1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by Laurie Stutzman at 6:34 PM.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – June 18, 2025

MOTION to approve the meeting minutes of June 18, 2025 was made by Mike Brown, seconded by Roger Sugrue.

3. OLD BUSINESS

- **Proposal to restrict parking to one side only on Ensell Road between Factor and Capital Drive.**
- Sergeant Bereza restated a proposal, initially presented at the March 19th meeting, to restrict parking on one side of Ensell Road due to the traffic safety concerns.
- Director Brown advised the Public Works Department would need to collaborate with the Police Department to figure out the logistics of sign placement, timing of the deployment, and future enforcement aspects if the proposal is approved.

MOTION to recommend this proposal was made by Eric Bereza, seconded by Corey Frank.
Voice votes: No objection. MOTION CARRIED

- **Proposal to restrict parking to one side only on Brittany Road between Old Mill Grove Road and Timberwood Drive.**
- Sergeant Bereza restated a proposal, initially presented at the March 19th meeting, to restrict parking on one side of Brittany Road due to the concerns of resident, Heather Wooden.
- Director Brown stated he would like to give an opportunity to the residents of the area to voice their opinions on the proposed parking restriction. Director Brown recommended sending a mailer to the residents of the area to inform them of the proposal and request they appear at the next CPAC meeting.

- Joe Ozanic still supports the parking restriction and believes it would be safer as no pedestrians would have to cross Brittany Road as no vehicles would be parked on the north side of the roadway.

MOTION to table this matter until the December CPAC meeting was made by Roger Sugrue, seconded by Corey Frank.

Voice votes: No objection. MOTION CARRIED
