Public Hearing to consider the request for a Map Amendment to rezone the subject property from O-2 Limited Office District to B-1 Local and Community Business District, and a Variation of the minimum lot size of the subject property.

Applicant: Timothy Seifert of Timothy Grant Jewelers, Ltd.

Timothy Seifert, representing Timothy Grant Jewelry, presented their proposal to move their business from 927 S. Rand Road, Lake Zurich, to 155 N. Rand Road into an existing building. He described the proposed changes to the windows to change from a residential look to a more commercial look. Mr. Seifert said there are three additional parking spaces than were listed by the Police Department. The average number of customers per day are about 18 except for the Christmas season. He did a traffic study and found an equal number of customers are now coming from the north and the south so the new location access will be similar. He does not have any issues with staff's recommendation on landscaping and expressed a willingness to work with staff on any other issues.

E. 300 East Route 22 - Self Storage (PZC 2016-08 #2):

Public Hearing to consider a request for a Special Use Permit for self-storage warehousing (SIC #4225) in the existing "I" Industrial District at the subject property.

Applicant: Steve Schwartz of 300 Main Street LZ LLC

Cal Bernstein, attorney for the property owner, said that U-Haul had withdrawn their proposal for the Subject Property and Steve Schwartz, developer and principal for 300 Main Street, LZ, LLC, now proposes to operate a self-storage facility at this location. Life Storage is proposing an arrangement with Ancient Graffiti, who currently occupies the building, where Ancient Graffiti will operate out of the northern part of the building until 2018 while Life Storage occupies and operates within the southern half of the building (Exhibit D.3). He said this application does not include rental or storage of trucks.

Mr. Schwartz introduced his staff and narrated a PowerPoint presentation showing site, aerial, landscape, signage, and photometric plans as well as elevations. He also discussed access (both access and egress on Route 22 with one-way exit on the east side), dock, gate, improved landscaping on the Buesching Road elevation, removal of the existing water tower and pump-

ing station, and installation of a new fire suppression system in late 2018. Mr. Schwartz clarified that the south half will have a new fire suppression installed right away and the north half will be installed in the third or fourth quarter of 2018. The hours of operation with staffing will be Monday through Friday 9 - 6 p.m., Saturday 8:30 - 5 or 6 p.m., and Sunday 9:30 -5 p.m. but users can access their units from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. using a keypad. Mr. Schwartz answered questions posed by the PZC including phasing of the project, hours of access for renters, internal traffic flow, and traffic statistics. He intends to address any outstanding issues related to engineering. Liza stated they anticipate between 10-15 customers per weekday and 15-20 on the weekend with fewer visits in the winter. Mr. Schwartz met with Kelly Fraiser, manager of The Landings, and said she was pleased with the plan.

2. The paved area to the east of the building must be sufficiently screened so as to create a visual barrier from East Route 22. Failure of the Applicant to abide by this restriction will be grounds for rescission of the Special Use Permit.

F. Amendments to the Text of Title 9 of the Village Municipal Code (PZC 2016-08 #3):

Public Hearing to consider the request for a Text Amendment to amend the requirements for Courtesy Review - specifically Subsection 9-18-2B entitled "Preliminary Consideration by Board of Trustees".

Director Saher summarized his memorandum dated August 4, 2016, that presents staff's recommendation that would modify the requirement for Courtesy Review to make it an option as opposed to a requirement, which would allow certain projects to go directly to the PZC review process without going before the Village Board first. The Village Board, petitioner, or staff could request that the project have a Courtesy Review. Discussion followed.

Trustee Jeff Halen said the Village Board discussed this item at length at their recent meeting. He does not support the change because the Courtesy Review process allows the community a greater opportunity to become aware of items and to participate in discussions and provides a valuable service to the Board. He stated examples of projects where helpful discussion took place early in the process and involved the community. Trustee Halen said the change would remove a layer of transparency for everyone except staff and short change the residents.

Chairman Stratton said there is an excellent working relationship between the PZC and staff, and he is comfortable that appropriate discussion between staff and the developer have and

would take. He is confident that staff would require all areas of concern to be addressed before the item appears before the PZC. He observed that the residents have access to the same information the PZC members have via the website. The change would only impact proposed amendments to the Zoning Map and Zoning Code (Map and Text Amendments).

Director Saher said staff reports to the Board weekly and keeps them apprised of upcoming items that will come before the Board and the PZC. He listed other methods that staff uses regularly to communicate with the Board and the residents in a timely basis on proposed projects.
