointed officials, agents, representatives, attorneys, or employees on account of the negotiation, execution, performance, or breach of any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement, except only against Lake Zurich in the event of a willful and malicious failure and refusal by Lake Zurich to provide dispatch services in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. In the event of a judicial proceeding brought by any of the Parties to this Agreement against another Party for enforcement or for breach of any provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party in such judicial proceeding shall be entitled to reimbursement from the unsuccessful Party of all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, incurred in connection with such judicial proceeding.

Section 10. Indemnity.

Island Lake shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Lake Zurich, and its officers, agents and employees, from any and all liability, losses, costs, damage or expense, or injury to person or property, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of the execution of this Agreement, the performance of any act pursuant to this Agreement, or the termination of this Agreement in accordance with its terms, with the exception of any liability, losses, costs, damage or expense, or injury to person or property arising out of or resulting from either: (1) the sole action, or malfeasance of Lake Zurich, or its officers, agents and employees in the performance or non-performance of any act pursuant to the Agreement; or (2) except as otherwise provided in Section 2 and 3 of this Agreement from Lake Zurich's inability or failure to perform its obligations under this Agreement.

Lake Zurich shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Island Lake, and its officers, agents and employees, from all and any liability, losses, costs, damage or expense, or injury to person or property, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from the sole action, or malfeasance of Lake Zurich or its officers, agents or employees in the performance or non-performance of an act pursuant to this Agreement or except as otherwise provided in Section 2 and 3 of this Agreement Lake Zurich's inability or failure to perform any provisions of this Agreement.

The above indemnities are for the performance or omission of any act pursuant to this Agreement or the termination of this Agreement according to its terms. Any liability of one Party to the other incurred during the term of this Agreement, or any extensions hereof, shall not be extinguished.

Section 11. Appropriations.

To the extent permitted by applicable law, Lake Zurich agrees to appropriate annually such funds as may be reasonably necessary to provide dispatch services pursuant to this Agreement. Island Lake agrees to appropriate annually all funds necessary to make payments to Lake Zurich pursuant to this Agreement.

Section 12. Amendments; Waivers.

This Agreement and the rights created by this Agreement may not be amended, modified, or waived in any respect except by written agreement expressly referring to this Agreement and duly validly authorized, executed, and delivered by all of the Parties hereto.

Section 13. Tort Immunity.

Nothing in this Agreement shall express or imply any limitation to or waiver of the tort immunities provided to Lake Zurich or Island Lake and their respective employees, as provided by the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act (745 ILCS 10/1, et seq.).

Section 14. Notices.

All notices and other communications in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed delivered to the addressee thereof when delivered in person at the address set forth below or three business days after deposit thereof in any main or branch United States post office, certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, properly addressed to the Parties, respectively, as follows:

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE VILLAGE OF ISLAND LAKE AND THE
VILLAGE OF LAKE ZURICH REGARDING THE USE
OF THE VILLAGE OF LAKE ZURICH
POLICE HOLDING FACILITY**

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is entered into on this 14th day of March 2024, by and between the Village of Lake Zurich, Lake County, Illinois, an Illinois municipal corporation ("Lake Zurich"), and the Village of Island Lake, Lake and McHenry Counties, Illinois, an Illinois municipal corporation ("Island Lake").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et.seq.*, authorize and encourage intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, Lake Zurich and Island Lake are municipalities or units of government as provided in Article VII of the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Lake Zurich maintains an active and equipped police department, including police officers, vehicles and equipment, and is willing and able to provide the use of the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility, located at 200 Mohawk Trail, Lake Zurich, Illinois, to the Village of Island Lake for the purpose of temporarily holding detainees of the Island Lake Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Island Lake does maintain an active and equipped police department, however it is not in a position to hold its detainees due to cuts in personnel; and

WHEREAS, Lake Zurich is willing and able to provide use of the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility in order to house Island Lake's detainees, and the parties wish to associate, cooperate and enter into an intergovernmental agreement that so provides; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-1-2.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-1-2.1 provides authority for agreements between municipalities for police assistance; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of Lake Zurich and Island Lake to enter into this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained within this Agreement, Lake Zurich and Island Lake agree as follows:

SECTION 1 – RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1.1 - The above recitals to this Agreement are hereby incorporated as if fully set forth herein.

1.2 Lake Zurich shall, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, and in accordance with commonly accepted law enforcement practices, allow Island Lake to use the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility for the purpose of housing detainees arrested by the Island Lake Police Department on a twenty four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week basis.

1.3 Island Lake agrees to be responsible for the meals, transportation of its detainees to and from court, the transportation of its detainees for medical purposes and for the reimbursement for the cost of transportation of its detainees in the case of an emergency.

1.4 Island Lake agrees to be responsible for damages caused by its detainees to Lake Zurich property, and for the medical or hospital costs of its detainees to be paid on behalf of its detainees as mandated by State and Federal law.

1.5 Island Lake shall provide and be responsible for the processing, bonding, and authorization of the release of all detainees transported to the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility by Island Lake. Lake Zurich shall be responsible for the maintenance and operation of the Holding Facility and for the supervision of detainees.

1.6 Island Lake Police Officers shall inform themselves of and abide by the following Lake Zurich Police Department General Orders which are attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

- 1.6.1 200.250 "Prisoners - Booking, Housing, Transfer, and Release"
- 1.6.2 200.250(M)(1) "Instructions for the Completion of the IDOC Report of Extraordinary or Unusual Occurrence"
- 1.6.3 200.255 "Prisoners – Transportation and Restraint"

1.7 A detainee brought to the Lake Zurich Police Department Holding Facility by Island Lake that exhibits strange or suicidal behavior, threatens to harm themselves or anyone else, has the potential to harm themselves, has a known mental condition, or has not had detention authorized by the Lake County State's Attorney's Office will not be housed in the Lake Zurich Holding Facility. Such determination shall be made by Lake Zurich Police personnel, within their sole discretion.

1.8 Island Lake agrees to write into its action plans contingency efforts in regards to capacity issues if the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility becomes full or emergency circumstances dictate not accepting detainees from Island Lake.

1.9 Island Lake shall, in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, pay to Lake Zurich the fees and costs for the provision of such services as set forth in section 5 of this Agreement.

1.10 Lake Zurich Police personnel shall have the authority to refuse to hold a detainee for Island Lake in the event the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility is at capacity or close to capacity,

SECTION 2 – TERM and TERMINATION

2.1 Unless otherwise terminated by either party pursuant to this Section, this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect for the period from April 1, 2024, through April 1, 2026 or until the Lake Zurich Police Department Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) closes or consolidates its dispatch operations with other jurisdictions. If neither party terminates the agreement in writing at least thirty (30) days prior to April 1, 2026, and the Lake Zurich Police Department PSAP continues to operate, the Agreement shall automatically renew for additional one year periods subject to the termination rights set forth in Paragraph 2.2.

2.2 This Agreement may be terminated by either party at any time, without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice.

2.3 In the event of any substantive breach of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the aggrieved signatory shall notify the signatory alleged to be in breach of the nature of the breach. The signatory alleged to be in breach shall have thirty (30) days to cure the default; if the nature of the default is such that a cure cannot reasonably be affected within thirty (30) days, the signatory alleged to be in breach shall not be held in default so long as it commences a cure in the thirty (30) day period and diligently pursues completion thereof. Upon default of this Agreement, the non-defaulting party may terminate this Agreement without prejudice and shall have all legal and equitable remedies arising from the breach.

SECTION 3 – DUTIES AND AUTHORITY OF POLICE OFFICERS

3.1 Lake Zurich police officers shall be authorized at all times to enforce the laws, ordinances, and regulations of Lake Zurich, the State of Illinois, and the United States of America upon any person arrested in Island Lake and transferred to Lake Zurich to be temporarily housed in the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility.

3.2 All Lake Zurich police officers, vehicles, and equipment shall at all times remain under the sole and exclusive control and command of the Lake Zurich Chief of Police.

3.3 This Agreement shall not be construed so as to limit or decrease in any way the authority or ability of Lake Zurich police officers to enforce the laws, ordinances and regulations of Lake Zurich, the State of Illinois, or the United States of America within the corporate limits of Lake Zurich.

3.4 All Lake Zurich police officers and employees providing services under this Agreement shall remain solely under the command structure of the Village of Lake Zurich at all times.

SECTION 4 – LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION

4.1 Island Lake shall defend, protect, indemnify, save and forever hold harmless Lake Zurich and/or any of its officers, officials, employees, agents, and/or representatives from and against any and all liabilities, obligations, claims, damages, penalties, causes of action, costs and expenses, including but not limited to court costs, litigation expenses, insurance deductibles, and attorneys' fees and expenses, which Lake Zurich and/or its officers, officials, employees, agents, and/or representatives may incur, suffer, or sustain, or for which Lake Zurich and/or its officers, officials, employees, agents, and/or representatives may become

obligated by reasons of any accident, injury to, or death of any persons, or loss of, or damage to, any property, or civil and/or constitutional infringement of civil rights or liberties (specifically including violations of any and all federal civil rights statutes, regulations, and constitutional provisions) arising directly or indirectly from, in connection with, under, or as a result of the Agreement by virtue of any act or omission of any of Island Lake's officers, officials, employees, agents, and/or representatives. This provision is entered into pursuant to Sections 5/1-4-6 and 5/1-1-2.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-4-6; 65 ILCS 5/11-1-2.1.

4.2 Lake Zurich shall defend, protect, indemnify, save and forever hold harmless Island Lake and/or any of its officers, officials, employees, agents, and/or representatives from and against any and all liabilities, obligations, claims, damages, penalties, causes of action, costs and expenses, including but not limited to court costs, litigation expenses, insurance deductibles and attorneys' fees and expenses, which Island Lake and/or its officers, officials, employees, agents, and/or representatives may incur, suffer, or sustain, or for which Island Lake and/or its officers, officials, employees, agents, and/or representatives may become obligated by reasons of any accident, injury to, or death of any persons, or loss of, or damages to, any property, or civil and/or constitutional infringement of civil rights or liberties (specifically including violations of any and all federal civil rights statutes, regulations, and constitutional provisions) arising directly or indirectly from, in connection with, under, or as a result of this Agreement by virtue of any act or omission of any of Lake Zurich officers, officials, employees, agents, and/or representatives. This provision is entered into pursuant to Sections 5/1-4-6 and 5/1-1-2.1 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-4-6; 65 ILCS 5/11-1-2.1.

4.3 Island Lake shall carry and maintain comprehensive general public liability insurance, which shall include coverage for personal liability, contractual liability, automobile coverage, bodily injury, death and property damage, in a minimum amount of \$5,000,000 combined single limit, which insurance shall include Lake Zurich as a named additional insured. Island Lake shall present evidence of the required insurance coverage to Lake Zurich prior to the commencement of the term of this Agreement.

SECTION 5 – FEES

5.1 Island Lake shall pay Lake Zurich two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) per calendar day per detainee housed in the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility. A calendar day shall be defined as any component of a calendar day, up to 24 hours, spent by a detainee in the Lake Zurich Police Holding Facility. Lake Zurich also reserves the right to charge Island Lake for actual personnel costs incurred by Lake Zurich Police to staff the Police Holding Facility.

SECTION 6 – PAYMENT

6.1 Lake Zurich shall provide Island Lake with an invoice for housing services on a quarterly basis. Payment shall be made within thirty (30) days of mailing of the invoice.

SECTION 7 – FINANCING CONTINGENCY

7.1 Lake Zurich and Island Lake expressly agree to comply with all legal and administrative requirements that govern the acceptance and use of the federal grant funds received for law enforcement purposes, as such requirements may be amended from time to time.

SECTION 8 – ACCOUNTABILITY

8.1 The Lake Zurich Chief of Police and the Village Manager shall administer this Agreement on behalf of Lake Zurich. The Island Lake Chief of Police and the Village Mayor shall administer this Agreement on behalf of Island Lake. The respective Chiefs of Police shall establish reasonable protocols for the admittance and discharge of prisoners.

8.2 Notice or other writings which any party desires or is required to serve upon the other party in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered electronically or certified mail return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed to the respective Chief of Police.

SECTION 9 – GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

9.1 If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid for any reason, such invalidation shall not render invalid other provisions of this Agreement which can be given effect in the absence of the invalid provision, provided that the invalidation of such provision does not materially impact the purpose for which this Agreement was entered.

9.2 Any other agreements, understandings, representations, and/or promises between the parties hereto concerning the subject matter hereof, whether written, oral or otherwise, are hereby canceled and superseded by the Agreement upon its approval and acceptance by the parties. This Agreement encompasses the full and complete understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter contained herein.

9.3 This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws and Constitution of the State of Illinois.

9.4 All of the terms and conditions of this Agreement are hereby made binding, on the respective successors and assigns of both parties hereto.

9.5 Nothing contained in the Agreement is intended to constitute, nor shall constitute a waiver of the defenses available to either of the Parties under the Illinois Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act (745 ILCS 10/1-101 *et seq.*) with respect to claims by third parties.

WHEREAS, pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76.4 and in the opinion of a simple majority of the corporate authorities holding office in the Village of Lake Zurich Lake County, Illinois, ("Village") it is no longer necessary, useful, or for the best interests of the Village to retain ownership of the personal property hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich to dispose of said personal property in the manner described in this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich, Lake County and the State of Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance as findings of the President and Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Disposal of Surplus Property. The President and Board of Trustees find that the personal property described as follows in **Exhibit A** by this reference incorporated into this Ordinance (the "Property") is no longer necessary or useful to the Village, and thus the Village Manager for the Village of Lake Zurich is hereby authorized to direct the sale or disposal of the property in the manner most appropriate to the Village consistent with 65 ILCS 5/11-76.4. The property shall be sold "as is."

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.

Subject: 2024 Seal Coating and Striping Award Recommendation

Issue: The FY 2024 budget includes \$50,000.00 for pavement maintenance of Village owned parking facilities and pathways.

Background: In order for the Village to achieve the maximum life on its parking lots and walking paths, a pavement maintenance program consisting of patching, seal coating, and crack filling is necessary to preserve the structural integrity of the Villages assets. Sites are inspected on an annual basis and recommended for maintenance on a three-year rotation.

Village Strategic Plan: This agenda item is consistent with the following Goals and Objectives of the Strategic Plan.

- Goal: Infrastructure Investment
 - Prepare a Formalized Municipal Property Maintenance program.
 - Identify and Resolve Outstanding Concerns with Village Owned Property.


Analysis: This year's program includes 21 locations consisting of municipal parking facilities and walking paths throughout the Village. Staff solicited bids for the 2024 Crack Sealing Program on February 5, 2024. The bid opening occurred on March 14, 2024. The Village received five (5) bids. The bid results are shown below. A full reference list was made available to Village staff for review. The results of the reference inquiries were found to be favorable. Staff has also confirmed with Pavement Systems Inc. that all operations, installation practices, and documentation shall comply with the specifications set forth in the bid documentation.

**DESCRIPTION OF WORK
AND WORK PROCEDURES**

Scope of work:

The Work consists of furnishing all labor, materials, equipment, and other incidentals necessary for the preparation, sealcoating, and striping of walking paths and parking lot sites listed with this Notice to Bidders. Contractor shall record all pavement markings by photograph or drawing to maintain painting layout following seal coating. Standard parking stall width shall be divided equally. ADA parking stalls shall meet Federal ADA compliance regulations.

Clean all asphalt perimeters to expose edges, removing overgrown grass and debris. Contractor is responsible for debris removal.

Surface and hairline cracks less than one-eighth (1/8) inch in width do not require repair. Rout all cracks greater than one-eighth (1/8) inch with a wire brush wheel machine or by means of a hot compressed air lance. To assure adhesion, cracks shall be dry and clean of all foreign debris, loose dirt and vegetation prior to applying crack sealant.

All cracks will be filled with WR Meadows #164 Hot Tar crack sealant (or like product).

While crack filler is still hot, it will be struck off with a V-squeegee. Finished sealed cracks and joints will be uniformly level and all "sinkers" will be refilled to achieve one-eighth (1/8) inch concave surface appearance.

Thoroughly clean the pavement of all dirt, dust loose debris, and foreign material, using high-speed power blowers, wire brooms, and scrapers.

Surfaces shall be dry a minimum of eight (8) hours before seal coat application. Sealer shall not be applied when weather is foggy, rainy or when ambient temperature is below 50 degrees Fahrenheit or if temperature is expected to drop below 50 degrees Fahrenheit at any time within a 24-hour period after application.

All petroleum spills and stains shall be cleaned by scraping or scrubbing with a detergent, then rinse thoroughly with clean water. After cleaning, treat areas with a latex oil spot primer. Bad oil spots will have the oil spot primer worked in with a stiff bristle brush.

Asphalt sealer must be used at all locations. The Village does not allow the use of Coal-Tar products. Sealer must maintain 2 (two) pounds of aggregate per gallon of raw sealer and E.L.A. (enhanced latex additive). A fast-drying agent must be added at all times when sealer is at the 35% cut rate. Sealer application procedures will vary with pavement conditions at each location.

Pavement sealer must cure a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours or eight (8) daylight hours prior to applying traffic marking paint.

Parking lot markings shall be placed in existing configurations and locations as confirmed by the Superintendent of General Services or his agent prior to seal coating.

Paint shall not be applied when air temperatures are below 50 degrees Fahrenheit. All parking stall lines shall be yellow in color. Handicap designations to be international symbols using yellow paint. White paint is used for any and all stop lines. All colors of marking paint shall be formulated especially for striping bituminous paving in one coat, free of bleed-through. Use acrylic latex paint over new seal coating. The use of aerosol cans will not be permitted.

Contractor Submittals:

Prior to beginning the Work, the Contractor shall provide a list of contacts including the name and phone number of the Project Manager, each crew leader, and an emergency contact who shall be available 24-hours a day, 7 days a week. Following the award of this bid and contract and prior to starting work, the Contractor shall furnish to the Village a construction progress schedule or critical path schedule satisfactory to the Director of Public Works which shall show the proposed sequence of work and how the Contractor proposes to complete the work prior to the completion date(s) specified herein.

Field Modifications:

A field modification is written by the Village to the Contractor for purposes of clarification of the specifications or plans. A field modification is limited to items that do not change the scope of the Work. Field modifications do not affect either the project cost or completion date. Field modifications become part of the contract agreement and become binding upon the Contractor if he fails to object within three (3) working days after receiving the modification. A field modification may be used as the basis of a project cost change or contract extension if all parties agree on the field modification form to a potential future claim of either party, or that the field modification will be compiled with, but under protest.

Technical Specification:

The Contractor shall complete the work in accordance with the Standard Specifications, the latest edition of the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways", and the "Manual of Test Procedures for Materials" in effect on the date of invitation for bids, and the Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions which apply to and govern the construction of the Work. The Contractor shall comply with all other applicable ordinances and requirements of State, County, local and other agencies having jurisdictional authority over the Work. Where there is a conflict between these Specifications, the Standard Specifications and other applicable requirements, the most restrictive requirement shall prevail. The Contractor shall provide all necessary labor, tools, equipment, materials and other appurtenances necessary to complete the work unless otherwise noted in these Specifications.

Material Testing:

QC Testing is not required for materials used associated with this project. The Village may contract with a separate material testing firm to perform materials testing if it is in the best interest of the Village. If testing performed by the Village results in unsatisfactory results, the Contractor shall take corrective action to ensure the materials meet the Standard Specifications. The corrective action must be approved by the Director of Public Works. The Village, at its own discretion, may require unsatisfactory material to be removed and replaced at no additional cost to the Municipality.

Protection of Work:

The Contractor shall be responsible to provide personnel to protect their work from third party damage. Should any of the new work be damaged, it shall be removed and replaced at the Contractor's expense. Claims of darkness shall not be reason to relieve the Contractor from responsibility.

Restoration:

Restoration of areas adjacent to the proposed improvements, not identified for additional work, shall be incidental to all pay Items.

Restoration includes all the landscape, driveway pavements, sidewalk, or pavement restoration within 2 feet of improved areas, unless otherwise determined by the Village. Any damage due to negligence of the Contractor or deemed necessary by the Village will be restored at no additional cost to the Village. Restoration must be completed to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works. The Director of Public Works may request restoration not satisfactorily completed to be removed and replaced at no additional cost to the Village.

Restoration shall meet the Specifications as listed herein.

Asphalt surface restoration shall consist of new HMA pavement to match the existing pavement thickness or 4- inches minimum, whichever is greater.

Landscape restoration shall consist of 4-inches of topsoil, seed, and blanket.

Construction Work Schedule:

The Contractor shall coordinate directly with the Director of Public Works (or his/her designee) for the Village to schedule the Work. The Contractor shall notify the Village no less than 72 hours prior to the start of any construction. The Contractor shall also notify the Illinois Department of Transportation, County Highway Department or any other affected agency prior to the start of any work within their respective rights-of-way. The Contractor shall notify residents in writing 48 hours in advance of any work which will affect their driveway access. The duration of driveway closures shall not exceed 96 hours unless agreed to by the property owner and the Director of Public Works (or his/her designee).

Special note must be taken to the location maps in Appendix "D". Multiple sites require daily or 24-hour accessibility.

Traffic Control and Protection:

This work shall be done in accordance with the applicable portions of Section 701 of the Standard Specifications, the Supplemental Specifications, the "Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways", and any details and Highway Standards contained in the Plans and Special Provisions, and the Special Provisions contained herein, except as modified herein. Special Attention is called to Article 107.09 of the Standard Specifications and the following Highway Standards, Details, Recurring Local Roads and Streets Special Provisions, and Special Provisions contained herein, relating to traffic control.

Highway Standards: 701301, 701311, 701501, 701801, 701901

District One Details: Traffic Control and Protection for Side Roads, Intersections, and Driveways.

Recurring Local Roads and Streets Special Provisions: Work Zone Traffic, Control Surveillance, Flaggers in Work Zones.

This Work includes furnishing, installing and maintaining of all temporary signs, barricades, warning lights, fences, flagmen, and other devices which are to be used for purposes of regulating, warning or guiding vehicular or pedestrian traffic during performance of the Work.

All barricades shall have working lights or flashers attached and be operational during night time hours.

The Contractor shall maintain one lane open to traffic at all times. Two lanes of traffic shall be maintained at all times during nonworking hours. Type II barricades (State of Illinois Standard 2299-9) with lights shall be

maintained, whenever one lane of traffic is to be closed, at 25-foot intervals, except wherever there is a vertical grade difference of six inches or more; barricades shall be spaced at ten-foot intervals, throughout the improvement.

When it becomes necessary to close a street due to work through an intersection or street crossing, the Contractor shall provide traffic control devices in accordance with State of Illinois Standard "701501-02".

No excavation shall be left open overnight. All traffic control devices shall remain in place until specific authorization for their removal is received from the Director of Public Works.

No work shall proceed unless all traffic control devices are in place as specified herein or as determined by the Director of Public Works.

All traffic control devices shall be kept clean and neat appearing, and shall be replaced immediately if they become ineffective due to damage or defacement.

The Contractor shall contact the Director of Public Works at least 72 hours in advance of beginning work. Construction operations shall be conducted in a manner such that streets will be open to emergency traffic and accessible as required to local traffic. Advanced notice shall be provided to residents, police, fire, school districts and trash haulers when access to any street will be temporarily closed or limited. Removal and replacement of curb and gutter and driveways shall be planned so as to cause a minimum of inconvenience to the abutting property owners. The Work shall be accomplished such that the streets will be left open to local traffic at the end of each working day.

This work will not be paid for separately, but will be included in the items for which this work applies.

The Work includes all labor, materials, installation, transportation, maintenance, handling, flagmen and incidental expenses or work necessary to furnish, install, maintain and remove all traffic control devices indicated herein and as determined by the Director of Public Works to complete the work as specified. Additional flaggers, fencing, signs, or barricades as may be required by the Director of Public Works for safe movement of traffic and pedestrians will not be paid for separately, but will be included in the items for which this work applies.

Work Site Precautions and Safety:

Contractor shall be responsible for and take all necessary and proper safety precautions to protect from accident or injury, all persons, including its employees and its subcontractors' employees, who may be at or on the premises where the Work is being performed.

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Contract") is hereby entered into by and between the Village of Lake Zurich, an Illinois municipality (the "Village"), and _____, an _____, located at _____ Illinois, (the "Contractor").

1. Contract

a. The Agreement between the Village and the Contractor shall include all of the following shall be bound by the terms and conditions of this Contract, the bid documents and exhibits:

- i. This Contract document
- ii. The Notice to Bidders
- iii. The Instructions to Bidders
- iv. The Bid Award
- v. The General Conditions
- vi. The Description of Work and Procedures (**Exhibit A** hereto)
- vii. The Bid Proposal Form (**Exhibit B** hereto)

2. Performance of the Work

a. A description of the work to be performed, and related procedures, are attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "Work").

b. The Contractor is solely responsible for safety at its Work sites and shall exercise every precaution at all times for the protection and safety of persons and properties, including its employees and subcontractors. The Village or its inspectors shall be furnished with such information and assistance by the Contractor as may be required to make a complete and detailed inspection. Work, services or materials not in compliance with the Contract may be rejected by the Village, and even if the Contractor deems them complete, shall be performed again by the Contractor at no expense to the Village.

e. The Contractor shall provide an adequate number of competently trained personnel with sufficient supervision to perform the services required, and the Contractor shall provide identification of its personnel if requested by the Village. Any Contractor's employee or representative whose employment is reasonably detrimental or objectionable to the Village shall be transferred immediately from the work site upon the Village's request. The exercise of this option shall not be construed as placing the Village in charge of the performance of the services required under the Contract, or as making the Village responsible for safety. All tools or equipment required to carry out the operations within the scope of the Contract shall be provided by the Contractor, and shall meet the standards of OSHA and the State of Illinois safety codes as may be applicable and required by law. The Village reserves the right to inspect the equipment that will be used prior to the award of the bid or during the execution of the Work.

f. The Contractor shall, prior to commencement of services, provide in writing to the Village, the names of all job supervisors. At least one such supervisor to whom the Village representative may issue directives shall, at all times, be at the job site. Such person shall be fluent in the English language.

3. Quality of Work

- a. The Contractor represents and certifies that the Work shall be performed in accordance with the generally accepted industry standards and standards of professional practice, care and diligence practiced by recognized firms in performing services of a similar nature in existence at the time of performance. All Work shall be performed in a reasonably prompt manner.
- b. The Contractor represents that its employees, agents and subcontractors currently hold, and shall maintain throughout the term of this Contract, all required licenses, permits and certificates, and have duly registered and otherwise complied in all respects with any applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and ordinances applicable to their performance of the Work required by the Contract.
- c. The Contractor shall provide adequate personnel necessary to complete the Work. The Contractor shall have no claim for damages and shall not bill the Village for additional time and materials charges as the result of any portion of the Work which must be duplicated or redone due to staff or employee termination or loss or for any delay or extension of time in performing the Work as a result of any such termination or loss.
- d. All Work performed under any subcontract shall be subject to all terms of this Agreement in the same manner as if performed by employees of the Contractor. Every subcontract that the Contractor enters into in regard to the performance of the Work under this Agreement shall include a provision binding the subcontractor to all of the terms of this Agreement.
- e. Contractor warrants to the Village that all materials furnished under this Contract shall be new and of the most suitable grade for the purpose intended and that all work shall be of good quality, free from faults and defects and in conformance with the Contract and bid documents. Prior to final completion, Contractor shall deliver to the Village all warranties required under the Contract and bid documents, or to which Contractor is entitled from manufacturers, suppliers, and Subcontractors. Unless otherwise provided, all warranties for products and materials incorporated into the work shall begin on the date of substantial completion and remain in effect for a period of one (1) year. No payment under this Contract by the Village shall constitute an acceptance of work not done in accordance with contract documents or relieve the Contractor or its sureties of liability with respect to any warranties or responsibilities for faulty or defective materials and workmanship.
- f. Contractor warrants that the work shall be done in a workmanlike manner in strict accordance with the Contract documents and guarantees that the labor and material will be free of defects for the period stated in the Contract documents, but in no event less than one (1) year from the date of substantial completion.

4. Quantity of Work

- a. The quantities identified herein are estimated quantities. The Village does not guarantee any specific amount and shall not be held responsible for any deviation. This Contract shall cover the Village's requirements whether more or less than the estimated amount.

- b.** The Village reserves the right to increase and/or decrease quantities, add or delete locations during the term of the Contract, whatever is deemed to be in the best interest of the Village.
- c.** Upon request by the Village, the Contractor shall provide either/both written and verbal reports to the Community Development Director of Public Works, regarding the progress of the Work.
- d.** The Contractor shall maintain books, records, documents and other evidence directly pertinent to performance of the Work under this Contract. The Contractor shall also maintain the financial information and data used by the contractor in the preparation or support of any cost submissions required under this subsection. In the case of all other subcontracts, the Contractor also agrees to include access to records as specified above in all his contracts. In addition, those records which relate to any dispute or litigation or the settlement of claims arising out of the performance of the Work, costs or items to which an audit exception has been taken, shall be maintained and made available for three years after the date of resolution of such dispute, appeal, litigation or claim. Contractor shall allow the Village to inspect and audit all data and records of the Contractor for work done pursuant to this Contract. The records shall be maintained and made available to the Village at reasonable times.

5. Correction of Work

- a.** If any errors, omissions or acts, intentional or negligent, are made by the Contractor, and its employees and its subcontractors, in performing the Work, the correction of which requires additional Work, the Contractor shall be required to perform such additional Work as may be necessary to remedy same without undue delay and without any cost to the Village.
- b.** In case of default by the Contractor, the Village may procure the services from other sources and may collect against the bond or surety for excess costs so paid or take any other action at law or equity in order to be made whole.

6. Contractor Representative

- a.** The Contractor shall designate a person who shall be available during normal business hours (Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.) and who shall serve as the Contractor's primary authorized representative during the performance of the Work. This "Representative" shall be readily available to respond to communications from the Village and shall be primarily responsible for performing the Work under the Contract.
- b.** The Representative shall receive requests from the Village to perform the Work and shall have full authority to execute the directions of the Village, without delay, and promptly supply any necessary labor, equipment or incidentals to do so.
- c.** The Contractor also shall provide the Village with the name and phone number of the Representative who, in the case of an off-hour's emergency, shall be readily accessible and available for quick response to perform an inspection request or a plan review. The Contractor shall immediately notify the Village in writing of any change in the identity and telephone number of the Representative. If the Representative fails to perform the Services to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works, or his/her designee, then the Contractor shall immediately replace the Representative with a new person with comparable experience and knowledge.

7. Compensation and Method of Payment

- a.** The Village agrees to pay for any requested, fully completed and accepted Work rendered by Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Prices (**Exhibit "1"**) attached to this Agreement.

- i.** The Contractor shall submit invoices to the Village upon project completion.
- ii.** The Village agrees to make payments to Contractor in compliance with the Local Government Prompt Payment Act (50 ILCS 505).
- iii.** The Schedule of Prices shall remain firm/fixed throughout the term of the Contract.
- b.** Contractor shall, at its sole cost, pay all other expenses related to the performance of this Contract and the Work, including, but not limited to, out-of-pocket expenses such as travel, printing, reproduction, mailing, insurance premiums, licensing fees, fuel, overhead, administrative costs, delivery charges, and all costs associated with the acquisition and maintenance of vehicles and equipment.
- c.** The amounts set forth in the Fee Schedule include all applicable federal, state and Village taxes of every kind and nature applicable to the Work, as well as all taxes, contributions and premiums for unemployment insurance, employment benefits or similar benefits, and all costs, royalties and fees arising from the use on, or the incorporation into, the Work, of patented or copyrighted equipment, materials, supplies, tools, appliances, devices, processes or inventions. All claims or rights to claim additional compensation by reason of the payment by Contractor of any such tax, contribution, premium, cost, royalty or fee are the sole responsibility of the Contractor, and any claim or demand from any person that the Village pay such taxes, contributions, premiums, costs, royalties or fees are waived and released and shall be indemnified by the Contractor.

8. Claims in Addition to Contract Amount

- a.** The Contractor is required to provide written notice to the Village of any claim for additional compensation as a result of action taken by the Village, within fifteen (15) calendar days after the occurrence of such action.
 - i.** The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that such written notice shall not be deemed or interpreted as entitling the Contractor to any additional compensation. Any changes to the compensation fixed in this Contract shall be valid only upon written amendment signed by both the Village and Contractor.
- b.** Regardless of the decision of the Village relative to a claim submitted by the Contractor, the Contractor shall proceed with all of the Work required to complete the Work under the Contract, as determined by the Village, without interruption or delay.
- c.** The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that in no event shall the Village be liable for any fees or costs incurred by the Contractor in connection with any Work provided by the Contractor that are outside of, or exceed, the scope of this Contract, regardless of whether such fees or costs are requested or directed by the Village, except upon the prior written consent of the Village.
- d.** When a change order is required, such an order must be approved by the Village prior to execution and comply with the requirements of Illinois law, including Section 33E-9 of the Criminal Code regulating change orders. 720 ILCS 5/33E-9 A written change order must be formally issued by the Village prior to commencing any additional work covered by such order. Work performed without proper authorization shall be at the Contractor's sole risk and expense.

9. Insurance Requirements

- a.** Contractor shall provide, for the duration of the Contract, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or property damage which may arise from or related to the performance of the Work by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees, or subcontractors.

- b.** The Contractor shall not commence work until the Contractor has provided all insurance required by the Contract. The Contractor shall purchase and maintain, throughout the duration of the contract, insurance as is appropriate for the work being performed and furnished and shall provide protection from claims which
 - c.** may arise out of or result from the Contractor's performance and furnishing of the Work and the Contractor's other obligations under the Contract documents, whether it is to be performed or furnished by the Contractor, by any subcontractor, by anyone directly or indirectly employed by them or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable.
 - d.** Insurance required by this Section shall be written with a company having at least an "A" Property-Casualty Rating, as listed in the most recent published A. M. Best's Insurance Guide.
 - e.** The Village shall be named as additional insured except for Workmen's Compensation insurance. The coverage afforded shall be primary and non-contributory for the additional insured with respect to claims arising out of operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor. If the additional insured has other insurance which is applicable to the loss, such as other insurance shall be on an excess or contingent basis. The amount of the Contractor's insurance company's liability under this insurance policy shall not be reduced by the existence of such other insurance.
 - f.** As a minimum, the Contractor shall secure and maintain the types of insurance as specified and herein, and shall submit evidence to the Village on an annual basis that the insurance coverages are in force. The form and limits of such insurance, together with the underwriter thereof in each case, shall be acceptable to the Village, but regardless of such acceptance it shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to maintain adequate insurance coverage until final payment and at all times thereafter when the Contractor may be correcting, removing, or replacing defective work in accordance with this Contract. Failure of the Contractor to maintain adequate coverage shall not relieve him of any contractual responsibility or obligation.
 - g.** The Contractor shall include with its bid, copies of the Certificates of Insurance with the coverages and limits specified.
 - h.** Insurance certificates and policies delivered to the Village shall recite that 45 days prior written notice will be given to the Village by certified mail, return receipt required, or by verified personal delivery, before any policy is materially changed, canceled, or not renewed.
 - i.** The Contractor shall include all subcontractors as a covered insured party under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.
 - j.** Any deductible amounts/requirements or any self-insured retention amounts of any of Contractor's policies or insurance must be disclosed to and approved by the Village in order to meet the insurance requirements herein. At the Village's direction, the Contractor's insurer must either reduce or eliminate the deductible or self-insured retention or Contractor must provide an appropriate bond securing payment of losses and related investigation, claim administration, and defense expenses of the Village.

10. Insurance Coverages

- a.** This insurance shall be written in Commercial General Liability form and shall protect the Contractor against all claims arising from injuries to persons or damages to property caused by any act or omission of the Contractor or his agents, employees or subcontractors. The Broad Form General Liability Endorsement shall be included.

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b. Satisfactory certificates of insurance shall be filed with the Village upon execution of the contract. The certificates shall state that thirty (30) days advance written notice will be given to the Village before any policy is changed or canceled.

c. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless the Village, its officers, employees and agents from any and all liability, losses or damages, including attorneys' fees and costs of defense, the Village may suffer as a result of claims, demands, suits, actions or proceedings of any kind or nature, including workers' compensation claims, in any way resulting from or arising out of the operations of the contractor under the contract. This shall include operations of subcontractors. The Contractor shall, at its own expense, appear, defend and pay all attorneys' fees and all costs and other expenses arising from or incurred in connection with such defense. If any judgments shall be rendered against the Village in any such action, the Contractor shall, at its own expense, satisfy and discharge same. The Contractor expressly understands and agrees that any bonds, letters of credit or insurance protection required by the Contract, or otherwise provided by the Contractor, shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, keep and save harmless and defend the Village. This indemnification does not apply to liability caused by the Village's own negligence, provided this does not serve to waive or adversely impact any of the Village's available protections or immunities under Illinois common or statutory law.

d. The Contractor agrees to assume the entire liability for all personal injury claims suffered by its own employees and waives any limitation of liability defense based upon the Worker's Compensation Act and cases decided there under. The Contractor agrees to indemnify and defend the Village and its Affiliates from and against all such loss, expense, damage or injury, including reasonable attorney fees, which the Village may sustain as a result of personal injury claims by the Contractor's employees, except to the extent those claims arise as a result of the Village's own negligence.

e. The Contractor agrees to defend and hold harmless the Village from and against all demands, claims, suits, costs, expenses, damages and adjustments based upon any infringement of any patent relating to goods specified in the contract, and on account of the Village's use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted, composition, trade secrets, secret process, proprietary rights, patented or unpatented invention, article or appliance furnished or used in the performance of the Work.

11. Payment and Performance Bonds

- a.** Contractors shall furnish a performance bond and a payment bond, (or a non-diminishing irrevocable bank letter of credit for contracts under \$100,000) within ten (10) calendar days after being notified that they are the successful bidder. The payment and performance bond shall secure the successful contractor obligations to complete this Contract and pay its labor and material suppliers as provide at 30 ILCS 550/1 and 2,
- b.** A performance bond and payment bond satisfactory to the Village, executed by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of Illinois, in an amount equal to one-hundred percent (100%) of the contract price as security for the faithful performance of the contract;
- c.** The surety on the bond shall be a company that is licensed by the Department of Insurance authorizing it to execute surety bonds and the company shall have a financial strength rating of at least A- as rated by A.M. Best Company, Inc., Moody's Investors Service, Standard & Poor's Corporation, or a similar rating agency. The bond shall be in that full amount to cover the cost of the completion of the Work, for the payment of material, apparatus, fixtures, and machinery used in the Work and for all labor performed in the Work, whether by subcontractor or otherwise.
- d.** Documents required by this section must be received and approved by the Village before a written contract will be issued.

12. Prevailing Wage

- a.** The Contractor shall pay prevailing wages to all workers, laborers and mechanics performing services required by the Contract, as required and in accordance with the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, as amended, including any changes in the prevailing wage during the term of the Contract. The Village has adopted the prevailing wages as determined by the Illinois Department of Labor ("IDOL") for Lake County, effective during this Contract, as revised. The prevailing rate of wages are revised by the IDOL and are available on the IDOL website, www.state.il.us/agency/idol. In the event that the IDOL should revise the prevailing rate of wages, then the revised rates shall apply to the Contract. In no case shall any revision in the rates of prevailing wages result in an increase in the total contract price. The Contractor shall also be fully responsible for meeting all requirements under the Prevailing Wage Act, including the requirement to provide a certified payroll. ***It is the obligation of the bidder to confirm with IDOL if the work to be performed requires the payment of prevailing wages.***

13. Independent Contractor Status

- a.** The Contractor's duties, role and responsibilities, and those of its employees or subcontractors, shall be solely those of an independent contractor for all purposes and no employee or agent of the Contractor shall be deemed for any reason to be an employee or agent of the Village. The Contractor is responsible for directing and controlling the performance and completion of the Work in a timely manner that meets the Village's requested schedule or completion date. No provision of this Bid Notice or subsequent conduct between the Village and Contractor shall be construed to create an "employer-employee," "principal and agent," "partners" or "participants in a joint venture" relationship or status. The Contractor, and its employees and its subcontractors, are responsible, pursuant to applicable law, for their own business operations, and for payment of any benefits, retirement plans, insurance, health plans, income and employment taxes or any other taxes of any kind arising from their receipt of compensation under this Contract.

14. Contract Termination

- a.** The term of this Contract shall be for one (1) year from the date of award.
- b.** In the event that this Contract is terminated, and provided that there is no dispute over the performance of any of the Work, the Contractor shall be paid for Work actually performed, if any, prior to the date of the notice of termination, not exceeding the value of the Work completed, which shall be determined on the basis of the rates set forth in the Fee Schedule.
- c.** Costs incurred by the Contractor subsequent to the receipt of any notice of termination and before the termination date will be reimbursed by the Village only if, prior to the effective termination date, the Village receives from the Contractor a list of actions that are necessary to perform and the Village agrees in writing that those actions be taken. The Contractor shall not be entitled to any claim for lost profits due to the termination of the Work by the Village.

15. Termination/Default

- a.** Any immediate threat to the public health or safety, or any repeated or multiple failures to complete the duties required by the Contract, or for violations of the Contract, whether for similar or differing issues, shall constitute the basis for immediate termination of the Contract.
- b.** If it should appear at any time that the Contractor has failed or refused to timely perform, or has delayed in the performance of the Work with diligence at a rate that assures completion of the Work in

full compliance with the requirements of this Contract, or has otherwise failed, refused or delayed to

perform the Work or any other requirement of this Contract ("Event of Default"), and fails to cure any such Event of Default within ten (10) business days after the Contractor's (and if required, the Surety) receipt of written notice of such Event of Default from the Village, then the Village shall have the right, without prejudice to any other remedies provided by law or equity, to pursue any one or more of the following remedies:

- i.** The Village may require the Contractor, within a reasonable time, to complete or correct all or any part of the Work that are the subject of the Event of Default; and to take any or all other action necessary to bring the Contractor and the Work into compliance with this Contract. Any costs and charges incurred by the Village, together with the cost of performing the required services shall be deducted from any monies due or which may become due to the Contractor under the Contract. When such Contractor default costs incurred by the Village exceeds the sum paid to the Village for the performance of the required Work under the Contract, the Contractor and the surety shall be jointly and severally liable and shall pay to the Village the full cost of such additional expenses.
- ii.** The Village may terminate this Contract without liability for further payment of amounts due or to become due under this Contract after the effective date of termination.
- iii.** The Village may withhold from any payment of, whether or not previously approved, or may recover from the Contractor, any and all costs, including attorney fees and administrative expenses, incurred by the Village as the result of any Event of Default by the Contractor or as a result of actions taken by the Village in response to any Event of Default by the Contractor.

16. Contractor Representations and Commitments

- a. The Contractor will comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, promulgated by any federal, state, local, or other governmental authority or regulatory body pertaining to all aspects of the Work, now in effect, or which may become in effect during the performance of the Work.
- b. The Contractor will comply with the Preference to Veterans Act, 330 ILCS 55, *et seq.*
- c. The Contractor will comply with the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1.101, *et seq* including, but not limited to establishment of sexual harassment policies and program and with the Fair Employment Commission's Rules and Regulations for Public Contracts, including requiring the provisions in any subcontracts. Contractor will comply with the provisions of the Equal Employment Opportunity Clause of the Illinois Department of Human Rights at Appendix A of Title 44, Part 750, Section 750 of the Illinois Administrative Code and the applicable Rules and Regulations for Public Contracts, and will include the provisions of this clause in every subcontract it awards as part of this Contract.
- d. The Contractor will comply with the requirements of the Drug Free Workplace Act if the Contract is \$5,000 or more, and it has more than 24 employees at the time of entering into the Contract pursuant to 30 ILCS 580, *et seq.* and applicable provisions of the Substance Abuse Prevention on Public Works Projects Act (820 ILCS 265).
- e. The Contractor will comply with the Illinois Public Works Employment Discrimination Act, 775 ILCS 10/1, *et seq.*
- f. The Contractor acknowledges the requirements of FOIA and agrees to comply with all requests made by the Village for public records (as that term is defined by Section 2(c) of FOIA) in the Contractor's possession.

17. Contractor Certifications

- a. By executing this Contract, the Contractor certifies neither it, nor any owner or officer, is barred from contracting with a unit of State or local government as a result of: (1) a delinquency in the payment of any tax administered by the Illinois Department of Revenue or any fee required by the Village, (unless lawfully contesting), 65 ILCS 5/11-42.1-1; or (2) a violation of either Section 33E-3 (bid rigging) or Section 33E-4 (bid rotating) of Article 33E of the Criminal Code of 1961, 720 ILCS 5/33E-1. The Contractor represents this Agreement is made without collusion with any other person, firm or corporation.

b. ADA Certification

The Contractor shall comply with the applicable provisions of the American Disabilities Act and its accompanying regulations (28 CFR 35.130) which prohibit discrimination against qualified individuals with disabilities by a local government, whether directly or through contractual arrangements, in the provision of any benefit, service, program or activity of the public entity. The Contractor certifies that by signing this Contract, that any services, programs and activities provided under this Contract are now and will continue to be in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

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c. Sexual Harassment Certificate

Contractor hereby certifies that it has a written sexual harassment policy in place in full compliance with 775 ILCS 5/2-105(A)(4) including the following information: 1. An acknowledgment of the illegality of sexual harassment. 2. The definition of sexual harassment under State law. 3. A description of sexual harassment, utilizing examples. 4. The Contractor's internal complaint process including penalties. 5. The legal recourse, investigative and complaint process available through the Illinois Department of Human Rights and the Human Rights Commission. 6. Directions on how to contact the Department of the Commission. 7. An acknowledgment of protection of a complaint against retaliation as provided in Section 6-101 of the Human Rights Act. The Contractor must provide a copy of such written policy to the Illinois Department of Human Rights upon request.

18. General Provisions

- a. No amendment or modification to this Agreement shall be effective until it is reduced to writing and approved and executed by both the Village and the Contractor.
- b. The Contractor shall give all notices, pay all fees and take all other action that may be necessary to ensure that the Work is provided, performed and completed in accordance with all required governmental permits, licenses, or other approvals and authorizations that may be required in connection with providing, performing and completing the Work.
- c. The Contractor shall not assign or transfer this Contract or any portion thereof without the prior approval of the Village.
- d. The terms of this Contract shall bind and inure to the benefit of the Village, the Contractor, and their agents, successors and assigns.
- e. No claim as a third-party beneficiary under this Contract by any person, firm or corporation shall be made or be valid against the Village.
- f. If any term, covenant, condition or provision of this Contract is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired or invalidated.
- g. For any legal action between the Parties concerning the interpretation, construction and enforcement of this Contract, or subject matter thereof, venue shall be in Lake County, Illinois and the laws of the State of Illinois shall govern the cause of action.
- h. The Contractor warrants and represents to the Village that the persons executing this Contract on its behalf have the full and complete right, power and authority to enter into this Contract and to agree to the terms, provisions and conditions set forth in this Contract, and that all legal actions needed to authorize the execution, delivery and performance of this Contract have been taken.

- i. The failure of the Village to enforce any term, condition or covenant (herein referred to as "provision") of this Contract shall not be deemed a waiver or limitation of the Village's right to subsequently enforce such provision.
- j. This Contract may be executed in counterparts, each of which, when executed, shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Issue: Replacement of the Mionske Sanitary Sewer Lift Station Control Panel

Background: The existing Mionske Lift Station was installed in 1996 replacing the original 1940's era lift station. The traffic enclosure has deteriorated and the controls are obsolete (reducing operational reliability) and are at the end of their useful life. To ensure lift station reliability, replacement of the traffic enclosure and control system is needed.

The Metropolitan Pump Company is the designated manufacturer for the Village's Duplex Sanitary Sewer Lift Station control systems and is the sole source vendor for the LMS-II PLC Logic controls that the Village has utilized in all of the previous lift station upgrades for standardization and to access the internet-based supervisory control and data acquisition (SCADA) monitoring and alarm system. This is the final location needing to upgrade the control system and will complete the standardization of all the Village Sanitary Sewer Lift Station control systems.

Analysis: Metropolitan Pump Company has provided a proposal for \$71,751 for manufacturing & installation of a replacement traffic cabinet and control system. Staff has been very satisfied with the quality of their previous work. This project is included in our Community Investment Plan and the FY 2024 Budget includes \$90,000 for improvements to the Mionske Lift station.

Village Strategic Plan: This agenda item is consistent with the following Goals and Objectives of the Strategic Plan.

- Infrastructure Investment
 - Develop a formalized, long-range sanitary sewer system improvement plan.

Recommendation: Acceptance of proposal from Metropolitan Pump Company for a replacement control panel at the Mionske Sanitary Sewer Lift Station for an amount not to exceed \$71,751.

Subject: Well No. 12 Repair Update

Issue: On December 4, 2023, the Village Board authorized an expenditure of \$131,481 for Layne Christensen Company to remove the pumping equipment from Well No. 12 for diagnosis after an electrical fault left the well inoperable. Evaluation of the pumping equipment was completed on February 15, 2024 which revealed the pump motor has failed and requires replacement. Staff has received a revised cost estimate from Layne Christensen Company which includes repairs, a replacement Byron Jackson pump motor and replacement submersible power cable for Well No. 12 and recommends approval of the proposal.

Village Strategic Plan: This agenda item is consistent with the following Goals and Objectives of the Strategic Plan.

- Goal: Infrastructure Investment:
 - Ensure a sustainable, healthy and economical water source for current and future Lake Zurich residents.

Background: Well No. 12 is one of five wells utilized to reliably meet daily water demand. Annually, one of the five wells are scheduled for preventative maintenance. In July 2023, scheduled routine maintenance was completed on the Well No. 12 pumping equipment by the Village's designated deep well contractor, Layne Christensen Company. Prior to this scheduled maintenance, the Well No. 12 pump motor had been operating normally and did not exhibit loss of performance or distress. During the scheduled maintenance, the pump motor was inspected, tested, serviced (no warranty for service), was considered suitable for reuse and returned to

service. Late in October 2023, Well No. 12 experienced an electrical fault leaving it inoperable and out of service.

On September 6, 2022, the Village Board approved a renewal of our five-year professional services agreement with Layne Christensen Company, a sole-source provider of Byron Jackson parts and service in Illinois. All five Village wells utilize Byron Jackson pumping equipment.

Analysis: The Village's designated deep well contractor, Layne Christensen Company, has determined the Well No. 12 pump motor to be non-repairable requiring replacement and has provided a revised cost estimate to include removal and inspection of the pumping assembly from the well (already completed), a Type M Byron Jackson exchange motor for the Byron Jackson pump assembly utilized at Well No. 12, repair of the pump (damaged by the motor failure), televising the well, column pipe rehabilitation (from the disassembly), removal of down-hole obstructions, reinstallation and pump testing for \$292,925. Replacement of the original 28-year-old submersible power cable is an additional \$31,800 totaling \$324,725. An increase of \$193,244 from what was previously authorized. To date, \$48,703 has been spent to remove the pumping equipment from the well and diagnose the extent of the failure. The cost estimate does include a labor & specialty service discount as defined in our five-year professional services agreement with Layne Christensen Company.

Currently, Well No. 12 is one of our facilities necessary to reliably meet daily water demand and will remain necessary for back-up purposes after our water supply change to Lake Michigan from CLCJAWA.

Recommendation: Accept the revised cost estimate from Layne Christensen Company and authorize a change order not to exceed an additional \$203,244 (\$193,244 + \$10,000 contingency) for the purchase of a Byron Jackson Type M exchange motor to replace the failed well pump motor, complete the necessary repairs to the Well No. 12 pumping equipment, removal of down-hole obstructions, replacement of the submersible power cable and reinstallation.




Bowl Assembly Observations

This bowl assembly was rebuilt and reinstalled in 2023. The motor failed from what appeared to be a massive electrical surge. This theory is further substantiated by the deep pitting found on the stainless shaft and stainless collets and are in poor condition. The cast iron castings are in great condition. One bushing exceeds acceptable tolerance. Wear ring clearances exceed normal tolerance but are very similar to 2023 rebuild when it was decided not to install new wear rings due to the pump's history of heavy iron build up. Reference attached Bowl Assembly Inspection Report.

Bowl Assembly Recommendations

Replace impeller shaft, collets, and one intermediate bushing.

COMMENTS: All impellers are in good condition. All cases have great exterior condition. Interior of all cases are in great condition. Impeller shaft is in poor condition with pitting throughout. Pump contains bronze wear rings. Note that this pump is set up for use with 17" motor and 10" discharge. There is a 4' stainless steel pup installed and the pipe coupling is ok for reuse as is. We recommend replacement of the one intermediate bushing that is .013" clearance (all other bushings ok as is with polish). The clearances of the impellers to wear rings are very similar to the last time we rebuilt this pump (2022) and the customer elected not to have us true impellers and replace rings due to the large amount of iron we found in the pump.

The 10" T&C Line Pipe was racked on site and inspected with API calibrated gauges. Ten male end threads and one coupling thread were determined to be questionable and brought to the Layne yard for further examination and possible repairs.

Pipe Recommendations

Repair threads as necessary, i.e. possible Cut and Thread, Chase, replace coupling

Hypot test power cable with Byron Jackson Flat-Cable attached. Leakage values are quite low and cable appears suitable for reuse. However, note that reinstallation means cable as tested on spool above ground will be flexed over cable sheaves, squeezed against pipe by stainless steel banding and will be subject to possible down-hole damage, as well as significant hydrostatic pressure. Hypot testing may not detect leakage to atmosphere. (i.e. external holes in cable insulation).

Well Observations

The well's total depth was measured at 1354' with a weighted wire line. This compares with the original total depth of 1359' and a wire line measurement of 1354' in 2017. As the well has a history of loose formation and bridging in the 1130' area, the well is scheduled for a TV survey.

The well was televised on 2/28/2024.

Static water level was recorded at 620'.

The bottom of the casing was recorded at 553'.

As had been noted in previous TV surveys of this well, there are large caverns, with loose formation from 1078' to 1084'. A rock is protruding into the well at 1081'. At this point, the camera's centralizing guides could not proceed beyond the protruding rock. The camera was retrieved to the surface, the centralizer diameter was reduced, and the survey was continued.

The top of the 18" liner was recorded at 1128'.

Rock debris is obstructing the 18" liner at 1275', just above the bottom of the liner.

During the 2022 repair, an obstruction was observed at 1084'. The obstruction was removed by running a steel rail and knocking it down hole. This latest survey indicates that there is more loose material, in the cavern zone from 1078' to 1084', capable of caving into the well. This zone is also where the bowl assembly sits. It is speculation, but the most recent collapse through this area may have contributed to the motor's failure.

Run rail to attempt to knock obstruction to bottom of well.

Set pump 20' shorter to remove bowl and motor from caving zone.





Subject: **Chalet Park Facility Emergency Repairs**

Issue: The Paulus Park Chalet has been closed for program use due to extensive repairs to the sanitary service. The repair requires partial demolition and replacement of interior plumbing, flooring, walls, and the replacement of the sanitary lift station servicing the facility. The facility will continue to be unavailable until the completion of this work creating the potential for interruption of scheduled summer programs, activities, and camp.

Background: The Chalet was originally intended as a seasonal amenity for winter event events taking place on and around the lake. The facility is now home to multiple recreation programs offered by the Village including summer camp activities. The plumbing is original to the building construction including a single pump lift station used to transfer waste to the south end of the park. On February 12, 2024, the Chalet experienced a sewer back-up inside the building causing significant damage. Staff began an extensive investigation into the potential cause of the incident. Power rodding, mapping, and televising of the entire system revealed that fittings used to connect the infrastructure are causing an improper flow rate and direction of waste within the system.

Analysis: Staff prepared a comprehensive scope to include the following.

1. Removal and replacement of all existing underground infrastructure located within the concrete flooring.
2. Removal and replacement of all supply lines located within the floor, ceiling, and walls.
3. Removal and replacement of the existing lift station including the addition of a dual pump system with remote notification capabilities.
4. Removal and replacement of the bathroom partitions.
5. Restoration, including the painting of the interior of the facility.

Proposals were solicited from vendors capable of performing the repairs/replacements. On-site visits were conducted with vendors and staff received proposals for both the plumbing and restoration. The flooring restoration will be proposed as an allowance as the final restoration is unknown at this time.

A summary of the proposed project costs is provided below:

Recommendation: Due to the facilities high use levels, staff is recommending the competitive bid process be waived in an effort to expedite the repairs and return it to service as quickly as possible. Authorize the project total to complete the necessary repairs in an amount not to exceed \$55,291.00.



Any agreement for paint removal by chemical, hand sanding or power sanding will be billed to the owner/customer on a time and materials basis.
16. Any window glazing work to be performed hereunder includes only the removal or loose or unsound glazing and the reglazing of those areas. Additionally, this agreement does not include the painting or repainting of any areas of a storm, or trim, which has previously had a factory baked finish applied. In addition, customer is responsible for removal and replacement of storm windows. This includes triple track storm windows/screens/inserts.
17. When painting of a room is included hereunder, such work does not include painting or other services to the side of the door or frame of a room, which faces the outside of the room, unless otherwise specified herein. Additionally, exterior work hereunder does not include painting or any other services to the interior of closets, unless specifically set forth herein.
18. Otherwise specified in the contract, one finish coat of paint will be applied to all surfaces. Two or more coats are sometimes required to provide even coverage, and such coats are not always evident prior to completion of the work. Contractor will not be liable for any damage to property, but will upon request of the owner/customer apply additional coats for an additional agreed upon price. If contract states, apply materials "until full coverage is achieved", this means one coat if full coverage was achieved in one coat, or up to, two, but not to exceed two finish coats at no additional charge if one coat did not cover.
19. Upon completion of the exterior work by contractor, owner/customer may request a "walk through", a punch list shall be prepared of all touch up work to be completed. The owner/customer and the contractor or their authorized agents must sign the punch list prior to the commencement of the work on the list. All work, other than that included on the punch list, shall be deemed completed and accepted as satisfactory to the owner/customer. The contractor will be responsible for performing any other services to complete the punch list as required by the other, that were set forth in the punch list.
20. Contractor shall have the right to cancel his contract and immediately work hereunder, or collect payment in full from customer prior to continuing work. If he determines that there is uncertainty about any payment due under his contract he will be liable when due, or, should determine that an error has been made in computing the cost of completing the work.
21. The parties agree that no material representations of any kind, other than those, which encompass the written terms of this contract, have been made to them. This written agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and neither party is bound to, or by oral representations made by any party, the other.
22. The contractor is not responsible for labor or materials furnished by the owner/customer or anyone working under the direction of the owner/customer, and any loss or additional work that results shall be the responsibility of the owner/customer.
23. The parties agree that no action arising from, or related to the contract, or to the performance shall commence by either party within more than two years after the completion or cessation of the work hereunder. This limitation applies to all action of any character, whether at law or in equity, and whether sounding in contract, tort or otherwise, except actions by the contractor to enforce any mechanic lien. In addition, owner/customer hereby waives his rights to all notices under existing Mechanic Lien.
24. Owner/customer agrees to pay contractor his regular price for all additions, alterations or deviation from the contract for any completion process commenced to recover any portion of amounts owing to the contractor under the terms of this contract. If contractor sues to enforce any of the terms of this agreement, owner/customer agrees that any judgment rendered in favor of the contractor shall include court costs, attorney's fees and expenses, and all other expenses of suit. Owner/customer further agrees to indemnify the contractor for any completion process commenced to recover any portion of amounts owing to the contractor under the terms of this contract, or for any negligence or for any other cause of action arising out of the contractor. Obligation or work performed or actions taken hereunder shall be limited to the fees paid to the contractor hereunder. Owner/customer further agrees to indemnify and hold contractor hold harmless against any claims or causes of actions brought on by third parties relation to the work encompassed hereunder.
25. Preparation of the surfaces includes priming of bare surfaces only, including wood, metal, plaster, and drywall. Matching compound surfaces where such surfaces are bare. Furthermore, such priming of bare surfaces will only be performed if required by the finish coat manufacturer's recommendations.
26. The work specified in the contract does not include painting of any surfaces that are varnished or stained or have a natural wood finish unless otherwise specified herein.
27. The contractor will be responsible for any taxes to be applied. At the owner/customer's request, contractor will provide color sheets, samples, or charts of any color, texture, shade or hue to be used under this contract for approval or disapproval of the owner/customer. If the owner/customer does not so request, contractor is authorized to apply manufacturer's standard colors, textures, shades and hues as identified in the manufacturer's catalog, and shall not be responsible for any cost of color if owner/customer has not previously identified a choice of color in writing by name, number, and manufacturer. Additionally, the contractor is not responsible for illusory variation between color chart and the actual paint material. If owner desires to change the color during the course of the work upon proper execution of a change order form and written agreement to pay the additional charges for such work, including the additional labor and materials required.
28. The type, latex, epoxy or alkyd/oil based, color, sheen and brand of the paint shall be chosen by the contractor unless otherwise agreed herein.
29. The parties agree that the contractor makes, and the owner/customer receives from contractor, no warranties, either express or implied, or otherwise, for any paint or other materials used for a particular purpose or otherwise. The only warranties to owner/customer are those, which may be provided by the manufacturer of the products and materials used in completion of the work, unless otherwise specified herein.
30. The time during which the contractor is delayed in his work by (a) the acts of the owner/customer or his agents or employees or those claiming rights by agreement with or grant of title to owner/customer, or by (b) the acts of third parties, which contractor could not reasonably control or prevent, or by (c) strikes, lockouts or other obstructive actions by employees or labor organizations and which are beyond the control of the contractor and which he cannot reasonably control, or by (e) extra work requested by the owner/customer, or by (f) failure of the owner/customer to pay for extra work requested or reasonable price and schedule based on project, shall be added to the time for completion by a fair and reasonable allowance.
31. Contractor shall, at his own expense carry all workers' compensation insurance and public liability insurance necessary for full protection of the contractor and owner/customer during the progress of the work. Certificates of insurance shall be filed with the owner/customer if owner/customer so requires.
32. Owner/customer grants contractor and contractor's employees and subcontractors the right to enter premises during all daylight hours from Monday through Saturday during the course of the work hereunder, unless otherwise specified.
33. The owner/customer is solely responsible for providing contractor, prior to commencement of work, with water, electricity and refuse removal at the job site as may be required by the contractor to carry out this contract. Owner/customer shall be liable for any damage to the property of contractor or his employees during the course of the work, at the completion of the work. Equipment shall be stored by the contractor on the premises in an acceptable storage location for the duration of the work. Owner/customer is responsible for the disposal of all empty paint cans, rubbish and building materials and agrees contractor is not responsible for the disposal of any paint cans, rubbish and building materials.
34. Contractor will be entitled to immediate payment in full when work described in this contract has been performed. Contractor is not obligated to do any work or perform any service except as expressly provided in the agreement. If, after the contract has declared the work completed, owner/customer claims that work remains to be done, owner/customer agrees to make immediate payment of the full contract price less only that amount necessary for contractor to purchase the materials needed to complete the work. Contractor shall be entitled to payment of the remaining contract price.
35. Contractor has the right to subcontract any part, or all, of the work herein agreed to be performed.
36. Owner/customer grants contractor to the right to display signs and advertising at the building site until all work is completed, and to use the trade name and trade name of the contractor for advertising purposes.

39. Owner/customer agrees to install and connect at owner/customer's cost, such utilities and make such improvements in addition to the work covered by this contract as may be required by public authority prior to completion of the work by the contractor.
40. Contract makes no provision concerning reductions in fuel costs or durability of materials as a result of work performed.
41. If any term of this contract is found to be unenforceable, the remaining terms and conditions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.
42. Any owner/customer or agent of owner/customer, who solicits a contractor's employee or subcontractor for work that is beyond the scope of this contract, must do so only under the company's name. During the performance of this contract, and subsequently for a six month period following completion of the project, owner/customer shall not hire any direct or indirect solicitation or attempt to hire any of our employees or subcontractors to perform work on an individual basis will cause owner/customer to be liable to contractor due damages of at least \$1,000,000.
43. Contractor cannot be held responsible for any damage that are reported to contractor more than 30 days after contractor has declared the project completed. In the event contractor is found to be responsible for damages, contractor will be liable for any damages or hire competent tradesmen to do so. Contractor will not be liable for any loss or damage.
44. Interior exterior window cleaning or cleaning of any surface other than those described in this contract is not the responsibility of the contractor, unless such surfaces are specified herein. Furthermore, if contractor is performing cleaning to exterior surfaces or interior surfaces, as may be required as part of the terms of the contract, then adjacent surfaces may be sputtered with paint during the course of the work. This is especially probable, when contractor washing exterior surfaces. Owner/customer agrees to be responsible for cleaning any windows or other surfaces not specified with this contract, or owner/customer may pay an additional charge to the contractor for such additional work.
45. Should contractor violate the painting of one side only, in place, unless otherwise specified in writing, if owner/customer requests contractor will remove shutters, paint backside, and attempt to reinstall the shutters for an additional charge. However, contractor is not responsible for damaged shutters, which are rotten, or in a deteriorated condition, or for failure to reinstall shutters in a deteriorated substrate.
46. Owner/customer agrees to keep the exterior of the building during painting.
47. Owner/customer hereby authorizes contractor to obtain a consumer credit and/or investigative report on owner/customer. Owner/Contractor understands that such information may be derived in whole or in part from TRW, Equifax, TransUnion, and/or CIC. If owner/customer enters in a corporation or other type of company, contractor will obtain information from the appropriate state or national bureau. In the event owner/customer agrees to provide contractor with a completed Authorization for File Disclosure for which includes the owner/customer's Social Security number, or a corporation or other type of company's federal identification number. If the owner/customer does not complete the Authorization for File Disclosure form at the request of the contractor, the contractor may stop work and keep job idle until such information is forthcoming from the owner/customer.
48. Any surplus materials left over after this contract has been completed are the property of the contractor and will be removed by same. No credit is due to owner/customer on returns for any surplus materials because this contract is based upon a complete job. All salvage resulting from work under this contract is the property of the contractor.
49. Customer and contractor agree to abide by the standards set forth by the Painting and Decorating Contractors of America (PCA).
50. Owner/customer agrees to allow contractor to provide owner/customer's name, address and phone number to potential prospects who might wish to check contractor's references.
51. This contract supersedes any specification that may have been provided by the owner/customer, even if this contract states the contract will be performed as per owner/customer's specification herein. Any specification provided by the customer will be used for the purpose of establishing a general guideline only for working procedures to be followed by contractor and customer. If any terms and conditions from the specification provided by the customer conflict with the terms and conditions of this contract, then the terms and conditions of this contract will predominate. Arising out of contractor obligation or work performed or actions taken hereunder shall be limited to the fees paid to the contractor hereunder. Owner/customer further agrees to indemnify and hold contractor hold harmless against any claims or causes of action arising out of the work performed.
52. Paint Platoon USA Co. guarantees that any paint job should fail due to improper workmanship within a 2-year period from the date of completion, then Paint Platoon USA Co. shall repaint those failing areas at no charge to the customer. This includes all surfaces, with the exception of metal surface, brick, or porch decks and other surfaces with a guarantee against failure for a period of 1 year and one day from date of completion. Paint Platoon USA Co. does not guarantee that paint will fail on areas where damage was caused by water, rotted wood or rusted metal. Furthermore, Paint Platoon USA Co. does not consider normal wear and tear paint failure.
53. This contract is subject to approval by Paint Platoon USA Co. management. If contract not approved by Paint Platoon USA Co. management, then contractor is not obligated to perform any work contained herein.



Subject: **Referendum & Lake Michigan Project Communications**

Issue: Village staff is seeking outside assistance in reaching stakeholders (residents, businesses and property owners) in the creation of informative communications on the referendum to increase the non-home rule sales tax rate by 0.5% that will appear on the November 5th ballot.

Analysis: The upcoming non-home rule sales tax referendum provides an opportunity to mitigate the authorized 5-year utility rate increases necessary to fund the conversion to Lake Michigan Water. Residents will decide if the 40% of non-resident shoppers that frequent Lake Zurich retailers should assist in paying for this essential and necessary quality-of-life change to the Village's water supply.

Staff will be using our existing digital communication tools, website, Benchmarks, Facebook, Instagram, Nextdoor and Twitter to provide information to the community. Staff has also solicited proposals from CDM Smith, Vicarious Multimedia and Teska Associates for assistance in crafting uniform messaging to strengthen connections to the community. Proposals were received from CDM Smith and Vicarious Multimedia along with a decline to propose from Teska Associates.

After carefully considering each proposal, staff is recommending Vicarious Multimedia to enhance internal efforts in a multichannel, multimedia public information and community engagement campaign. Their deliverables include content & strategy planning, digital content creation, printed mailing materials, public meeting materials and video scripting that leverage the Village's existing communication channels.

Recommendation: Staff is seeking approval to engage Vicarious Multimedia and their sister company St. Steven Public Relations for referendum communications starting on April 15th through November 5th for an amount not to exceed \$30,000.
