LATERAL ENTRY POLICE OFFICER PACKET



The Lake Zurich Police Department, an accredited Lake County, Illinois agency, is seeking qualified, experienced police officers for immediate lateral entry. The Department offers competitive salary and benefits along with future growth and advancement opportunities.

All information contained in or connected with the application will be considered personal and confidential to the extent possible or permitted by law and used only in conjunction with possible employment by the Lake Zurich Police Department.

Please furnish complete information as outlined in the application. Read every question carefully and answer each question accurately. An applicant may be disqualified from further processing if he/she intentionally makes a false statement of a material fact, practices or attempts to practice any deception or fraud in his/her application, or examination of appointment. Any false statements on this application will be considered sufficient cause for dismissal. Any misrepresentation on this application whether actual or by omission may disqualify a candidate for consideration of employment by the Lake Zurich Police Department.

Minimum Requirements and Qualifications

Applicants for lateral appointment to the position of Lake Zurich police officer must be an Illinois Certified Police Officer and meet the following minimum qualifications and requirements at the time of application to be considered for the position:

- State of Illinois certification by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (*Part-time certification as a law enforcement officer does not meet this requirement.*)
- United States citizen or naturalized citizen
- Must be at least 21 years old
- Education: high school education or equivalent thereof
- Experience: At least two (2) years of experience as a full-time sworn, certified law enforcement officer with an Illinois law enforcement agency within the last two (2) years
- Valid driver's license
- Valid FOID card
- Police officers must live within 35 miles of the Lake Zurich Police station (200 Mohawk Trail, Lake Zurich, Illinois 60047) once released from probation.
- Must agree to comply with all requirements of the position and have the ability to pass all examination and training requirements and perform the essential job functions.
- Ability to furnish upon request, a copy of the following: professional licenses; training certificates; documents confirming work experience; employee evaluations; and any other employment related material as requested or required.

Salary and Benefits

- Starting lateral entry salary: up to \$115,131.20 (as of 1/1/25) depending on years of service/qualifications.
- Comprehensive benefit package including BlueCross BlueShield Illinois healthcare plans (no cost HMO available), dental, and life insurance. Flexible spending account, deferred compensation plans, and an employee assistance program are also available.
- 80 hours of vacation in first year, 120 hours in second year
- Comp time, sick time, and personal days
- All initial uniforms, equipment, and body armor provided
- \$1,000 annual clothing/equipment allowance after first year
- Sick Time Buy Back Program
- Participation in Illinois Article 3 police pension fund
- Free on-site 24-hour workout facility
- Work schedule is established by union contract. Patrol shifts are chosen annually by seniority. Schedule: 8 ¼ hours per shift, 5 days on, 2 days off, 5 days on, 3 days off in lieu of holidays.

Selection Process

Each phase of the process is pass / fail.

- Pre-screening of application documents
- Interview with police department staff
- Background investigation, ride along, and polygraph examination
- When positions become available, oral examinations will be conducted by the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners.
- Post-offer examinations include but are not limited to psychological assessment, medical examination, and drug screening.

Notice to Applicants

All candidates for the position of police officer must complete a polygraph examination prior to appointment. Truth detecting devices shall not be the single determinant of employment status. The polygraph examination contains questions about your background, including criminal activities such as theft and substance abuse, prior work experience, and falsification of information related to your application for employment as a Lake Zurich police officer.

Lateral Entry Eligibility List

Lateral hire applicants who have met all hiring prerequisites and successfully completed the required portions of the process will be placed upon the final eligibility register for lateral entry in order of their relative excellence, based upon their scores. Additions will be made to the list as new applications are received and candidates interviewed. New eligible candidates will be placed in rank order dependent on their score. An individual who has been on the final register of eligibles for lateral entry for more than two (2) years and has not been certified for hire shall be removed from the list.

Applicants submitting incorrect or insufficient proof or incomplete applications will be automatically disqualified from employment consideration. Applications will not be rejected because of minor omissions or deficiencies that can be corrected prior to the screening or interview process.
