Forgot how to log-in?

Did you forget how to log into our park and recreation registration system? It's easy to log in and register for classes or make payments! Here's how! Go to **lakezurich.org**. Hover over 'services' and when 'register for on line programs' pops up under services, click on that link. Then click on 'log in' and put in your user name and password. If you forgot this information please call our office at 847-438-5146x0 and we are happy reset the information so you can log in. You are now on the main registration page and can look up classes, register and make payments. Easy as 1, 2, 3!

Registration Procedures

- Registration form needs a signature for credit card charges and waiver.
- The first fee listed is the **resident** cost and the second fee listed is the **non-resident** cost. (**FEE R/NR**)
- Faxed in or dropped off registrations will be confirmed with an emailed receipt. Submission of registration does not guarantee enrollment in a class.
- If you do not receive a call, you are enrolled in your 1st choice selected.
- Make checks payable to the **Village of Lake Zurich**.
- Visa and MasterCard credit card charges available for Mail In/Online/Fax/Drop Off and In Person registrations. Discover card payments are only available for online registrations.
- \$25.00 charge for checks returned due to nonsufficient funds (NSF).

Who is a Resident of Lake Zurich?

A resident is defined as one whose "principal residence" is within the corporate limits of the Village of Lake Zurich.

Proof of Lake Zurich Residency

In order to ensure that all program participants are charged equitably, we have instituted a proof of residency process. All Lake Zurich existing households and new households will receive resident rates by providing proof of residency. Proof of residency is only necessary for first time registrants to the program or if residency status has changed. Resident households need to provide two of the following:

- Drivers License or State Photo ID and,
- Real Estate Tax Bill or current utility bill, or
- Proof of residency, recent real estate closing or rental agreement may be submitted either in person at Paulus Park Barn, 200 South Rand Road, Monday-Friday 8:30am-4pm or faxed to (847) 380-5471 and all copies will be destroyed after confirmation.

Register Online

Who can register online?

Residents and non-residents may register online. However, to receive resident rates, you must provide proof of residency.

Which programs are eligible for online registration?

All programs that have a code number assigned.

How do I activate my online account?

Existing households within our system will be issued a temporary User Name and Password. Upon your first time to log-in, you will be prompted to change your password and answer two security questions. New households need to complete the online enrollment form. Confirmation of your enrollment will be emailed to you within one business day. Upon approval from parks and recreation (as we will need to confirm your residency), you may begin registering for programs. The first time you log on, you will be prompted to change your password if you would like to do so.

What else can I do online?

You can browse all programs offered and view up-to-date enrollment numbers. If you are registered for a program that offers a multiple payment schedule, you may pay your outstanding balance online under your "Household Account". You also have the ability to review all the programs for which you have registered, reprint receipts/invoices, print out activity calendars and childcare statements.

Can I be placed on the wait list online and do I have to pay for it?

You can be placed on the wait list online and you will not be charged for the program at that time. We will contact you if we can enroll you and at that time you will be required to pay for the program.

Can I process a refund or class transfer online?

Refunds and transfers cannot be processed online but you may contact us at **847-438-5146** or stop by our office at The Paulus Park Barn to fill out a refund/transfer request form.

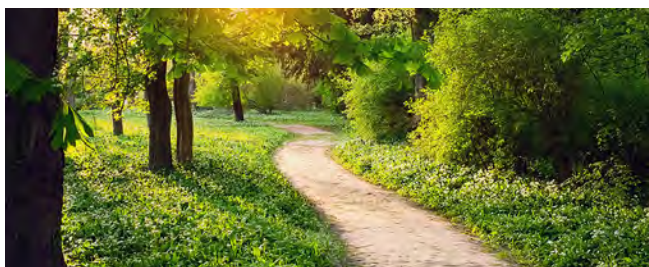
Prickly, Parasitic and Poisonous

- Panfish = +1/2 inch
- Bass, Northern, Muskie, Walleye = +1/2 inch

Facility Reservations

Whether it is a birthday party, reunion, business meeting or just a family get together, the Village of Lake Zurich has a variety of facility rentals for all occasions: Paulus Park Barn, Buffalo Creek and the Chalet.

Facility rentals and reservations must be made in person at the Paulus Park Barn during the office hours of 8:30am-4pm by individuals at least 21 years of age who agrees to remain on-site and assume responsibility during the use period. Payment in full and all paperwork must be completed upon making your reservation.

■ A \$150 refundable security deposit is required for all facility rentals.

■ Upon booking for 6 hours, receive an additional 2 hours complimentary; only available for all day, early morning rentals.

Shelter Reservations

All shelters in the Village of Lake Zurich are available for reservations: Paulus Park, Braemar, Bristol Trails, Chestnut Corner/Hunters Creek, Manor, Oak Ridge, Old Mill Grove, and Staples. If reserving shelters, you will need to pay the shelter fee below to guarantee a reservation otherwise the shelters are available free of use on a first come, first serve basis.

Shelters may be reserved until 8pm. There is an outdoor charcoal grill adjacent to each of the shelters, but you will need to bring your own charcoal (extra charcoal grills are permitted).

■ Residents can submit their shelter reservations for the 2021 year as of January 1st. As of February 1st, reservations are open to nonresidents.

Rental Rules and Regulations

Upon reserving, you will receive a complete list of rules. Please be advised of the following:

- Renter may only access the facility/shelter during their reserved time.
- Full rental payment must be received at the time of your reservation.
- All materials/decorations brought into room/shelter must be removed.
- No individuals or groups may use the Village of Lake Zurich's facilities with the purpose of private monetary gain or fundraising without special permission from the Director of Recreation.
- All hired services must be approved prior to rental date, including catering, entertainment, etc. Bouncy houses are required to be staked down and renter will need to contact JULIE (a month prior).
- Sheltered pavilion rentals include 5 picnic tables at Paulus Park only. Any additional picnic tables must be brought in or you can use unused tables around the park. Facility rentals include 8 tables and 50 chairs. Additional chair/table needs for facility rentals must be supplied by the renter.

Group Size Limits/Picnic Permits

- The maximum group size limit is the number provided on your application.
- If you have a group larger than 100, you will need to submit a Special Events Request to be reviewed by the Park Advisory and Village Boards. Please see our office staff for further information.
- The Village of Lake Zurich will continue to follow all of the CDC and Governor Pritzker's Executive Orders including, but not limited to, group sizes.

Rental Cancellation & Refund Policy

- If cancellation is made within 15 days notice of the rental date, the full amount of the rental fee will be refunded less a 10% service charge (minimum \$5, maximum \$15).
- If cancellation is made with less than 15 days notice, the Park and Recreation Department will retain the rental fee; this includes reservations made less than 15 days from the rental date.

Beach & Spray Ground Rules

- Swimming is permitted only when Lifeguards are on duty and only in the designated beach swimming areas. Lifeguards retain final authority.
- Same day re-entry to the Paulus Park Beach & Sprayground is allowed with proof of prior entry (wristband, receipt, etc.).
- Pier access at Paulus Park Beach is permitted by authorized personnel only.
- Swimmers must stay within the roped off beach area.
- Non-swimmers using floatation devices must be accompanied by an adult in the water at all times. Floatation devices may be banned at the discretion of the Beach Manager.
- Athletic games or sports must be conducted in designated areas and not upon the bathing beach or in the water, where injury or inconvenience to others might result.
- Roughhousing, shoulder play and rope play are prohibited.
- No throwing sand or seaweed.
- No diving allowed.
- Food and beverages are permitted in the beach area but not in the water. Food is not permitted in the sprayground. Alcohol is not permitted within the beach areas.
- Smoking is prohibited in the beach areas.
- Children under the age of 11 must be accompanied by a person 16 years of age or older.
- For safety reasons, do not access if you are pregnant, have neck or back issues.
- The lake water is not suitable for drinking. It is recommended swimmers shower and towel dry after leaving the water.
- All infants must wear tight fitting rubber or plastic pants. All swimmers must wear proper swimwear. No street clothes while swimming.
- Persons under the influence of alcohol or exhibiting erratic behavior are not permitted in the beach area.
- Admission to the beach may be refused to all persons suspected to have contagious diseases or infectious conditions.
- Staff has the right to restrict behavior of patrons.
- No pets allowed. Licensed service dogs are exempt.
- Glass containers are not permitted on the beach or playground.
- Use receptacles provided for trash, charcoal, and recycling.
- No strollers permitted on the beach or in the Spray Ground area; please use designated stroller parking area outside of the beach.
- We will be testing our lifeguards skills with simulated situations randomly during regular hours of operation at both Breezewald & Paulus Parks. Some of these situations may require evacuation of the water. If we interrupt your time at our beaches please be patient as this is for your safety. Thank you for your understanding.
- Safety break rest periods for ages 17 and under are on the hour daily for everyone's safety. Additional rest periods may be run depending on the temperature.

Non-Power Watercraft Access – Residents Only

Lake Zurich **residents only** have the opportunity to launch non-motorized watercrafts from Paulus Park. Watercrafts include: Kayaks, Canoes, Paddle Boats, Windsurfers, Row Boats, Long Boards, etc. Inflatable water crafts are not permitted. All water crafts must be able to be carried down to the water as there is no launch nor driving in Paulus Park. All watercrafts need to stay in the No Wake area of Lake Zurich, wear a PFD, carry a whistle for emergencies, and review the rules of the lake. Daily usage permits for non-power watercraft access cost \$5 and are available at the Barn during normal business hours, Monday-Friday, 8:30am-4pm, or at Paulus Park Beach during their listed hours of operation. Daily permits are required and boating violators are subject to fines.

Wibit Inflatable Rules

- Wibit Inflatables at Paulus Park will be available for use only with lifeguards present during the regular season between the hours of 12-5pm pending weather, attendance and maintenance of the structures.
- Prior to use, participants must sign a waiver upon entry to the beach (not applicable for program participants or beach pass users).
- For swimmers only. Participants must pass a deep water swim test to use the Wibits. Deep water swim test includes swimming 25 continuous yards and treading water for 30 seconds.
- Participants must be 7 years of age or older. Not suitable for ages under 7.
- Each inflatable allows for a maximum number of individuals. A maximum of 50 participants will be allowed to use the entire structure for a limited amount of time.
- Issued USCG approved life jackets must be worn at all times while using the inflatables.
- Swimming under the inflatable is not permitted.
- Do not jump onto the inflatable from other objects.
- No diving or sliding head first.
- Parents or guardians must supervise children during use.
- Remove necklaces, watches, rings or other sharp items before use.
- For safety reasons, do not access if you are pregnant.
- Be respectful of all users and give priority to younger and smaller children.
- The inflatables are not designated as a rescue float and do not offer protection against drowning.
- To avoid dangers, it is imperative that you follow the instructions of the Lifeguard.

Welcome to our swim lessons program! Our trained and certified lifeguard staff will teach your child a valuable life lesson in learning to swim in a fun, safe environment.

- Learn to Swim classes will be 45 minutes long.

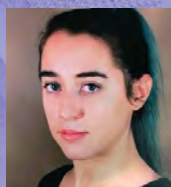

How to register for Summer Camp

Participant Emergency Information Packet

New this Summer we are utilizing a program called CampDoc. All registration forms will be done online prior to the camp season beginning. 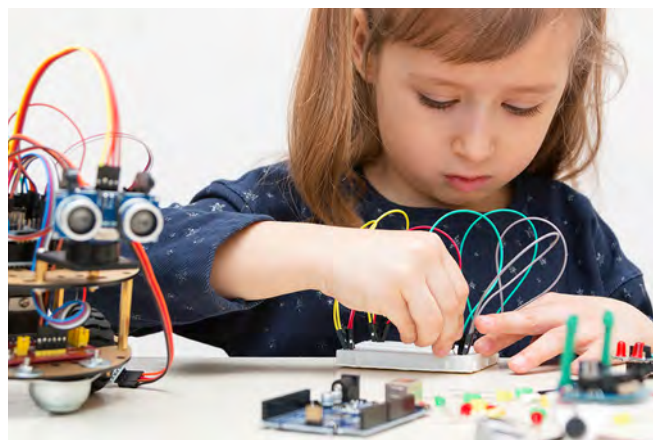

NEW! Program COVID Policies and Procedures:

We strive to make our programs as safe as possible for your learning experience, but we need your help! Please make sure you read all sections of this very carefully, as many of our policies and procedures have changed. As we all know, this situation seems to be ever changing and evolving, and our policies and procedures will change and evolve as needed. By adhering to the following guidelines we will reduce unnecessary risk and potential exposure to COVID.

- 1) I will not bring non-registered children or additional adults to class during my registered child's class time in order to maintain class size limits; parents or guardians should wait in their vehicle during class time.
- 2) I will not bring my child/children to class if they or I knowingly am visibly ill or have a temperature above 100.4 degrees or have come in contact with someone who is COVID-19 positive. We reserve the right to send a child home that displays signs of COVID-19.
- 3) I agree to wear a mask covering nose and mouth at all times inside the classroom and understand all persons over the age of 3 will be required to also wear a mask covering the nose and mouth at all times within the classroom;

- 4) I will maintain a six-foot distance from other class participants, and will encourage my child to remain with me during class times for the safety of my family as well as the other families in class;
- 5) I will use the restroom for hand washing or hand sanitizers upon coming in the door of the classroom, and continue to apply it to myself or my family in the event of eye, nose or mouth contact; and I understand the park and recreation department may require my and my child/children's temperature to be taken prior to being allowed to enter the classroom and participate in in-person classes;
- 6) No food or drink will be allowed into the building.
- 7) The Village of Lake Zurich will continue to follow all of the CDC and Governor Pritzker's Executive Orders including, but not limited to, group sizes.

Please also note that our facilities are cleaned on a nightly basis by a professional cleaning crew. Every instructor will disinfect their utilized spaces before and after every use by themselves and their participants.

Cancellation/Refund Satisfaction Policy

No refunds will be given after the program has held a third class, except for medical reasons which preclude participation, or a change of residence out of the area, at which time a pro-rated refund will be issued.

Please note that this guarantee does not apply to trips, one day classes, beach admission, or food and beverages.

Classes may be cancelled due to low enrollment. We may alter the class to service the needs of our participants. We reserve the right to cancel, postpone, combine classes, or change instructors as needed. Refunds will be offered if a class is cancelled or closed by the Department.

Code of Conduct

All individuals on Park Department property and in Park Department programs are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times. All individuals shall:

- Show respect to participants/staff/others, and take directions from staff.
- Refrain from using abusive or foul language.
- Refrain from causing bodily harm to self, participants, others or staff.
- Show respect to equipment, supplies, and facilities.

Individuals who do not conform to this Code of Conduct will be subject to suspension from the program or dismissal depending on the frequency, nature and severity of any infraction, including immediate dismissal, all to be determined at the discretion of the Director of Recreation.

Anti-Discrimination Policy

The Village of Lake Zurich Park and Recreation Department does not discriminate against any person participating in Park Department programs, activities, or services on the basis of sex, race, religion or cultural background.

Improper Speech and Conduct

No person shall use any abusive, threatening, indecent, profane, or obscene language, or language calculated to occasion a breach of the peace, not be guilty of any indecent act or behavior in the Park System.

Smoking Policy

There is no smoking allowed inside of or within 15 feet of any Park and Recreation facility.

Alcohol Policy

Alcohol is not permitted in any park or facility. Special procedures, application and fees are required for special use and/or rental. For more information, go to lakezurich.org.

Accident Coverage

The Village of Lake Zurich does not cover participants in recreational programs with accident insurance.

Use of Cellular Phones in Park Department Facilities

- To ensure privacy to the patrons of the Village of Lake Zurich Park and Recreation Department in certain areas such as locker rooms and washrooms, the following policy regarding cell phones has been implemented. Since it is difficult to determine at a glance which phone has photo capabilities, this policy will affect ALL cellular phone usage in these areas.
- The Village of Lake Zurich Park and Recreation Department prohibits the use of any device capable of recording, producing, duplicating, reproducing, storing, copying, transmitting or displaying any type of pictures from all Village of Lake Zurich Park and Recreation Department restrooms, locker rooms, or anywhere else where patrons expect privacy.
- Individuals observed using cellular phones in these areas would be asked to stop or leave the area. Failure to comply could result in the person(s) being banned from Park Department property.
- Those individuals using cellular phones and taking or transmitting pictures from these areas will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.



Photo and Video Release

Photos and videos are periodically taken of people participating in Village of Lake Zurich Park and Recreation Department programs and activities. All persons registering for Park Department programs/activities or using Park Department property thereby agree that any photograph or videotape taken by the Park Department may be used by the Park Department for promotional purposes including in its electronic media, videotapes, brochures, flyers and other publications without additional prior notice or permission and without compensation to the participant.

Pet Policy

Leashed dogs are now welcome to use park pathways, except as posted for special events or conditions. Please care for your pet: A **\$250 fine** will be assessed for individuals who do not clean up after their dog. A **\$500 fine** will be assessed for dogs that are off leash.

Americans with Disabilities Act

The Village of Lake Zurich is subject to the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. 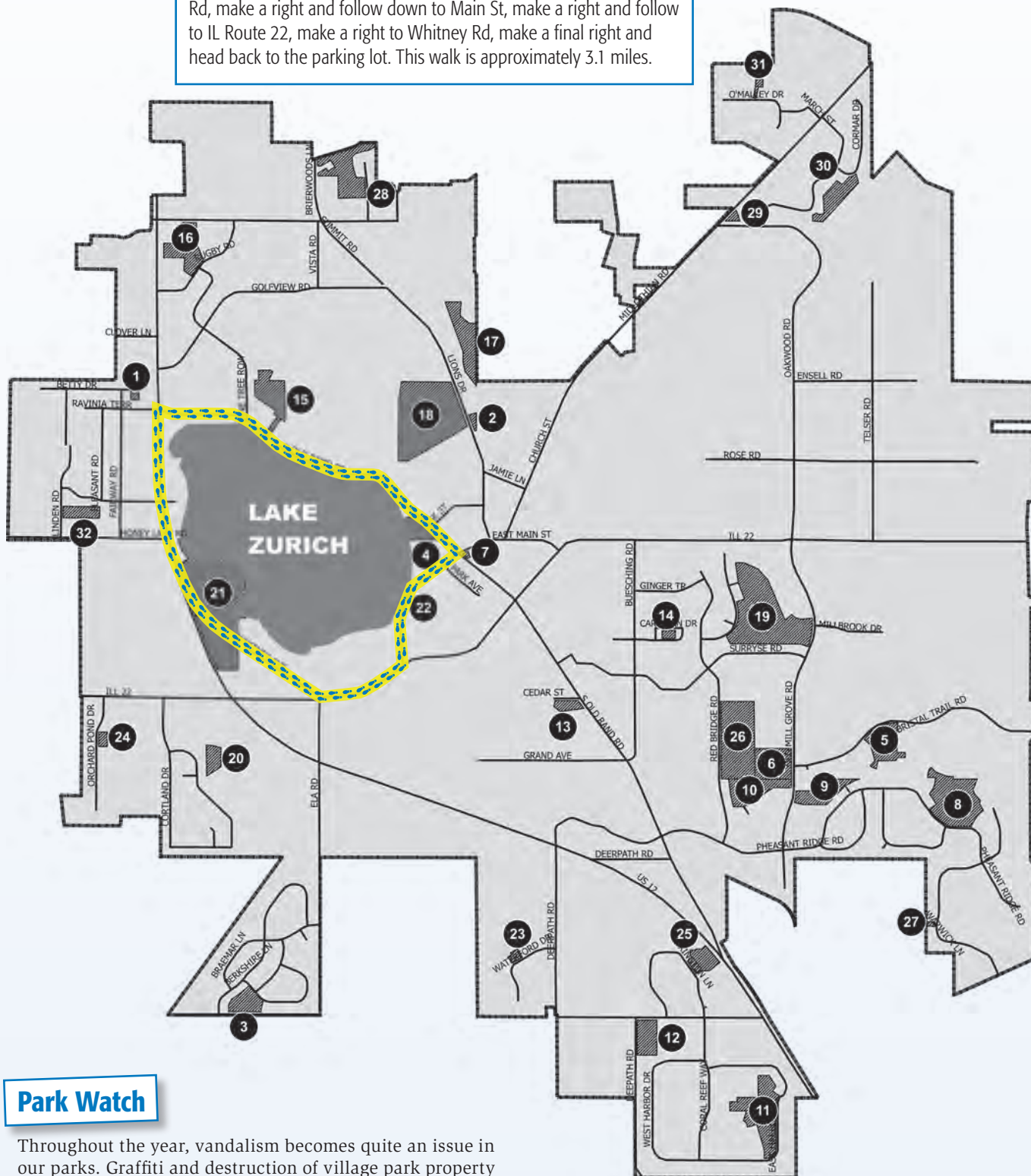
