WHEREAS, Deputy Chief Anderson has been recognized on numerous occasions for his work related to DUI and drug enforcement by the Alliance Against Intoxicated Motorists, traffic crash investigations, and aiding outside agencies for significant events; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Chief Anderson served all the residents of Lake County as a member of the Northern Illinois Police Alarm System (NIPAS) Mobile Field Force, and the Lake County Major Crash Assistance Team (MCAT); and

WHEREAS, Deputy Chief Anderson served as the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #190 President, and Lake Zurich Police Pension Board Secretary for numerous years; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Chief Anderson has received numerous commendations, awards, and recognition for outstanding police work including Lifesaving and P.R.I.D.E. Department awards; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Chief Anderson officially retired from the Lake Zurich Police Department on April 24, 2024.
