1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by Sean Gallagher at 6:33 PM.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – September 18, 2024

MOTION to approve the meeting minutes of September 18, 2024 made by Sean Gallagher, seconded by Corey Frank.

3. OLD BUSINESS

- **Proposal to amend ordinance to allow for the operation of golf carts, ATVs, and UTVs, on certain village roadways.**
- Jan Yglesias presented her proposal to amend the village ordinance to allow golf carts, ATVs, and UTVs to operate on certain roadways in the village. Jan Yglesias presented a map of the village showing which roads the operation of these vehicles would be authorized or unauthorized. Jan Yglesias shared her thoughts on how the village and the residents would benefit from allowing the operation of these vehicles.
- Sean Gallagher believed the layout of the village is not conducive to the safe operation of these types of vehicles. He was concerned of the extra costs to the village and the additional enforcement issues these vehicles will create for the police department. His biggest concern was the safety of the operator and passengers of these vehicles.
- Tony Grunder noted Lake Zurich is split by many major roadways. There are many non-accessible areas based on the proposal or from a traffic safety standpoint. He was also concerned with these vehicles crossing Route 22 due to the roadway's vehicle volume and speed limit.
- Roger Sugrue noted that due to the village being separated by major roadways, not all residents would benefit from the allowance of these vehicles. He also had concerns regarding the safety of the operator and passengers of these vehicles while operating on roadways. Roger Sugrue said these vehicles might work in other villages but he did not believe they would be good for a community like Lake Zurich. He recommended Jan Yglesias present her proposal at a Village Board Meeting to gauge the interest of other residents and solicit feedback.

- Corey Frank noted there would be additional costs to the village if the proposal was approved. The village would have to post signs throughout the village.
- Jan Yglesias advised she was willing to amend her proposal based on the feedback from the CPAC members.

MOTION to table this matter until the March meeting was made by Sean Gallagher, seconded by Corey Frank.
