1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Jim Schultz at 7:03 PM

Present were Chairperson Jim Schultz, and members William Benson, Commander David Bradstreet, Mike Brown, General Services Superintendent, Trustee Tom Poynton, John Ridgeway and Sergeant Tracey Goodyear.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES, October 13, 2010

MOTION was made by Michael Brown, seconded by Tom Poynton, to approve the meeting minutes of October 13, 2010.

3. OLD BUSINESS

A. Traffic Issues (Concorde Village)

At the August 10, 2010 meeting the residents indicated the following problems along June Terrace:

- Excessive traffic volume
- Excessive speed
- Blind corner on June Terrace at Rosehall Drive
- Sidewalks not extended to COSTCO
- Association would like business owners to seal coat the bike path
- Poor numbering system for Concorde Village
- Traffic sign missing from median of Rte. 22 / June Terrace

The following solutions were discussed:

- *Crosswalks at one or both Rosehall intersections
- * Review signage
- * Extension of sidewalk to COSTCO
- * Stripe the roadway
- * Review bus stops with District 95

The following solutions or resolutions were provided to the residents:

- ❖ Lights at The Home Depot and COSTCO are within code
- ❖ Dan Petersen is reviewing a land survey to determine responsibility for the upkeep of the bike path
- ❖ Sidewalk extension-The lot is currently for sale by the Village and it may be possible to create an easement when it is sold by the Village. The

matter should be forwarded to Village Administrator Bob Vitas for further review.

- ❖ Signs- The June Terrace and Slow Children Playing signs have been erected by Public Works. There will not be a sign erected to indicate no left turn from June Terrace onto Rte. 22 at June Terrace.
- ❖ Residents were informed that a new numbering system in the CAD software will make it easier to locate their homes.

yes MOTION was made by David Bradstreet, seconded by Bill Benson to forward to the Village Board a recommendation to install a crosswalk on June Terrace at Rosehall and to install "Stop for Pedestrian" signs as well in the spring. Voice vote, AYES have it. MOTION CARRIED

B. Lucerne Traffic Issues-Super Wal-Mart traffic impact

Residents of Lucerne are concerned the Wal-Mart expansion will create the following problems:

- Increased vehicle traffic on Pheasant Ridge Road
- Emergency vehicles use of Pheasant Ridge as a "cut through"
- Speeding vehicles on Pheasant Ridge Road
- Vehicles disregarding the stop sign
- Vehicles driving the wrong way on Pheasant Ridge at Sears
- Increased traffic will lead to safety issued for children who live and play in the area

The Fidelity Group indicated Pheasant Ridge is an access point to Deerpath Court and it must remain open for the businesses to remain viable.

MOTION was made by David Bradstreet, seconded by John Ridgeway to table the matter until the March 2011 meeting so that a traffic study can be completed by the Traffic Safety Unit. Voice vote, AYES have it. MOTION CARRIED

4. NEW BUSINESS

A. Lake Street- Removal of parking by permit signs


5. ADJOURNMENT
