


# Q1 Should dogs be allowed in Lake Zurich parks?







### Q4 Are you a dog owner or guardian?



## Q5 How many dogs are you usually responsible for?



## Q6 Tell us about the size of your dogs.







This is true with broken or defaced park equipment as well as playgrounds that need more wood chips or nature paths needing tending to. Although I have NEVER complained, people have ALWAYS ignored the "no dogs allowed" rule in LZ parks and it's obviously never reinforced by anyone from the village. I always figured as long as they pick up after their dogs, I don't mind. However, over the years the parks have gotten worse with even less upkeep and there's been TONS of people leaving dog poop and doing other "stupid human things" that are ruining these natural areas. I have noticed more and more people walking their dogs and/or letting them run free without leashes in our parks. This has also been affecting the wildlife. The other day, I literally saw 2 beautiful sandhill cranes land in the park by our house to feed. Shortly after this, they were freaking out-making noises and flapping wings, and I realized it was because someone had a loose dog (as usual) running in the field. I have also seen multiple loose dogs fighting and the owners swearing at each other in front of my young child because they were angry about the situation...event though they were BOTH wrong for having dogs in the park! I get that dogs need exercise, and I actually love dogs. So, essentially I do think they should be allowed in parks. BUT-it should be a designated DOG PARK, so that people will actually be monitored and required to follow rules-like picking up after their dogs and not letting them off the leash if they shouldn't be. Allowing dogs in ALL of our parks will just support a growing problem the village has already. Thanks for proving this survey, and hopefully you will seriously consider the dog park idea.
