E. Waiver of Competitive Bid Process and Approval of Agreement with Layne Christensen Company for Repairs to Well No. 9 in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$117,855

Summary: Well No. 9 is one of the five wells currently used and needed to reliably meet the Village's peak water demand and fire flow emergencies. A pump test was conducted on September 25, 2024 and indicated a 40% decline in well production from the previous pump test conducted in 2022. Due to timing of this unplanned repair, staff recommend to authorize the phase 1 proposal from Layne Christensen for inspection and diagnosis of the pumping equipment in the amount not-to-exceed \$117,855.

7. TRUTH-IN-TAXATION PUBLIC HEARING FOR 2024 PROPERTY TAX LEVY (Mayor Poynton)

Summary: The total proposed increase to the Village of Lake Zurich property tax levy for 2024 represents an 5.1% increase over the previous year, which brings the total levy to \$11,453,097. In accordance with State statutes, the Village is holding this Truth-in-Taxation Public Hearing in order for residents to have the opportunity to comment on the proposed levy.

The hearing notice was published on October 28, 2024 in the Daily Herald, as well as posted on the Village website and in the official Village newsletter Benchmarks.

Recommended Action #1: A motion to open the Truth-in-Taxation Public Hearing for the 2024 Property Tax Levy and receive into the record public comment.

8. NEW BUSINESS

This agenda item includes matters coming to the Board of Trustees for discussion and possible action.

A. Property Tax Levy Extension Ordinance and Three Abatement Ordinances Regarding Debt Services (Trustee Riley)

Summary: Each year, the Village Board approves a tax levy ordinance to certify with the Lake County Clerk's Office in order to extend property taxes on real estate parcels within Lake Zurich municipal boundaries. The 2024 levy request is based upon the estimated equalized assessed value (EAV) of those properties, as determined by the Elia Township Assessor's Office and the Chief County Assessor's Office. The 2024 levy request is collected in fiscal year 2025.

Applying the rates authorized by the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (PTELL), the Village is requesting a total levy of \$11,453,097 which represents an increase of 5.10% over the previous year. The tax levy request for 2024 includes \$1,389,406 for debt service and \$5,518,200 for the Police and Fire Pension Funds. The proposed levy also includes \$400,000 for the Special Recreational Area, which provides funding for accessible improvements and services.

Three ordinances totaling \$19,875,000 regarding debt service abatements are also presented for Village Board action. As sufficient funds are available from other revenue sources to pay scheduled debt service payments as they become due, the need to extend a property tax levy on these issues is not warranted. Therefore, the Village will notify the County Clerk to not extend property taxes on these abatement ordinances.

Recommended Action #1: A motion to approve Ordinance #2024-11-591 authorizing the 2024 Property Tax Levy Extension in the Amount of \$11,453,097.

B. Discussion on Lake Zurich Waste Hauling Contract (Trustee Spacone)

Summary: Prairieland Disposal began service to Lake Zurich residents in September 2020. Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS), based out of Morton Grove, took over service in October 2021 after acquisition of Prairieland. The current Village franchise agreement for waste hauling services with LRS expires August 31, 2025.

LRS provides weekly refuse and recycling collection, which includes one bulk item per week. Also included in the monthly cost is yard waste collection with a 15-bag weekly limit, with no stickers required for yard waste collection. LRS also provides curbside leaf vacuuming for 8-weeks each autumn included in the monthly price, as well as an annual curbside collection event for electronics waste and two weeks of Christmas tree collection.

LRS proposes an 8% price increase in Year 1 to the current rates effective September 1, 2025 and a fixed 4% price increase each of the following 4 years. An 8% increase in Year 1 would result in most residents seeing an increase of \$2.16 per month. Senior citizens would see an increase of \$1.94 per month.

An alternative proposal without leaf vacuuming is currently being calculated by LRS and can be discussed as an option.

Autumn 2024 is the time to decide if Lake Zurich wants to explore switching garbage companies again or proceed with a contract extension with LRS. This item is brought to the Village Board tonight for discussion and consideration, with no Village Board action requested at this point. LRS representatives will be here to discuss the companies' recent growth, plans for future improvements, and its proposed contract extension with Lake Zurich.

Recommended Action: No Village Board action requested at this point. This item is for discussion purposes only.

 - Summary:** Lake Zurich's three-year fireworks contract with J & M Displays has expired. Staff evaluated different options for over the lake including a laser show, drone show and fireworks display. The Village in the past has released a request for proposals which has yielded limited responses. Continuing with

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a multi-year contract provides the community with consistency, expectations and cost savings. Staff recommends awarding a three-year contract for the July Fourth fireworks display to J & M Displays in the amount not-to-exceed \$42,500 per year.

E. Resolution for Road Closures for Lake Zurich Triathlon RES. #2024-10-089

Summary: The Lake Zurich Triathlon has been approved by the Village Board and is scheduled for Sunday, July 13, 2025 at Paulus Park. The proposed resolution authorizes a request to the Illinois Department of Transportation to close a portion of Route 22 and Route 12 from the hours of 6 am to 1 pm on July 13, 2025.

F. Public Works Trackless Vehicle Purchase in the Amount Not-to-Exceed \$180,000

Summary: The Public Works Department clears approximately 21 miles of sidewalks during snow events. In order to gain efficiency with sidewalk snow removal, the Community Investment Plan has included the addition of a trackless vehicle in 2025. This unit is built specifically for sidewalk snow removal and right-of-way maintenance. Staff recommends the purchase of a Trackless MT7 through the HGACBUY Purchasing Cooperative in the amount not-to-exceed \$180,000.

7. NEW BUSINESS

Fire Pension Municipal Compliance Report and Tax Levy Request

Summary: The Village of Lake Zurich has a well-funded Fire Pension Fund that offers financial security to public safety personnel during retirement. Offering a solid pension plan is crucial for retaining skilled firefighter-paramedics and encourages a long-term commitment to the profession.

The Illinois Pension Code requires the Village levy a tax each year to meet the actuarial requirements of the Fire Pension Fund. The Lake Zurich Fire Pension Board is requesting a tax levy in the amount of \$3,013,176 for the Village Board to consider. Last year, the Fire Pension Board requested a levy of \$2,842,641 and the actual levy was \$2,659,901. The Fire Pension Fund is now 72.06% funded, an increase of 0.27% on an actuarial value from last year's status of 71.79% funded.

Recommended Action: No Village Board action request at this point. This tax levy is for informational purposes only.

B. Police Pension Municipal Compliance Report and Tax Levy Request

Summary: The Village of Lake Zurich takes seriously its commitment to properly fund public safety pensions as a way to attract and retain talent and to show our commitment to public safety personnel. A well-funded pension system like the one in Lake Zurich provides for the fair treatment of police officers and their retirement benefits.

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The Illinois Pension Code requires the Village to levy a tax each year to meet the actuarial requirements of the Police Pension Fund. The Lake Zurich Police Pension Board requests a tax levy in the amount of \$2,509,796 for the Village Board to consider. Last year, the Police Pension Board requested a levy of \$2,305,938 and the actual levy was the same amount. The Police Pension Fund is now 58.4% funded, an increase of 0.1% on an actuarial value from last year's status of 58.3% funded.

Recommended Action: No Village Board action requested at this point. This tax levy request is for discussion purposes only.

Summary: This agenda item is consideration and action on an ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$1,346,000 Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds (Limited Tax), Series 2025, of the Village, for the purpose of refunding certain outstanding general obligation alternate bonds of said Village and paying the expenses incident thereto, providing for the levy and collection of a direct annual tax for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and authorizing the sale of said bonds to the purchaser thereof.

Finance Dir. Amy Sparkowski addressed the Board on this bond.

- D. **Ordinance Amending Section 1-4-2 of Chapter 4 and Section 1-5-6 of Chapter 5 of Title 1 of the Village of Lake Zurich Municipal Code to Amend the Compensation of Elected Officials** ORD. #2024-10-588

Summary: The provided Ordinance amends the Lake Zurich Village Code to make inflationary adjustments to the salaries for the Village President, Trustees and Village Clerk. The salaries for these positions were last adjusted in 2009, placing them well behind both the rate of inflation since then and the compensation of elected officials in comparable suburban communities.

If approved, the salaries of the Village President and the Village Trustees would be set at \$12,000 and \$6,000, respectively. The Village Clerk's salary would be set at \$7,000. In accordance with state statute, these changes would

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take effect for the Village President, Clerk and the three Trustee terms starting in May 2025. The new salary would then apply at the start of the other three Trustee terms beginning in May 2027.

Recommended Action: A motion was made by Trustee Sugrue, seconded by Trustee Euker, to approve Ordinance #2024-10-588 Amending Section 1-4-2 of Chapter 4 and Section 1-5-6 of Chapter 5 of Title 1, of the Village of Lake Zurich Municipal Code to Amend the Compensation of Elected Officials.

E. Discussion on Lake Zurich Waste Hauling Contract

Summary: Prairieland Disposal began service to Lake Zurich residents in September 2020. Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS), based out of Morton Grove, took over service in October 2021 after acquisition of Prairieland. The current Village franchise agreement for waste hauling services with LRS expires August 31, 2025.

LRS provides weekly refuse and recycling collection, which includes one bulk item per week. Also included in the monthly cost is yard waste collection with a 15-bag weekly limit, with no stickers required for yard waste collection. LRS also provides curbside leaf vacuuming for 8-weeks each autumn included in the monthly price, as well as an annual curbside collection event for electronics waste and two weeks of Christmas tree collection.

LRS has grown tremendously in the last four years as a national waste hauling company and has experienced the typical growing pains that come from rapid growth. The Village recognizes there have been complaints from residents regarding the quality of the LRS fleet of trucks as well as occasional customer service issues from its Rosemont call center.

The contract rates when LRS began service in 2021 were fixed at a 3.5% price increase per year from 2021 through 2024. With inflation rates for labor, fuel, and disposal tipping fees increasing between 5% - 8% per year during this same time frame, LRS as a company is struggling to keep profitable municipal contracts.

As such, LRS proposes an 8% price increase in Year 1 to the current rates effective September 1, 2025 and a fixed 4% price increase each of the following 4 years. An 8% increase in Year 1 would result in most residents seeing an increase of \$2.16 per month. Senior citizens would see an increase of \$1.94 per month.

Autumn 2024 is the time to decide if Lake Zurich wants to explore switching garbage companies again or proceed with a contract extension with LRS. This item is brought to the Village Board tonight for discussion and consideration, with no Village Board action requested at this point.

Management Services Kyle Kordell gave background information and shared a handout of comparisons with other towns along with past and current bidding. Dir. Kordell answered the Board's questions about going out to bid, other towns in the current contract, one year extension, and a request to have LRS appear at a future Board meeting.

The property shall be sold "as is."

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.

Issue: Water production from Well No. 9 has been declining for several months based on facility flow meter data. Recently, the decline increased significantly initiating a request to the Village's designated deep well contractor, Layne Christensen Company, to perform a pump test to confirm the data. A pump test was conducted on September 25, 2024 and indicated well production at 739 gallons per minute, a 40% decline (508 gallons per minute) from the previous pump test conducted in 2022 after routine pump maintenance was performed. As a precaution (to try to minimize repair costs), the well has been taken out of service and in order to determine cause, the pumping equipment will need to be removed (pulled) from the well for evaluation.

Background: Well No. 9 is one of five wells we currently utilize and will be needed in order to reliably meet the Village's peak water demand and fire flow emergencies until we transition to a Lake Michigan water supply. In April 2022, scheduled preventative maintenance and a pump test was completed at Well No. 9 by the Village's designated deep well contractor, Layne Christensen Company. The pump test indicated well production at 1247 gallons per minute. In early June 2024, facility flow meters indicated a slight decline of 7% (90 gallons per minute) of water production compared to the 2022 pump test but the decline has recently increased to 40% (508 gallons per minute) based on the most recent pump test indicating a significant deficiency with the well pumping equipment.

On September 6, 2022, the Village Board approved a renewal of our five-year professional services agreement with Layne Christensen Company, a sole-source provider of Byron Jackson parts and service in Illinois. All five Village wells utilize Byron Jackson pumping equipment.

Analysis: Layne Christensen Company has provided a partial (Phase 1) cost estimate for Well No. 9 which includes mobilization, pulling, disassembly, transportation, cleaning, motor service, cable testing, televising and reinstallation for \$117,855. A phase 2 cost estimate for necessary repairs will be provided after inspection of the removed pumping equipment. Cost estimates do include a labor & specialty service discount as defined in our five-year professional services agreement with Layne Christensen Company. Due to the timing of this unplanned repair, it is anticipated that part of the costs will be accounted for in the current FY 2024 budget (from reserves) and the remainder will be accounted for in the upcoming FY 2025 budget which includes funds of \$75,000 to cover this expense.

Village Strategic Plan: This agenda item is consistent with the following Goals and Objectives of the Strategic Plan.

- Infrastructure Investment: Ensure a sustainable, healthy and economical water source for current and future Lake Zurich residents.

Recommendation: Authorize Layne Christensen Company to remove the pumping equipment from Well No. 9 for inspection and diagnosis and accept the phase 1 proposal from Layne Christensen Company for an amount not to exceed \$117,855. A phase 2 cost estimate and updated project totals will be provided after inspection and diagnosis for board approval.

Mr. Schmitt:

Given Village reports that Well 9 had lost production per water plant meters, Layne tested the pump to waste on September 25. A copy of the test results are attached. Production is very low. Operating amps are also lower than normal. With respect to the possibility that the low production is due to a developing hole in the column pipe, Layne recommends taking the pump off-line until it can be removed and inspected to resolve the issue.

If contracted, Layne will perform the work on a time and material basis per the attached Work Order Form and will follow the terms and conditions of our Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with the Village. The estimates in this letter include the PSA stipulated 5% deduct applied toward labor and 10% deduct applied toward special services.

Layne recommends a Phase I scope of work to include:

- Mobilize and remove pump, rack pump onsite
- Perform a visual inspection of pump components on site with a Lake Zurich representative(s) and our Pump Foreman.
- Haul the Byron Jackson bowl assembly, Byron Jackson motor, column pipe, and cable to our Aurora yard for disassembly, clean up, inspection, and Pump Inspection Report.
- Perform a shop motor service on the motor if it is found to be electrically and mechanically sound
- Hypot test the #2 cable
- Replace flat cable motor link.
- Televis the well.
- Return to site, reinstall pump and test after necessary component repairs.

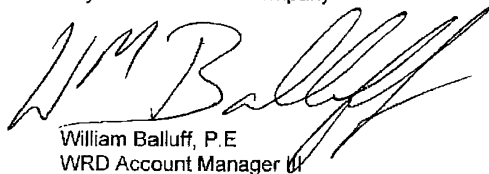

- III. The property taxes extended for debt service for 2023 were \$1,343,964. The estimated property taxes to be levied for debt service for 2024 are \$1,389,406. This represents a 3.38% increase over the previous year.
- IV. The total property taxes extended for 2023 were \$10,897,577. The estimated total property tax to be levied for 2024 is \$11,453,097. This represents an 5.10% increase over the previous year.

*8a***Issue:**

By statute, the Village is required to pass an ordinance each year for the annual property tax levy and any necessary abatement ordinances. The 2024 tax levy will be used to fund operations for fiscal year 2025 (January – December 2025). Details as to the 2024 levy are provided below, as well as an attached ordinance for Village Board consideration.

Analysis:Truth in Taxation

As the proposed property tax levy for 2024 will exceed 105% of the actual 2023 property tax extensions, the Village is required to hold a Truth in Taxation Public Hearing on the proposed property tax levy. The total proposed change to the levy is 5.10%. Staff will hold a Truth in Taxation Hearing on November 4, 2024 where the public has a chance to comment on the proposed increase. The hearing notice was published Monday, October 28, 2024.

Property Tax Levy - Summary

The Village is a non-home rule municipality that is subject to the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (PTELL) as dictated by the State. The statute limits the increase in the amount of property taxes extended (for capped funds) to the lesser of the annual change in the applicable Consumer Price Index or 5%. The components subjects to the "cap" include Ambulance Service, Corporate Levy, Fire Protection, Firefighter Pension, Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF), Police Pension and Police Protection. The 3.4% increase allowable under PTELL is applied to the

existing extension base from the 2023 levy of the same capped components, increasing the allowable levy by about \$307k.

In addition, the Village is allowed to “capture” the increase in the equalized assessed valuation (EAV) of the Village that is attributable to new construction. Estimated new Equalized Assessed Value (EAV) for the village from new property is about \$14 million, bringing in another roughly \$126k in taxes. Exhibit A of the attached ordinance summarizes the proposed levy calculations and impact of the CPI and new construction on total property tax extensions.

Distribution

Based on the estimated levy amount, the components of the levy are forecasted to change as shown in the chart below.

The line items for police and fire protection levy amounts represent only a fraction of the actual expenditures for public safety for the village. A large amount of the levies for ambulance service and IMRF pension were allocated into the Police and Fire Pension line items to help meet pension funding requirements. Total IMRF expense included in the 2025 budget is \$450k. Outside of the public safety pension line items, the capped items are combined into a single line on the tax bills, so the taxpayers are unaffected by any shift between the other lines.

Three components of the property tax levy are not subject to the caps of PTELL: Debt Service, Special Recreation and a small portion of the Firefighters’ Pension contribution. As the village abates the majority of bond payments, only about 12% of the tax bill for the village is attributable to debt service. For 2024, only one issuance remains, the 2025 short-term issuance. Special

Recreation is levied at \$400,000, an increase from 2023, to accommodate the special needs of the community. The special recreation levy allows for services such as interpreters for park programs and improvements to facilities and parks for accessibility so that all patrons can partake in the opportunities and programs. Last is the uncapped portion of the Firefighters' Pension contribution. Per Public Act 93-0689, the increase in pension amounts attributable to spouses and children of deceased firefighters is not subject to the PTELL cap. For this levy, the amount equates to about \$150k; the remainder of the firefighters' pension levy falls in to the capped portion of the levy.

Pension Funds

As required by state statute, the village has retained the services of enrolled actuaries to determine the annual contribution requirement for both pension funds. This is the seventh year using services from Foster and Foster. They have prepared reports for both pension funds. No assumption changes were made from the previous year.

The Village's statutory required funding for the **Police Pension Fund** for this year is \$2,068,921. For the proposed 2024 levy, the Foster and Foster recommended amount is \$2,509,796, an increase of \$224k from the 2023 extension. Staff feels it would be prudent and fiscally beneficial to maintain funding by accepting the recommended amount. With the funding requirement for the 2024 levy, the funding level for the Police Pension Fund decreases from 58.4% to 58.1%.

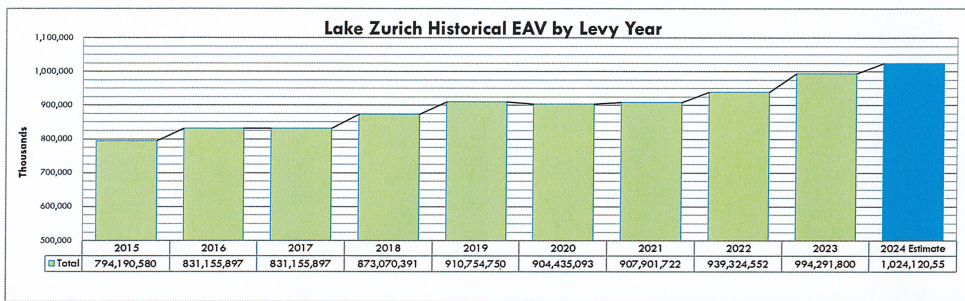
The 2024 levy request for the Police Pension Fund contains a proposed levy of **\$2,509,796**. This amount matches the amount requested by the Police Pension Fund, which utilizes the same report from Foster and Foster for their annual reporting.

The statutorily required funding for the **Firefighters' Pension Fund** this year is \$2,302,394. For the proposed 2024 levy, the Foster and Foster recommended amount is \$3,008,404. This is an increase of \$370k from the 2023 extension. With the funding requirement for the 2024 levy, the funding level for the Firefighters' Pension Fund decreases from 70.4% to 68.5%.

For the Firefighters' Pension Fund, the 2024 levy request contains a proposed levy of **\$3,008,404**. The Firefighters' Pension Fund has chosen, similar to prior years, to retain their own actuary and has submitted their request for funding based on a recommendation from Lauterbach and Amen of \$3,013,176. As Foster and Foster's report represents the village's official actuary report, the village will fund \$3.0 million as identified in Foster and Foster's report.

EAV Change

The taxable EAV is currently estimated to increase from \$994,291,800 to \$1,024,120,554, a total increase of 3.0%. This increase is based on a conservative review of preliminary data from Lake County and the Assessor. While the EAV for 2024 will not be finalized for a few months, the estimate provides a reasonable guide at this point. The following graphic shows the past nine (9) years of EAV by category and an additional year showing the estimate EAV for 2024.



Household Impact

It is impossible to predict the exact impact on households, as there are varying factors which can affect each homeowner. One example is EAV changes. While the total EAV of the village is estimated to increase, some homeowners may experience a decrease in value. Another factor is exemptions, such as the homeowner exemption or senior exemption, which affect the taxable EAV. A home with a market value of \$383,850, and no other changes could expect about a \$43 annual increase to the Village for the 2024 levy.

SSA's

Also included is a summary of the levies for the Special Service Areas (SSA's) within the village for the 2024 levy year. The active SSA's are #8, #9, #10, and #13. The SSA's have been filed with the County for levying each year, so no separate ordinance is required.

Abatements

Four (3) ordinances totaling \$2,146,408 regarding debt service abatements are also being presented to the board for consideration. When the bond issuances were filed with the county, they included provisions for levying the funds necessary to make the debt service payments. These debt service obligations were all issued with the intent of payments being made from Tax Increment Financing (TIF) incremental revenues or water and sewer revenues. The recommended ordinances will notify the county clerk NOT to levy for these debt payments. The issuances to be abated total \$2,037,107.50 for TIF and \$109,300 for water, specifically:

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-11-591

ANNUAL TAX LEVY ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake Zurich, County of Lake and State of Illinois, will on December 2, 2024 consider approval and adoption of the Budget for said Village for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025 the amount of said budget being the aggregate sum of \$91,157,828; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lake Zurich have ascertained that the total amount of appropriations budgeted for in 2025 and amounts deemed necessary to defray additional expenses and liabilities for all corporate purposes to be provided for by the tax levy for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2025 and ending December 31, 2025 amounts to \$10,063,691; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Lake Zurich acknowledge that for accounting purposes the total amount received from the tax levy shall be recognized as revenue during the fiscal year that begins on January 1, 2025 and ends on December 31, 2025, and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees properly noticed and conducted, on November 4, 2024, a public hearing on the proposed tax levy, all in accordance with the requirements of the Illinois Truth-In-Taxation Act, Illinois Compiled Statutes Ch. 35, §215 et seq.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LAKE ZURICH, LAKE COUNTY AND STATE OF ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance as findings of the President and Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Tax levy. There shall be and is hereby levied on all taxable property within the corporate limits of said Village for the fiscal year commencing

January 1, 2025 and ending December 31, 2025, the sum of \$9,513,271 for General Corporate purposes, and the sum of \$550,420 for special purposes, making a combined levy of \$10,063,691 as set forth in the attached Exhibit A, which Exhibit A is by this reference hereby fully incorporated into and made a part of this ordinance.

Section 3. Unexpended Balance. Any unexpended balance of any item or items levied in and by this Ordinance may be expended in making up any deficiency in any items under the same general budget and levy for the same general purpose.

Section 4. Filing with County Clerk. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this Ordinance, with the County Clerk of Lake County, Illinois, prior to December 24, 2024, and in accordance with law, so that said tax may be extended and collected according to law.

Section 5. Severability. Should any clause, sentence, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or of any part of this ordinance other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately on, and after, its passage by two-thirds of all Corporate Authorities now holding office and approval, the corporate authorities hereby finding and declaring that the matters contained herein are matters of urgency. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to immediately cause this Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.
